Dear Parent or Guardian:

We are pleased to inform you that at the May 21, 2024 board meeting the Southmoreland School District Board of Directors unanimously voted to expand the **Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)** through the entire district. For the upcoming 2024-2025 school year, all schools participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) will now be serving meals under the CEP sub-program.

What does this mean for you and your children attending the schools identified for CEP?

Great news! All enrolled students of the Southmoreland School District grades K-12 are eligible to receive both one (1) breakfast and one (1) lunch daily at school at **no cost** to your household for the whole school year. Your children will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay any fees or submit any meal applications. We encourage all households to have their student(s) participate as much as possible in the programs offered at breakfast and lunch due to this amazing opportunity.
