From the Dean

Thank you, Deer Creek families, for your support throughout the year. Helping kids learn to make positive decisions and choices as well as learning from mistakes is something we do together. Outdoor Lab Fees Update

End of Year Medication Pick-Up



Please pick up ALL medications by the last day of school which is May 24, 2024.

All medications left in the school health room on May 28th will be disposed of according to Jeffco policy. If you have any questions feel free to call your school Health Aide at the following number (303-982-3820) Thank you and have a good summer!

If your student has medication in the health room, the Jeffco District Board Policy JLCD, states:

Unused medication: It is the responsibility of the parent to obtain all unused medication from the school when the medication is expired, discontinued, the school year ends, or the family transfers to another district. All medication left in the school under these circumstances will be disposed of using district guidelines and monitoring by the district RN.

This includes all prescription and over-the counter medications including but not limited to: cough drops, cough syrup, Tylenol, EpiPen, inhaler, insulin, and any other injectable medications.

If you, as the parent, are not able to pick-up the medication in person, please call your district RN to discuss alternative arrangements. (Lisa Schalla 720-315-3855)

If your child will be in summer school (JReads or ESY) this summer, please pick up the medication as noted above; the current medication agreement form will be copied and put in a Ziploc along with the medication. You will need to bring this Ziploc bag to your child's first day of summer school at the site he/she is attending and check it in with the health aide.

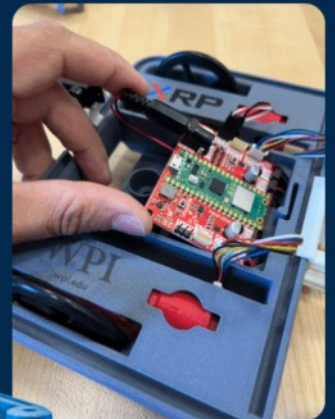

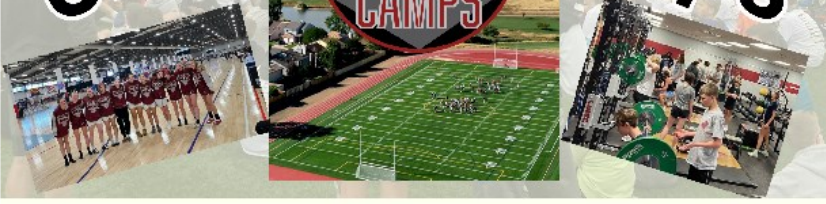
