Celebrate Early Childhood in the Northland

Early childhood is an exciting time for parents and children. This wonderful beginning lays the foundation for the rest of a child's life. If you are wondering what there is for parents and children in our community, read on. The Northland Early Childhood Collaborative has much to offer children and their parents.

Early Childhood Family Education: This is for families with children from birth through age four. A great time for families and children to explore early childhood and parenting.

Family Center Home Visiting: A program that partners with parents as they explore and learn about their child from prenatal through age three.

ParentChild+ (PC+) Home visiting program for parents and children that are 2 and 3 years old that encourages healthy development through facilitated play, reading and enriched conversation using carefully chosen books and toys that are PC+'s gifts to the family.

Preschool: for children ages three and up. During the school year. These classes run Mon-Thursday, all day.

Early Childhood Screenings: For children ages three to five. See how your child is learning and developing. The screenings are offered twice a year. Please contact the school at [218-566-2351](tel:218-566-2351) ex. 32036 to set up an appointment.

Swimming Lessons

10:00 - 10:30 - Level 1 - Preschool - Recommended Ages 3-5 - \$60: This class will work to familiarize children to the aquatic environment and help them acquire primary aquatic skills while also helping participants begin to develop positive attitudes and safe practices in and around water. On the final day, we will practice life jacket safety so life jackets will be needed on the final day of class.

10:30 - 11:10 - Level 2 - Beginners - Recommended Ages 5-7 - \$70: The ages are a recommendation but this class is appropriate for a student who is beginning to feel comfortable in water. They can stand unassisted in the shallow end. They are ready to start swimming across the width of the pool. All skills in this class can be performed with instructor assistance. This class will build on the basic aquatic skills, water safety skills, and concepts. On the final day, we will practice life jacket safety so life jackets will be needed on the final day of class.

11:10 - 11:50 - Level 3 - Intermediates - Recommended Ages 7-9 - \$70: The ages are a recommendation but this class is appropriate for the student who is already at a comfortable swim level across the width and is ready to begin swimming the length of the pool and strengthen their strokes. This class will continue to build on previous learned strokes to improve strength, consistency, and technique
