










# **Demographic Characteristics**




# **Annual Growth Rates**






# Historical Growth by Grade Group




# Kindergarten Enrollment vs. Live Births
















# **Annual Housing Starts**








# Projected Single-Family Occupancies



# Multi-Family Housing in AISD








# Projected Multi-Family Occupancies








# **Projected KN-5<sup>th</sup> Enrollment Compared to Capacity**






# Projected 6th-8th Enrollment Compared to Capacity
