- Connect the family to community programs that address treatment options.
- Remain in contact with the family for a minimum of three (3) months to ensure success.
- Assist the school in supporting the student or family.
- Encourage good attendance, participation in school and community activities.

## Student Engagement Office Drug Intervention Services

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*The Student Engagement Office supports students from all backgrounds to ensure they leave Jeffco prepared for a successful future. The Student Engagement Office provides direct support to schools in the areas of Student Engagement, Dropout Prevention and Re-engagement Strategies, Diversity and Inclusion, and Indian Education.*



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## Program Description

Drug Intervention Services provides direct case management services to any Jeffco student who has been suspended for substance use or who is suspected of substance use and referred by their self, an employee or parent.

Our office will provide screening and guidance for the family to navigate the options available to them. Case managers will act as a liaison between the district and the family to help the student be successful.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### What services are available\*?

Direct case management support to assist the student and family to access a drug/alcohol screen and determine an appropriate level of education or treatment.

Navigating funding for initial screening and education classes, as well as for higher levels of treatment for eligible students.

*\*Other services may be offered throughout the school year if they become available.*

### What students are eligible for these services?

Students who have committed a violation of the drug and alcohol policy in the school conduct code.

Students who have indicated that they are using drugs or alcohol and would like support.

Students who have been referred to the program by a parent or school staff.

## FAQ continued...

### How are these services funded?

Funding for case management and some services are provided through the Colorado Department of Education Expelled and At-Risk Student Services Grant.

Students accessing marijuana related services and treatment may be funded through Senate Bill 215 Programming.

Insurance funding may be accessed for eligible students. Each case varies.
