#### **Nurse's Notes**

There have been many stories about RSV in the news lately. As you can imagine, it can be stressful for parents with young children or those with respiratory conditions. Older kids *tend* to do better, but can still end up with significant or prolonged cold-like symptoms. RSV can spread through droplets when someone coughs or sneezes. People (adults and children) can get it if they touch something that's contaminated (like desks, doorknobs, hands and clothing) RSV can also live on surfaces for a few days. This is why it is important to go back to the old mindset of washing your hands and not touching your face. Many pediatrician's offices and urgent care facilities can test for Flu/RSV/Covid. Per the CDC, people who are infected with RSV are **usually contagious for 3 to 8 days and may become contagious a day or two before they start showing signs of illness**. Masking is still encouraged along with frequent hand washing if your child is experiencing active cold symptoms.

Some of you may already be aware, but the stomach bug is going around as well. If your child is experiencing vomiting/diarrhea at home or is sent home from school, they must be out **24 hrs from the last episode**. There have been a few instances where a child has come back before they are ready and end up getting sick again at school. If your child is out with a fever (100.0 or greater), they will need to be out until they are **24 hours fever-free without any fever-reducing agent**. Thank you for understanding!
