- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subsection (e), Section 74.151, Civil Practice
- 8 and Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 (e) Except as provided by this subsection, this [This]
- 10 section does not apply to a person whose negligent act or omission
- 11 was a producing cause of the emergency for which care is being
- 12 administered. This subsection does not apply to liability of a
- 13 <u>school district or district school officer or employee arising from</u>
- 14 <u>an act or omission under a program or policy or procedure adopted</u>
- 15 under Subchapter O-1, Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, other
- 16 than liability arising from wilful or intentional misconduct.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 21.044, Education Code, is amended by
- 18 adding Subsections (c-1) and (c-2) to read as follows:
- 19 <u>(c-1)</u> Any minimum academic qualifications for a certificate
- 20 specified under Subsection (a) that require a person to possess a
- 21 bachelor's degree must also require that the person receive, as
- 22 part of the training required to obtain that certificate,
- 23 instruction in detection of students with mental or emotional
- 24 disorders.

(c-2) The instruction under Subsection (c-1) must: 1 2 (1) be developed by a panel of experts in the diagnosis and treatment of mental or emotional disorders who are appointed by 3 4 the board; and 5 (2) include information on: (A) characteristics of the most prevalent mental 6 7 or emotional disorders among children; (B) identification of mental or 8 9 disorders; (C) effective strategies for teaching and 10 intervening with students with mental or emotional disorders, 11 including de-escalation techniques and positive behavioral 12 interventions and supports; and 13 (D) providing, in compliance with Section 14 38.010, notice and referral to a parent or guardian of a student 15 with a mental or emotional disorder so that the parent or guardian 16 may take appropriate action such as seeking mental health services. 17 SECTION 3. Subsection (c), Section 28.004, Education Code, 18 is amended to read as follows: 19 20 (c) The local school health advisory council's duties include recommending: 21 22 the number of hours of instruction to be provided in health education; 23

23	set forth under Subsection (b) for teachers, counselors,
24	principals, and all other appropriate personnel. A school district
25	is required to provide the training at an elementary school campus
26	only to the extent that sufficient funding and programs are
27	available. A school district may implement a program on the list to

- 1 satisfy the requirements of this subsection.
- 2 (c-2) If a school district provides the training under
- 3 Subsection (c-1):
- 4 (1) a school district employee described under that
- 5 subsection must participate in the training at least one time; and
- 6 (2) the school district shall maintain records that
- 7 include the name of each district employee who participated in the
- 8 training.
- 9 SECTION 5. Subchapter O-1, Chapter 161, Health and Safety
- 10 Code, is amended by adding Section 161.326 to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 161.326. IMMUNITY. This subchapter does not:
- 12 <u>(1)</u> waive any immunity from liability of a school
- 13 district or of district school officers or employees;
- 14 (2) create any liability for a cause of action against
- 15 a school district or against district school officers or employees;
- 16 <u>or</u>
- 17 (3) waive any immunity from liability under Section
- 18 74.151, Civil Practice and Remedies Code.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
