Online check-in is open from July 10th through August 7th

Online check-in is the districtwide check-in process for families with returning students to any district school, elementary, K-8, middle or high school. This summer, online check-in is open from July 10 through August 7.

***If you are the parent or guardian of a student new to the district, visit www.adams12.org/enroll to enroll your child in a Five Star District school. ***

The district's online check-in process is necessary each summer for all enrolled families to verify or update primary household information, confirm their child(ren) will return to a district school this fall and sign important districtwide documents from the comfort of their home.

How to start/complete online check-in

To begin online check-in, log in to your [Infinite Campus \(IC\) parent portal account](#). **Keep in mind, only parents in the primary household can complete the process.

An IC parent portal account is necessary to complete online check-in. If you don't have an account, create one [here](#) or contact the District Service Desk at (720) 972-4120 for assistance.

*If you forgot your login information, you can [reset your username and/or password](#).

What is needed to check-in online:

- Current valid email address
- An Infinite Campus (IC) parent portal account. *Don't have an account? [Create one](#). Have an account but forgot login information? [Reset your username and/or password](#).
- Only parent/guardian of the primary household can complete the process
- Contact information for all parent(s)/guardian(s) and emergency contact(s)
- If you have moved, you will need to provide an approved proof of residence document. Examples: Current utility bill, mortgage statements, lease, declaration of residence.

Apply Now for Free and Reduced Benefits



Free and reduced benefits help families and your school.

Families are encouraged to apply for free and reduced benefits for the upcoming school year. By applying for free and reduced benefits families receive assistance and they help your child's school too.

Here's how. By applying:

- Your child's school can receive additional funding to enhance the educational experience for all students.
- School fees can be waived or reduced. These include athletic fees, course fees and activity and field trip fees tied to curriculum.
- Students in grades 9-12 can receive assistance with post-graduation planning, scholarships, state and national testing (including SAT, ACT, Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate), and post-secondary enrollment.
- Families can qualify for additional resources, such as medical, food and cash assistance.
- Families can receive support with community services, such as internet, gym memberships, passes to museums and cultural events.

APPLY NOW

Families must reapply for free and reduced benefits each new school year. You will receive your eligibility letter in the mail or by email. United States citizenship or immigration status is not a condition of eligibility for free and reduced benefits. Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope this letter finds you well. As we continue our journey towards fostering a positive and productive learning environment, I am writing to inform you about our updated cell phone policy aimed at promoting responsible digital citizenship among our students. We believe that understanding and adhering to our school's expectations regarding the use of personal electronic devices (PEDs) is crucial for the success and well-being of our students.

Our new cell phone policy is designed to create a balanced environment where students can benefit from technology while minimizing distractions during school hours. Here are the key expectations we have set for our students:

1. **Authority to Collect Devices:** All teachers and staff have the authority to collect electronic devices from any student immediately upon request. This measure ensures that our school environment remains focused on learning.
2. **Restricted Usage Times:** Students are permitted to use their electronic devices during morning entry before storing the device in their locker and while exiting the building after the last period. To maintain an atmosphere conducive to social interaction and relaxation, no cell phones are allowed during lunch.
3. **Health and Safety Communications:** Students who do not feel well should report to the nurse's office, where they can call parents if needed. Calls to parents should not be made from personal electronic devices to ensure proper care and attention.
4. **Parent-Student Communication:** If you need to communicate with your child during the school day, please contact the main office. This helps us manage the flow of information and ensures that students remain focused on their educational activities.
5. **Headphone Use:** Students are only allowed to use wired headphones with their Chromebooks. These can be purchased in the main office for \$1 if needed. This policy helps us maintain a consistent and safe environment for all students.
6. **Special Provisions:** Students with a 504 plan or health care plan that includes the use of a cell phone will have access to their device in accordance with their plan. This ensures that all students receive the support they need.

We appreciate your support in helping us implement these guidelines. Our goal is to work together to teach our students how to use technology responsibly and to create a school environment where everyone can thrive. If you have any questions or concerns about this new policy, please do not hesitate to reach out to me or the main office.

Queridos padres y guardianes,

Espero que esta carta te encuentre bien. A medida que continuamos nuestro viaje hacia el fomento de un ambiente de aprendizaje positivo y productivo, les escribo para informarles sobre nuestra política actualizada sobre teléfonos celulares destinada a promover la ciudadanía digital responsable entre nuestros estudiantes. Creemos que comprender y cumplir las expectativas de nuestra escuela con respecto al uso de dispositivos electrónicos personales (PED) es crucial para el éxito y el bienestar de nuestros estudiantes.

Nuestra nueva política de telefonía celular está diseñada para crear un ambiente equilibrado donde los estudiantes puedan beneficiarse de la tecnología mientras minimizan las distracciones durante el horario escolar. Estas son las expectativas clave que hemos establecido para nuestros estudiantes:

1. **Autoridad para recolectar dispositivos:** todos los maestros y el personal tienen la autoridad para recolectar dispositivos electrónicos de cualquier estudiante inmediatamente cuando lo solicite. Esta medida garantiza que nuestro entorno escolar siga centrado en el aprendizaje.
2. **Horarios de uso restringido:** A los estudiantes se les permite usar sus dispositivos electrónicos durante la entrada de la mañana antes de guardar el dispositivo en su casillero y al salir del edificio después del último período. Para mantener una atmósfera propicia para la interacción social y la relajación, no se permiten teléfonos celulares durante el almuerzo.
3. **Comunicaciones de salud y seguridad:** los estudiantes que no se sientan bien deben presentarse en la oficina de la enfermera, donde pueden llamar a los padres si es necesario. Las llamadas a los padres no deben realizarse desde dispositivos electrónicos personales para garantizar el cuidado y la atención adecuados.
4. **Comunicación entre padres y estudiantes:** si necesita comunicarse con su hijo durante el día escolar, comuníquese con la oficina principal. Esto nos ayuda a gestionar el flujo de información y garantiza que los estudiantes permanezcan concentrados en sus actividades educativas.
5. **Uso de auriculares:** los estudiantes solo pueden usar auriculares con cable con sus Chromebooks. Estos se pueden comprar en la oficina principal por \$1 si es necesario. Esta política nos ayuda a mantener un ambiente consistente y seguro para todos los estudiantes.
6. **Disposiciones especiales:** Los estudiantes con un plan 504 o un plan de atención médica que incluya el uso de un teléfono celular tendrán acceso a su dispositivo de acuerdo con su plan. Esto garantiza que todos los estudiantes reciban el apoyo que necesitan.

Agradecemos su apoyo para ayudarnos a implementar estas pautas. Nuestro objetivo es trabajar juntos para enseñar a nuestros estudiantes cómo usar la tecnología de manera responsable y crear un ambiente escolar donde todos puedan prosperar. 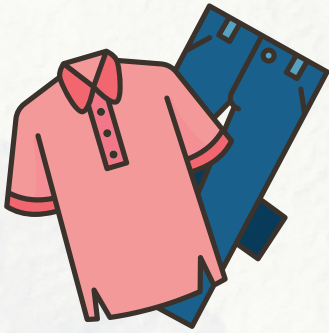

Title I - Parents Right to Know

As a parent of a student at Thornton Middle School, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teacher who instructs your child. This is a requirement for all districts that receive Title I funds. Federal law allows you to request certain information about your student's classroom teacher. The law also requires the district to give you this information in a timely manner upon request. Listed below is the information in which you have the right to ask for information regarding each of your student's classroom teachers.

- Whether the Colorado Department of Education has licensed or endorsed your student's teacher for the grades and subjects taught.
- Whether CDE has decided that your student's teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.
- The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees, and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
 - Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraeducators provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

Como padre de un estudiante en Thornton Middle School, usted tiene el derecho a saber las calificaciones profesionales del maestro que enseña a su hijo. Este es un requisito para todos los distritos que reciben fondos de Título I. La ley federal permite que usted pida algún tipo de información sobre el maestro de su hijo. La ley también requiere que el distrito le proporcione esta información de manera oportuna si usted la solicita.

A continuación verá la información sobre sus derechos para indagar sobre cada uno de los maestros de su hijo.

- Preguntar si el Departamento de Educación de Colorado ha otorgado una licencia o endorso al maestro de su hijo para los grados y asignaturas enseñadas.
- Preguntar si CDE (siglas en inglés para Departamento de Educación de Colorado) ha decidido que el maestro de su hijo puede enseñar sin tener licencia o calificación bajo las regulaciones del estado debido a circunstancias especiales.
- Preguntar cuál es la licenciatura/estudios universitarios del maestro; si el maestro tiene estudios avanzados y, si es así, el tipo de licenciatura.
- Preguntar si asistentes de maestros o paraeducadores similares proveen servicios para su hijo y, si es así, cuáles son sus calificaciones.

Testing Information



MAP testing is a computer adaptive test ALL TMS students will take 3 times this year (fall, winter, and spring). This is a district required interim test that students in grades 1 - 9 complete to track growth on reading and mathematics skills.

CMAS testing is a state required test that is administered in the spring testing students' grade level knowledge on the standards. ALL students take the English Language Arts and Mathematics. 8th grade students also take the Science test.

ACCESS testing is a series of English language proficiency assessments that is administered annually to monitor progress in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Only students who are monitored for ELD services are tested for ACCESS.

Testing Information For Parents/Students

Day of testing:

Encourage your student to have a goodnight sleep the night before.

Encourage your student to have breakfast on the days of testing, whether it is at home, or getting free breakfast in the TMS cafeteria!

Remind students to bring their charged chromebook AND charger the days of testing.

Encourage your student to do the best they can that day and to be mindful of the other students taking the test so that they can also do the best they can. TRY on every question. We want to know what you know of the standards. It's okay if you are unsure, the best thing you can do in any situation is try.

Why do these scores matter?

CMAS and MAP scores are used as a data point for placement into high school programs such as advanced classes, remedial courses, as well entry into tech programs (Future Forward and Bollman)

The state uses CMAS scores to rate schools and for funding purposes.

MAP scores are used for teacher evaluations.

ACCESS scores can help students test out of ELD courses.

What supports are in place at TMS to support students with CMAS?

Teachers are teaching and assessing the standards set out by the state of Colorado in classes daily. These are the standards that are assessed on CMAS.

Students take fall, winter, and spring MAP in reading and Math. These tests support students in experiencing a testing environment. This also provides standardized data to teachers to help support student learning.

How can families support their student(s) in CMAS and MAP scores and their education in general?

Encourage students to complete all assignments and learning activities in all their classes, especially making sure that students make up all assessment opportunities.

Be involved in the student's academics. Ask questions about what students are learning and ask to see work sent home. Log into Infinite Campus and ask about scores.

Remind students of your expectations for their learning and to follow school expectations so that all students are able to learn and grow.

Reach out to teachers and the school with any questions around your student's education. We are all here to partner to support students in learning and growing.

Remind students to bring a charged chromebook to school EVERY DAY.

Reading at home makes a BIG difference in students' learning!
