Mt. Zion Community School District #3 Asthma Emergency Response Protocol

Purpose:

The purpose of this document is to provide a quick reference guide to assist a student experiencing an Asthma episode.

Equipment and Supplies:

- 1. Student's prescribed quick relief medication a.k.a. **Inhaler.** If student does not have their inhaler on them, summon school staff members who have access to the medication.
- 2. Student's Asthma Action Plan (if available)

Procedure:

Asthma episode:

Excessive coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath, chest tightness or difficulty breathing.

- 1. Allow student to use Inhaler if student is carrying inhaler, assist with giving medication if needed.
- 2. Summon or notify school nurse of symptoms student is exhibiting
- 3. Reassure student and assist to an upright sitting position, do not allow student to lie down or sleep
- 4. Encourage slow deep breaths
- 5. Move student indoors

Severe Asthma Episode:

If student has any one or more of the following severe Asthma Symptoms:

- Very fast or hard breathing
- Nasal flaring (open wide)
- Inhaler has been used and is not helping
- Can't talk or walk well
- Lips or fingernail beds are bluish
- Struggling to breathe
- Unconscious

Do this in the following order:

- 1. Call 911 Immediately
- 2. Call School Nurse if not already present
- 3. Call Parent /Guardian
- 4. Stay with the student until improves or emergency personnel arrive
