

2023-24 Mentor Agreement

Mentors earn \$2000 annual stipends, paid in \$1000 increments, at the end of each semester, and upon candidate work completion, by meeting with, and engaging in the reflective work with their assigned candidate(s) as well as attending all required professional development. Mentors must agree to work extra hours outside of the school day, in accordance with the agreement, and may not submit extra hours in addition to the allotted stipend.

To earn a full stipend, the mentor must complete all the following program requirements. Professionally coach the candidate to make progress towards mastery of the California Standards for the Teaching Profession (CSTP) as evidenced by the Individual Learning Plan and Reflections. ☐ Meet weekly with the candidate, beyond traditional school hours, for a minimum of one hour/week, or not less than 4 hours/month to: plan and observe lessons, provide constructive, non-evaluative formative feedback; share instructional practices, analyze student learning, and assess and monitor progress on goals included in the Individual Learning Plan. (Meetings may be done via video conferencing **NEW**: or before or after attendance at ½ day mentor trainings.) ☐ Meet with candidate, and their evaluator in a "TRIAD" three times a year to assist with annual goal setting, development and tracking of the Individual Learning Plan. Observe the candidate a minimum of 2 times a semester. ☐ Practice reflective listening and facilitation skills and maintain confidential conversations and professional ethics to encourage continuous, professional self-reflection. Complete, type and upload all required tools (in addition to Interaction Logs) to Kiano, the New Teacher Center's online platform. New mentors must attend all required professional development for mentors. Mentors with more than 3 years of experience may choose sessions based on their needs. Mentors will arrange their own subs. ☐ Formatively assess your own mentoring during the school year, through the lens of the New Teacher Center with a Mentor Individual Learning Plan and participation in "in-field coaching." ■ Model and co-teach lessons when appropriate. ☐ Communicate with the Program Leader regularly and complete the program assessments and evaluations, as requested.
