








# What is the Basic Allotment?

### **Basic Allotment**

The Basic Allotment (BA) is the legislatively mandated apportionment of funds from the general revenue funds that goes to each school district to provide a basic level of education for the district's residents.

The BA has **not changed since 2019** despite unprecedented rising costs due to inflation.




# State Funding: Enrollment vs. Attendance

### **State Funding**

Enrollment vs. Average Daily Attendance

Average Daily Attendance (ADA) is calculated by adding attendance counts throughout the year and then dividing them by the number of instructional days. This means if a student misses school, they are not counted for funding purposes that day.

Texas is one of only six states that uses attendance-based funding.

### Interest & Sinking


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### **Debt Service Expenses**

Annual Principal & Interest Payments on Bonds and Approved by District Voters


Voter approved bond funds may not be used to pay for M&O expenses, such as hiring additional teachers. Bond funds from a successful bond election may only be used for the construction/renovation of facilities, the acquisition of land, and the purchase of capital items such as equipment, technology, and buses.




