





- Allows for a seamless transition between fully in-person and fully virtual; a springboard to better schooling over the long term

Hybrid Schedule-Technology

- Kindergarten will have 1:1 iPad (relocated from PreK, 1, and 2 classrooms)
- Grades 1-8 will have 1:1 Chromebooks
- Go Guardian expansion
- Continue use of Oncourse, Go Guardian, Dojo, Google Classroom
- Parents and students will sign technology agreement
- Offering a Technology Mentor Class in August for parents

Hybrid Schedule: Bus Transportation

- Face masks are to be worn by staff and students at all times
- Families will sit together
- Assign seats
- Students are to go directly to their seats and avoid touching seat top and rails, when possi<u>ble</u>
- Windows and roof hatches will be open if possible
- Busses will be disinfected daily with EPA approved products
- High touch areas (handrails, seatbelts, windowsills, seat tops and back between routes
- Student temperature checks will be completed upon arrival

Hybrid Schedule-Facilities

- during school day Added a staggered schedule of maintenance staff to disinfect building
- Deep cleaning days on Wednesdays
- Hand sanitizer stations in each classroom and entryways/hallways
- Water fountains will be shut down.
- Students will bring their own water bottle with water each day
- Adding 2 water bottle filling stations (one upstairs, one downstairs)

Hybrid Schedule-Emergency Drills

Hybrid Schedule-Uniform

Hybrid Schedule-Uniform

The following is the list of clothing items and or/adornments that are allowed to be worn by students while they are at school;
