

HOW TO CREATE AN ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY



What is an annotated bibliography? It is your alphabetized list of source citations for books, reference materials, periodical articles, websites, databases, images and more for your paper, research project, or assignment. If you use NoodleTools, you will enter the basic information about your source in the bibliography section of your project and then complete an annotated bibliography in the text box at the bottom of the page.

What should you include in your annotation? Your annotation should be written *after* you have read and used your source for your project. Your annotation is a brief descriptive and evaluative paragraph. Its purpose is to comment on the five items below.

- **contents of source:** what is the subject matter and time period covered?
- **intended audience:** is this source written for a specific age group, audience with specific education or qualifications, etc.?
- **author qualifications:** what is the author's education, experience, or background?
- **relevance of source:** was this source useful and relevant to your research question or topic?
- **comparative merit:** how did this source compare or contrast with other sources in your bibliography?
