## **INJURED AT WORK?**

## Read carefully the steps below:

- Report incident/accident to your supervisor immediately.
- Fill out a First Report of Injury (FROI) form as soon as possible with your safety coordinator.
- Fax or email the completed and signed FROI to Mary Daniels as soon as possible (within 24 hours). Fax number is 936-856-1338. Email: mdaniels@willisisd.org
- When you go to a network doctor for a work related injury you do not pay for it, therefore do not give them your insurance card.
- If you are given a prescription, take it to the pharmacy with the First Fill Card paperwork.
- If you go to the doctor, you must get a release from the doctor stating you are able to return to work. You will need to take this release note to your supervisor and Jennifer Walker in the Business Office.
- If the doctor states you are unable to return to work or if you have any restrictions from your work related injury, you must get a note from the doctor and submit to your supervisor and Jennifer Walker. You will not be able to return to work until the treating doctor has provided you with a release allowing you to return to work. Your supervisor and Jennifer Walker will need a copy of the release before you can return to work.

## What happens when you cannot work due to a work related injury?

- For workers' comp coverage, the alliance network doctor must be the one to determine if you can or cannot work.
- The network doctor must give you a written restriction from work. You must give a copy to your safety coordinator, your supervisor, and Mary Daniels (<a href="mailto:mdaniels@willisisd.org">mdaniels@willisisd.org</a>).
- You may not return to work without a written release from the network treating doctor. You must give a copy to your safety coordinator, your supervisor, and Mary Daniels.
- You will not receive Temporary Income Benefits (TIBS) from our Workers' Comp Insurance, TASB until starting the 8<sup>th</sup> day being off work from injury. After the first 8 days, you will receive approximately 70% of your take home pay from TASB. You may elect to use your vacation or personal leave to cover the first 8 days off or to be docked. Workers' Compensation is not a paid leave.
- During your recovery at home you should keep your supervisor and Mary Daniels (936-890-3187) informed of every development. As well as any paperwork from follow up appointments from the doctor.
