- Design a fun family literacy night and share classroom strategies with families on how to help students connect personal experiences to classroom content.
- Provide an open line of communication with parents.
- Provide remediation opportunities in all subject areas in which students have performed at the unsatisfactory levels.

To ensure student needs are being addressed, I will complete the following:

Follow an instructional calendar that will provide rigorous activities aligned to the LSSS and grade expectations, which will be provided in an encouraging and supportive manner; teach through a variety of learning styles; provide learning plans for individual students; provide one-on-one tutoring of specific skills; and provide a well-disciplined, organized, and managed classroom so all students have an opportunity to learn.

At Home...

Franklin Junior High School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in ELA and Math. Some of our key at-home activities include:

- Make sure my child is on time and attends school on a regular basis.
- Attend school-sponsored events
- Frequently check the school's website for updated information.
- Supervise homework and study time to ensure the completion of all assigned homework while providing a quiet place for my child to work and study.
- Throughout the school year, provide necessary materials my child needs for his/her success.
- Keep open lines of communication with my child's teachers including parent/teacher conferences, written communication, etc.
- Support the school by actively participating and assisting all teachers in maintaining a disciplined environment.
- Attend the family fun literacy night to practice new ways to support my child as a reader.
- Encourage my child to do his/her best.
