#### VI. WORK SESSION TOPICS

## a. 2023-24 District Calendar review

Mr. Wolford reviewed the calendar draft and noted that it aligns as much as possible with Northern Valley Demarest High School, as well as the other Northern Valley districts. A meeting was had with all of the district Superintendent's where all of the calendar drafts were shared. All of the districts did the best they could to keep alignment with each other, although there will always be some small differences. The first day of school seems to vary per district. Haworth, Norwood & Harrington Park are proposing Wednesday, September 6<sup>th</sup>; Northern Valley High School, Demarest, Old Tappan and Northvale are proposing Tuesday, September

5<sup>th</sup>; and Closter is proposing Thursday, September 7<sup>th</sup>. These are different mainly due to teacher union contracts on when the first day for teachers to do their professional development can be. He also explained that the reason for not closing school for Juneteenth is because it would be the last day of school, although if snow days are not used then school could be out sooner than that. June 19th was made a half day in the event that it winds up being the last day of school.

- c. Daily COVID Protocols

Mr. Wolford explained that we are still following the advice of the Bergen County Department of Health regarding protocols in the building regarding COVID. We use these recommendations to try to curb the spread of COVID.

- d. Referendum Update
  - Mr. Wolford reviewed where the district is at in the Design-Build phase of the project. He explained that the request for quote will be going out by the end of this week. The district will select a bid by the April BOE meeting.
- e. Review of February 15, 2023 BOE Meeting Agenda Draft
- f. WHEREAS, the Haworth Board of Education has committed to a major multi-phase additions and alterations project that includes the construction of a new one-story classroom addition for four additional classrooms to be connected to the northeast wing of the existing facility; a new one-story addition to be connected to the north entrance of the building which will contain administrative offices, a maker space, media center and new building entry; renovations and expansion of the existing gymnasium; renovations to the existing Library/Media Center; renovations to existing classrooms, offices and restrooms; and upgrades to existing building services and systems; and

WHEREAS, the Architect of Record estimates that the project has a cost equal to or exceed \$5,000,000, but less than \$12,500,000; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey law allows for public entities to use a "Design-Build" bid solicitation process in lieu of a traditional "Design-Bid-Build" model; and

WHEREAS, based upon conversations with and documents furnished by the Architect of Record, the Board believes that when compared to the "Design-Build" process, the "Design-Build" project delivery will facilitate a shorter overall design and construction process including, but not limited to, reducing the likelihood of work stoppages and change orders that would increase project costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby authorizes the Superintendent/Business Administrator and the Architect of Record to issue a Request for Qualifications within the meaning of N.J.A.C. 5:34-10.2 for the above-referenced project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby requires the Superintendent/Business Administrator and the Architect of Record to ensure that the procedures for the solicitation and award of the Design-Build Contract are consistent with the requirements set forth in N.J.A.C. 5:34-10.3, including, but not limited to, the establishment of a Technical Review Committee for the review and evaluation of responses furnished by bidders in response to the RFQ; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby determines that following the receipt of a Statement of Qualifications from prospective bidders, the Technical Review Committee shall select a maximum of four bidders to submit proposals in the second phase of the solicitation process; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby authorizes the Superintendent/Business Administrator to take such action as is necessary to effectuate the purposes of this resolution.
