WHEREAS, the District has reserved the right to amend the Plan at any time; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the District has determined that it would be in the best interests of the district to amend the Plan;

NOW THEREFORE, be it **RESOLVED,** that the Plan shall be amended to add Vanguard as an approved vendor effective as soon as administratively possible after the signature date. And be it further:

RESOLVED. That the officers of the District hereby are authorized to execute such documents and to take other additional actions as they shall deem necessary or appropriate to effect the foregoing resolutions.

g. Be it resolved that the Board, upon recommendation of the School Business Administrator approves the following resolution:

Whereas, NJAC 6A:23A-5.3 provides that a school district may request a waiver of compliance with respect to the district's participation in the Special Education Medicaid Initiative (SEMI) Program for the 2019-20 school year, and

Whereas, the Haworth Board of Education desires to apply for this waiver due to the fact that participation in SEMI would not provide a cost benefit to the district based on the projection of the district's available SEMI reimbursement for the 2019-20 budget year.

Now therefore, be it resolved, that the Haworth Board of Education hereby authorizes the Business Administrator to submit to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools in the County of Bergen an appropriate waiver of the requirements of NJAC 6A23A-5.3 for the 2019-20 school year.

- h. Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, the Haworth Board of Education approves the transfer of \$39,845.00 from Capital Reserve to Capital Projects. The purpose of this transfer is to cover costs associated with previously approved 2018-19 capital projects involving the replacement/upgrade of the building fire system and masonry and sidewalk repair of the facility. These costs include change orders #1 & #2 for the masonry project, change order #1 for the fire system project, and overages resulting from the public bid process.
- i. **WHEREAS**, a number of Boards of Education in Bergen County have joined together to form a Joint Insurance Group as permitted by N.J. Title 18A-.18B and;
 - **WHEREAS**, said Group was approved effective July 1, 1985 by the New Jersey Commissioner of Insurance and has been in operation since that date and;
 - **WHEREAS**, the Bylaws and regulations governing the creation and operation of this Insurance Group contain elaborate restrictions and safeguards concerning the safe and efficient administration of the public interest entrusted to such a Group, and;
 - WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Haworth has determined that membership in the Northeast Bergen County School Board Insurance Group is in the best interest of the District;
 - **NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved that the Board of Education of Haworth does hereby agree to renew membership in the Northeast Bergen County School Board Insurance Group and hereby accept the Bylaws as approved and adopted. The renewal term is from **July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2022.**
 - **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Business Administrator is authorized to execute the application for membership and the accompanying certification on behalf of the District and;
 - **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Business Administrator is authorized and directed to execute the Indemnity and Trust Agreement and such other documents signifying membership in the Group as are required by the Group's Bylaws and to deliver the same to the Executive Director.
- j. **BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Haworth Board of Education, hereby approves the Proposed Change Order #1 in the amount of \$ 10,070.00 for the following changes from the original contract as part of the Fire System Upgrade contract with Haig's Service Corporation:

- Installation 6 additional monitor modules
- 1 projected beam smoke detector
- 1 IPGSM-4G Fire Radio Communicator and Monitoring Service
- 6 protective covers for monitors in gym
- 12 height adjustments for existing pull stations (ADA)
- Labor to repair ground fault on old wiring

The new total contract value will therefore be \$240,070.00.
