At RHS he played football where he earned all league, all area, and all county accolades.

LARRY WEATHERS—CLASS OF 1976

This honoree played football, wrestling and track at Reuther. He was part of the basketball championship team at Reuther. At RHS he played football, wrestling, and track where he earned all conference accolades in football. After graduation he would play football at Central Michigan University and come back to coach at Reuther for a number of years in wrestling and track.

TERRY WEATHERS—CLASS OF 1976

This honoree played football, basketball, track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. He was part of the basketball championship team at Reuther. At RHS he played football, basketball, and track where he earned all league, all area, all county and all state accolades in football and all league honors in basketball. After graduation he would play football at Central Michigan University and come back to coach at Reuther for a number of years in track.

JOHN FISHER—CLASS OF 1976

This honoree was one of the greatest wrestlers at Reuther wrestled and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. During his time at Reuther and at RHS he wrestled in the AAU program earning many championships at the regional level. While at RHS he earned all league, all area, all region and all state honors twice. This hall of famer never lost a dual match for the Falcons. He capped off his career with a runner up finish in his weight class his senior year.

CLASS OF 1978

ERIKA BAUER—CLASS OF 1978

This honoree played basketball, volleyball and track at Reuther. She was the winner of the Bob Peck Memorial Award for Reuther's outstanding athlete. At RHS she starred in basketball, volleyball, and track earning all league and all area multiple times in 3 sports. Our hall of famer was also all county in 3 different sports as well. After graduation she went to Oakland University on a volleyball scholarship where she

earned all league honors twice. She came back to coach at Reuther and RHS. She is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

CLASS OF 1979

DAN LOWE JR.--CLASS OF 1979

This honoree played football, basketball, wrestling and track at Reuther. He was on the championship track team that earned county runner up in 1979. Our hall of famer is best known for his record in the 70 meter dash; a record he held from 1978 until it was broken in 2017. He would play football, wrestle and run track at Bishop Foley High School where he graduated in 1982. He excelled in wrestling where he was a 4-time Catholic League Champion, a 3-time District and Regional Champion, and a 2-time All State selection finishing in 4th place in 1980 and 3rd place in 1982. He ended his career with a 151-16 record which is best all-time in Class B. He is in the Hall of Fame at Bishop Foley High School. Our hall of famer would continue his passion for wrestling by mentoring and coaching the Michigan Collegiate Cougars. He was a special athlete who left us far too soon.

LIZ HOHF--CLASS OF 1979

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. At the league meet she was the champion in the 200 meter hurdles and third in the shot put. She earned an individual city championship in the 200 hurdles. At Rochester High School she starred in basketball, volleyball and track earning all league and all area honors multiple times. She would later return to coach at Reuther and Rochester High School for a number of years.

CLASS OF 1980

JUDY JANUSZ--CLASS OF 1980

This honoree played basketball, cheerleading, volleyball and track at Reuther. She was on the championship track team at Reuther. At Rochester High School she starred in basketball, volleyball and track. Our hall of fame inductee earned all league and all area honors twice in basketball and volleyball and once in track. She also was all area, all county and all state in basketball her senior year. In track she earned league

championships in 3 different events. She came back to coach at Reuther and Rochester High School for a number of years. She is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

GLORIA SULLIVAN–CLASS OF 1980

This honoree played volleyball, cheerleading and track at Reuther. She was a member of the championship track team at Reuther. At Rochester High School she was part of the cross country and track teams. She starred in track in the 100 meter and 300 meter hurdles races and is considered one of the greatest hurdlers in the history of the school. She would go on to earn all league honors in these events. This hall of famer capped off her career by setting the record in the 300 meter low hurdles with a time of 46.0 seconds. This record has been on the board since 1983; an amazing 41 years! The record would be duplicated in 1987 with a time of 46.0 by her sister Margaret Sullivan!

KRISTY THOMAS–CLASS OF 1980

This honoree played basketball and volleyball at Reuther. At Rochester High School she would star in basketball, volleyball, and softball. She earned all league accolades in basketball (once), volleyball (twice) and softball (twice) along with all area honors in softball.

CLASS OF 1981

STEVEN ADKINS–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played football, wrestling, and track. He was on the championship teams for wrestling and track where the team earned county runner up. Our hall of famer earned city champion honors in the mile relay and placed third in the 800 Meter Run at the county meet. At Rochester High School he starred in football, baseball, and track. He earned all league honors in football twice. In his senior season he earned all league, all county and all state honors in football.

RON FOX–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played football, basketball and baseball. He was on the championship teams for football and basketball. Our hall of famer played football, basketball and

baseball at Rochester High School. He starred in baseball earning all-league honors twice and all-county honors his senior season.

SHELLY SCOTT–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played basketball, volleyball and softball. Our hall of famer played volleyball and softball at Rochester High School. She excelled at both earning All league honors in volleyball three times and all area once. In softball she earned all league honors twice and all area once. Our hall of famer went on to play softball and volleyball at Olivet.

DIANA LEONARD–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played basketball, volleyball and softball. She was on the championship teams for track four times where the team earned 6th place in the county. Our hall of famer played basketball, volleyball and track at Rochester High School. She starred in volleyball earning all league honors twice and all area honors once. Our hall of famer went on to play volleyball at Olivet.

BRUCE CROSTHWAITE–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played football, basketball and baseball. He was on the championship teams for football and basketball. Our hall of famer played football and basketball at Rochester High School. In basketball he earned all league, all area, and all county honors. In football he earned all league honors twice and capped off his career his senior season named to the all area, all county and all state teams. He went on to play quarterback at Adrian College where set passing records and is in the Adrian Bulldog Hall of Fame.

JOHN WUEBBEN–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played football, wrestling and was on the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. He was on the championship team for football. Our hall of famer played soccer and wrestled at Rochester High School where he earned all conference and all area honors in wrestling. After graduation he came back to help coach Reuther's wrestling team.

BRAD AUDET–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played football, wrestling, track and was on the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. He was on four track, one wrestling, and one football championship teams.

Our hall of fame honoree was a 3 time city champion in 3 different events (100, Shot Put, 400 Relay). At the county meet he earned top 6 in 3 events including a county championship in the mile relay. One of the seasons he was on a team that captured runner up at the county meet. At Rochester High School, this hall of famer played football and track. He capped off his career by earning all league, all county and all state honors in track his senior year. This hall of famer held for a time the school shot put record and was the state runner up in the discus. After graduation he would go to Oakland University and run track. He also would go back to coach track at Rochester High School.

JEFF BRUZZESE–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He was on two track, one football and one basketball championship teams. One of the track seasons he was on the team that was county runner up. This hall of famer was a city champion and county champion in the mile relay. He participated in skiing and swimming at Rochester High School. He was a special athlete who left us far too soon.

JEFF CHILDERS–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played football, basketball and track at Reuther. He was on four track, one football and one basketball championship teams. This hall of famer was a city champion in four different events (110 and 300 hurdles, 400 and 1600 relays) and was one of the school's greatest hurdlers in school history earning 3rd place in the 300 meter hurdles at the county meet. He was also a county champion in the mile relay and one of the championship teams he was on took runner up at the county meet. At Rochester High School he continued to excel in football, basketball, and track. He capped off a great career earning all league and all state honors in football and all league honors in basketball in his senior season.

TERRY WHITT–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played football and track at Reuther. He was on two football and four track championship teams. He was a key member of the track team that was runner up at the county meet. Our hall of famer was a city champion in 3 different events (Long Jump, 200, and 400 relay). He also won the county meet in the long jump and the mile relay while getting runner up in the 200 meter dash. His long jump record of 18 feet 5 inches held for 31 years until 2011. At Rochester High School he participated in marine fitness, cross country and track. This hall of famer was a key member of the 1984 national champion Marine Fitness team. He would earn all league and all county

honors for two years and was the team MVP in track. He capped off his career still holding the 1600 meter relay record since 1983 with a time of 3 minutes 21.30 seconds.

MELISSA HOWELL–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She was on four championship track teams and one volleyball championship team as well as a key member of the 6th place team at the county meet. Without question this hall of famer is the queen of distance. She still holds the 2 mile run record of 12 minutes 7.60 since 1980 and held the 1 mile run record of 5 minutes 38.40 seconds from 1980 until 2004. At Rochester High School she earned all league, all area, and all county honors twice in cross country and all state honors once. This hall of famer would also have the RHS Two Mile Relay record until it was broken in 2010. She capped off her career earning all league honors in track.

BERNI BRANTON–CLASS OF 1981

This honoree played cheerleading, track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She was on four championship track teams and was a key member of the 6th place team at the county meet. She is still the queen of the 100 meter dash as the time of 12.50 seconds has been on the board since 1980. At the Oakland County meet she was the champion in the 200 meter dash and runner up in the 100 meter dash. At Rochester High School she was a member of the cheerleading team and track team earning all league and all county honors in track twice. At the regional meet she earned 3 championships in two different events and qualified for the state finals in 4 different events. In her senior season she was team MVP and was all state earning 7th place in the 100 meter dash. Four of her records in track at Rochester High School stood for more than 25 years. After high school she earned a scholarship to run track at Oakland University. She is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

CLASS OF 1982

JEFF BECHTEL–CLASS OF 1982

This honoree ran track at Reuther. He was on four championship track teams at Reuther. At Rochester High School he ran track and earned all league honors twice and all county honors once. This hall of famer still holds the pole vault record of 14 feet 1 inch since 1984. An incredible 40 years! He capped off his career earning all state honors taking 5th place in the pole vault.

SCOTT BALTER–CLASS OF 1982

This honoree wrestled, ran track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. He was part of 3 wrestling team championships and 4 track team championships at Reuther. He was on more team championships than anyone in school history. At Rochester High School he was on the marine fitness, cross country and track teams. This hall of famer was a key member of the 1985 national champion Marine Fitness team. He earned all league and all county honors in track.

ED COYLE–CLASS OF 1982

This honoree played football, wrestling and track at Reuther. He was on 1 football, 2 wrestling and 2 track championship teams at Reuther. At Rochester High School he was a standout wrestler earning all league and all area honors. He also was a regional and state qualifier. He later returned to help coach at Reuther and Rochester High School in wrestling.

LYNNETTE GOLEN–CLASS OF 1982

This honoree played basketball, volleyball and softball at Reuther. She was part of 1 championship team in basketball, 2 in volleyball, and 1 in softball. At Rochester High School she played basketball, volleyball, and softball. She earned all league honors in volleyball. In softball, she earned all league honors twice, all area and all region honors once, and all county honors twice.

SARA GRYLICKI–CLASS OF 1982

This honoree played volleyball, track, and softball at Reuther. She was on two championship volleyball teams, 1 championship track team and 1 championship softball team at Reuther. At Rochester High School she played volleyball and softball. She earned all league honors in volleyball to cap off her senior year.

STEVE PROPER–CLASS OF 1982

This honoree played football, basketball, and baseball at Reuther. He was on 1 football and 1 basketball championship teams at Reuther. MEGAN DAVIES–CLASS OF 1982

This honoree played basketball, cheerleading, track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She was on two championship track teams at Reuther. Our hall of fame member was a record holder in the 800 meter relay team with a time of 1 minute 57.60 seconds. The record was held from 1981-2019; a total of 38 years!

RENEE DUKAT–CLASS OF 1982

This honoree played basketball, volleyball and track at Reuther. She was on 2 championship teams for track and 1 championship team for volleyball. Our hall of fame member was a record holder in the 800 meter relay team with a time of 1 minute 57.60 seconds. The record was held from 1981-2008; a total of 27 years! At Rochester High School she participated in basketball, volleyball, softball, and track.

RENEE HRADSKY–CLASS OF 1982

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track. She was on 1 championship team for volleyball. She was a track city meet champion in the 100 meter dash. Our hall of fame member was a record holder in the 800 meter relay team with a time of 1 minute 58.60 seconds. The record was held from 1981-2008; a total of 27 years! At Rochester High School she played basketball, volleyball, and track.

CLASS OF 1983

LISA ROTONDO–CLASS OF 1983

This honoree played cheerleading, volleyball, gymnastics, track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She earned one championship in volleyball. In track she was two time city champion in the long jump. Our hall of famer was the queen of the 70 meter dash holding the record with a time of 9.10 seconds from 1982-2023; a total of 41 years. She is also a record holder in the 800 meter relay team with a time of 1 minute 58.60 seconds. The record was held from 1981-2008; a total of 27 years! At Rochester High School she was on the marine fitness, track, swimming team and gymnastics team. This hall of famer was a key member of the 1985 and 1986 national champion Marine Fitness team. She excelled in gymnastics earning all league and all area honors 3 times. She also qualified for states two years capping off her senior year, named to the all state team in 4 events and became an All American on the balance beam and floor exercise. She later returned to Rochester High School to help coach the gymnastics team.

CRAIG BALTER—CLASS OF 1983

This honoree played football, basketball, wrestling, and track at Reuther. He earned one championship in wrestling and six championships in track. He earned more team championships than any other player in Reuther history. Our hall of famer was the county champion in the shot put. At Rochester High School he played football, wrestling and track. He earned all league honors once, all area honors twice and was a regional and state qualifier in wrestling. He also earned all league and all area honors in football.

NATE CHILDERS—CLASS OF 1983

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned one championship in basketball and six championships in track. He earned more team championships than any other player in Reuther history. At Rochester High School he played football, cross country, basketball, and track. He earned all league honors in basketball and earned all league, all area, all county and all state honors in track. This hall of famer would also coach track at Rochester High School, and track and basketball at Hart and Van Hoosen Middle Schools.

JEFF LALONDE—CLASS OF 1983

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned 1 championship in basketball and two championships in track. He is the king of the half mile, running it in 2 minutes 9.80 seconds and has held the record since 1982; 42 years!

BECKY MEREDITH—CLASS OF 1983

This honoree played volleyball gymnastics, track, and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She earned 2 championships in gymnastics and 1 in volleyball. She is the queen of the high jump, jumping a record 4 foot 9 inches and holding that record from 1982-2007; an amazing 25 years! At Rochester High School she was on the marine fitness team, swim team and starred in gymnastics. This hall of famer was a key member of the 1985 and 1986 national champion Marine Fitness team. She earned all league and all area honors for three years and qualified for the state finals. This hall of famer capped off her career by being named an academic all American in the balance beam and floor exercise.

KIM MOFFATT—CLASS OF 1983

This honoree played basketball, cheerleading, and track at Reuther. She earned a championship in basketball. Our hall of famer is the queen of the half mile running it in a record time of 2 minutes 38.30 seconds. She would hold this record from 1982-1999; a remarkable 17 years! At Rochester High School she excelled in cross country and track. In track she earned all areas one time. In cross country this hall of famer earned all league and all area 3 times, all county two times and capped off her career by earning all state honors her senior year.

KELLEY PROPER—CLASS OF 1983

This honoree played basketball, cheerleading, gymnastics, and track at Reuther. She earned 2 championships in gymnastics. Our hall of famer is also one of the school's high jump queens as she jumped a 9th grade record 4 foot 10 inches at the city meet earning a city championship. This city meet record would stand until the early 2000's. At Rochester High she was on the cross country, cheerleading, and track teams. This hall of famer continued her track success in the high jump where she earned all league honors twice. After graduation she earned a scholarship to Central Michigan University where she ran track.

CLASS OF 1984

AMBER CRAWFORD—CLASS OF 1984

This honoree participated in cheerleading, gymnastics, track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She was on 3 championship teams in track. At Rochester High School she played basketball, cross country, and track. She earned all league honors twice in track and in cross country she excelled earning all league, all area and all county accolades twice and capped off her senior season by earning all state.

JOHN COYLE–CLASS OF 1984

This honoree played football and wrestling at Reuther. He was on 5 championship teams in wrestling, second most in Reuther history. At Rochester High School he played football and wrestling. He excelled in wrestling earning all league and all area honors twice, was all county once, qualifying for regionals twice and states once and highlighted his senior season as a county champion.

CHAD FINDLEY–CLASS OF 1984

This honoree participated in track and was on the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. He was considered one of the greatest athletes to ever be on the Marine Fitness team. At Rochester High School he participated in cross country and track. In cross country he held the 6th fastest 5000 meter run with a time of 15 minutes 41 seconds in 1986. In track he earned all area honors once and in cross country he earned all league honors 3 times, all area, all county and all state honors twice. In the state meet finals he earned a 4th place finish his junior year and a 5th place finish his senior year. He is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

JENNIFER GOLEN–CLASS OF 1984

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, track, softball, and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She was part of two championship teams in softball. The #20 basketball jersey is retired and she is one of Reuther's greatest athletes of the first 50 years. At Rochester High School she participated in basketball, volleyball, and softball. In volleyball she earned all league, all area and all county her senior year. In basketball and softball combined she earned all league, all area, all county 6 times, all district twice and all state three times. After graduation she played basketball at Oakland University earning all American honors twice. This hall of famer would return to Rochester High School as a coach. The mile run record was 5 minutes 4.60 seconds; a record that would stand from 1983 until 2002. He also has the record in the mile relay with a time of 4 minutes 0.80 seconds. This record was held from 1983 until 2001. At Rochester High School he participated in soccer and track. This hall of famer earned all league honors in track once and capped off his senior year earning all league and all county in soccer.

MARC JAKARY—CLASS OF 1984

This honoree ran track at Reuther. He has the record in the mile relay with a time of 4 minutes 0.80 seconds. This record was held from 1983 until 2001. He left Rochester for East Grand Rapids high school where he ran cross country and track. He earned all league honors in both sports and capped off his senior season earning all state honors in the mile run.

JOHN LAND—CLASS OF 1984

This honoree played football, basketball, baseball and track at Reuther. He has the record in the mile relay with a time of 4 minutes 0.80 seconds. This record was held from 1983 until 2001. At Rochester High School he participated in football and track.

DENNIS VIEAU—CLASS OF 1984

This honoree played football, wrestling, and track at Reuther. He earned 3 team championships in wrestling. Our hall of famer was the 2 mile run city champion in 1983. The king of the 2 mile has held the two mile run record of 10 minutes 45.50 seconds since 1983; one of the longest track records in Reuther history. He has the record in the mile relay with a time of 4 minutes 0.80 seconds. This record was held until 2001.

MARGARET SULLIVAN—CLASS OF 1984

This honoree was in cheerleading and track at Reuther. She earned 3 championships in track. She had the record in the mile relay with a time of 4 minutes 25.90 seconds. This record has been on the board since 1983; an amazing 41 years and counting. At Rochester High School she participated in cross country and track. This hall of famer was one of the greatest hurdlers at Rochester High School earning all league honors 3 times and all area honors once. She was the league champion in the hurdles. This hall of famer capped off her career by tying the record in the 300 meter low hurdles with a time of 46.0 seconds. This record has been on the board since 1983 and 1987; an

amazing 41 years! The record was originally set in 1983 with a time of 46.0 by her sister Gloria Sullivan! After graduation she went to the University of Kansas and ran sprints and hurdles on the track team earning her letter.

ALLISON WAILING–CLASS OF 1984

This honoree was in cheerleading, gymnastics, track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She earned 2 gymnastics and 3 track team championships at Reuther. She has the record in the mile relay with a time of 4 minutes 25.90 seconds. This record has been on the board since 1983; an amazing 41 years and counting. At Rochester High School she participated in cross country, gymnastics, and track. After graduation she went to Purdue University and ran distance on the track team earning her letter.

AMY WALKER–CLASS OF 1984

This honoree was in basketball and track at Reuther. She was the city meet champion in the mile run in 1983. This hall of famer has the record in the mile relay with a time of 4 minutes 25.90 seconds. This record has been on the board since 1983; an amazing 41 years and counting. At Rochester High School she participated in track.

DENISE GAZSO–CLASS OF 1984

This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. She earned 3 track team championships at Reuther. She has the record in the mile relay with a time of 4 minutes 25.90 seconds. This record has been on the board since 1983; an amazing 41 years and counting. At Rochester High School she participated in track.

CLASS OF 1985

VICKI BUTCHKO–CLASS OF 1985

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, track and was part of the Marine Fitness team. She earned three team championships at Reuther; one each in basketball, volleyball, and track. This hall of famer threw the shot put 32 feet 7 inches and held the record from 1982-2007; an amazing 25 years! At Rochester High School she ran cross country and track. She excelled in the shot put earning all league honors.

ANTHONY WUEBBEN–CLASS OF 1985

This honoree played football, wrestling, track, and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. He earned 6 wrestling team championships at Reuther which is a record. At Rochester High School he participated on the golf, skiing, and wrestling teams. This hall of famer was a key member of the 1987 and 1988 national champion Marine Fitness team. He was a stand out wrestler earning all league, all area honors and qualified for regionals on a very successful Rochester High School team.

CLARE COYLE–CLASS OF 1985

This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. She earned one basketball and three track team championships at Reuther. Her 9th grade girls basketball team won more games in a season (16) than any team in Reuther history. At Rochester High School she played basketball and track. She earned all league honors in basketball and track and was part of many championship teams in both sports. This hall of famer would go on to play college basketball at Austin Peay State University.

KARA DENYER–CLASS OF 1985

Her 9th grade girls basketball team won more games in a season (16) than any team in Reuther history. At Rochester High School she played soccer and basketball. She was part of many championship teams in soccer and basketball.

MICHELE TEVLIN–CLASS OF 1985

This honoree ran track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She earned 1 track team championship at Reuther. This honoree ran track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She earned 1 track team championship at Reuther. She held the 400 meter relay record with a time of 55.01 seconds from 1984-2019. A record that stood for 35 years!

JANE ZEGERS—CLASS OF 1985

This honoree participated in gymnastics, track and was part of Marine Fitness at Reuther. She earned 1 track team championship at Reuther. At Rochester High School she ran cross country, track, and was on the Marine Fitness team. This hall of famer was a 2 time individual national champion in Marine Fitness. She was also on 3 consecutive national championship teams as well.

CLASS OF 1986

TARA ADKINS—CLASS OF 1986

This honoree participated in gymnastics, track and was a cheerleader at Reuther. She earned 1 track team championship at Reuther. She held the 400 meter relay record with a time of 55.01 seconds from 1984-2019. A record that stood for 35 years! At Rochester High School she was co-captain for competitive cheerleading and her team was the first ever to win a state championship in the sport. She also earned all league and all state honors in the sport.

DAWN BROOKS—CLASS OF 1986

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, softball, and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. She earned 1 team championship in basketball and 1 team championship in volleyball. At Rochester High School she played basketball, volleyball, and softball. She earned all league, all area and all county honors twice in basketball and all state honors her senior season. In volleyball she earned all league honors once and in softball earned all league honors twice and all area honors once. After graduation she went to Adrian where she played basketball and is in the Adrian Bulldog Hall of Fame. She is also a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

MIKE JOHNS—CLASS OF 1986

This honoree ran track at Reuther. Our hall of famer is the king of the 100 meter. He ran the 100 in 10.98 seconds back in 1985. A record that still stands 39 years later! He also held the 800 meter relay record in a time of 1 minute 42.50 seconds that was not broken until 2005; 20 years! Finally, he held the 400 meter relay record in a time of 49.32 seconds that was broken in 1998.

MIKE GADEN—CLASS OF 1986

This honoree played football, basketball, track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. The hall of famer is one of the greatest sprinters in Reuther history! He held the 800 meter relay record in a time of 1 minute 42.50 seconds that was not broken until 2005; 20 years! Finally, he held the 400 meter relay record in a time of 49.32 seconds that was broken in 1998. At Rochester High School he played soccer and was on the ski team.

JOE JANOSCHKA—CLASS OF 1986

This honoree ran track and was part of the Marine Fitness team at Reuther. He held the 800 meter relay record in a time of 1 minute 42.50 seconds that was not broken until 2005; 20 years! Finally, he held the 400 meter relay record in a time of 49.32 seconds that was broken in 1998. At Rochester High School he ran track and was named to the all league team once.

JOHN LANG—CLASS OF 1986

This honoree played football, wrestled and was on the track team at Reuther. This hall of famer is one of the greatest sprinters in Reuther history! He held the 800 meter relay record in a time of 1 minute 42.50 seconds that was not broken until 2005; 20 years! He also held the 400 meter relay record in a time of 49.32 seconds that was broken in 1998. Finally, he held the 200 meter record of 23.96 from 1985 until 2017; an amazing 32 years! At Rochester High School he played football and ran track.

TODD ANDRAS–CLASS OF 1986

This honoree played football, basketball, and was on the track team at Reuther. He earned 1 team championship in basketball. At Rochester High School he played football and basketball. He was a key member of some of the greatest Rochester High School basketball teams in the history of the school. This hall of famer earned all league honors in basketball his senior season. He excelled in football where he capped off his high school career earning all league, all area, and all state honors.

MIKE MOSCATO–CLASS OF 1986

This honoree played football, basketball, and was on the track team at Reuther. He earned 1 team championship in basketball. The #32 basketball jersey is retired and he is one of Reuther's greatest athletes of the first 50 years. At Rochester High School he played football and basketball leading his teams to multiple championships. In football he concluded his senior season with all league honors. This hall of famer excelled in basketball. Earning all league, all area, and all county honors all 3 years. He capped off his senior season earning league MVP, all state, MHSBCA all star and McDonald's High School All American nomination. After graduation, he played at Macomb Community College before transferring to Wayne State University. At Wayne State he led his basketball team to the Sweet 16 and Final 4 in his final two seasons. Upon graduation from Wayne State he would help coach the Falcon Boys Basketball program. He is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

CLASS OF 1987

JILL KELLER–CLASS OF 1987

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and softball at Reuther. She scored the most points in a season in girls basketball history; a record that still stands. At Rochester High School she played basketball and softball. She played on many championship teams in both sports. This hall of famer excelled in softball, earning all

league and all area honors three times and all county honors twice. After graduation, Jill earned a scholarship to Hillsdale College where she played softball for 4 years earning all league honors.

CLASS OF 1988

PATRICK HACHENSKI–CLASS OF 1988

This honoree played basketball and baseball at Reuther. At Rochester High School he played basketball and baseball. He earned all league, all area, all district and all county honors twice. This hall of famer helped lead his team to multiple championships in baseball as well as state runner up in his junior year. After graduation, he played at Michigan State University for 4 years as an infielder and relief pitcher. He is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame as one of the school's greatest baseball players.

CLASS OF 1989

JESSICA SCHELL–CLASS OF 1989

This honoree played basketball, volleyball and track at Reuther. She earned a team championship in volleyball. At Rochester High School she excelled in basketball earning all league twice, all area twice, all county, and all state honors. This hall of famer played on many championship teams.

CLASS OF 1990

RON LAMARAND–CLASS OF 1990

This honoree played football, basketball, wrestling and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships in wrestling. This 4 sport athlete excelled in track where he held the 55 Meter Hurdles record from 1989 until 2003 a remarkable 14 years. At Rochester High School he played football and track.

MIKE CIPA–CLASS OF 1990

This honoree played football and baseball at Reuther. He is considered to be the best offensive lineman to ever play at Reuther. He earned a team championship in baseball at Reuther. At Rochester High School he played football and track. He excelled at football earning all league, all area, all county and all state honors. He led his team to a league championship and a trip to the state playoffs. This hall of famer would be ranked as one of the Top 50 football players in the state by the Detroit News. He would go on to anchor the offensive line at Central Michigan University and earn all conference honors. He was invited to camp as a free agent and earned a spot on the practice squad for the Super Bowl champion Oakland Raiders. He is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

CLASS OF 1991

BRIAN AULPH—CLASS OF 1991

This honoree played football, wrestling and baseball at Reuther. He would go on to play football and baseball at Rochester High School. He was a key member of the RHS football team that won a league championship and a trip to the state playoffs. This hall of famer would take his talents to Albion College where he played football. After graduation he taught Spanish and coached football for 13 years. He was a special athlete who left us far too soon.

PETER MARVIN—CLASS OF 1991

This honoree ran track at Reuther. He held the 55 Meter Hurdles record from 1991 until 2003; an amazing 12 years! At Rochester High School he ran track as well.

KELLY RIES—CLASS OF 1991

This honoree was in cheerleading, volleyball, gymnastics, and softball. She excelled in all 4 sports at Reuther capping off her Reuther career as the city champion in the all around her 8th grade year at the Gymnastics City Meet. This hall of famer would later go on to Rochester High School where she excelled in softball earning all league and all district honors to cap off her career.

CLASS OF 1992

JENNY SCHELL–CLASS OF 1992

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and softball at Reuther. She is one of top basketball and softball players in the history of Reuther. At Rochester High School she played basketball and softball excelling at both. In basketball she earned all league honors and was part of many championship teams.

NICOLE HUGH–CLASS OF 1992

This honoree played basketball, volleyball and track at Reuther. She excelled in track running the 200 meter dash to a record time of 27.82 seconds. This hall of famer held this record from 1992 until 2004; a remarkable 12 years. In her 8th grade year she also was the queen of speed earning the city championship in the 100 meter dash. At Rochester High School she continued to run track and be a key member of the Falcon track team.

CLASS OF 1993

MELISSA CHARNESKY–CLASS OF 1993

This honoree participated in cheerleading at Reuther. At Rochester High School she was considered one of the greatest cheerleaders in history earning a prestigious academic award for her sport. She was also part of 5 state championship cheer teams.

AMANDA CROWELL–CLASS OF 1993

This honoree participated in basketball and track at Reuther. At Rochester High School she was a key member of the cross country and track teams. In cross country she earned all city and all league honors, was a state qualifier and was team MVP. She came back to help coach the Reuther track team. She was a special athlete who left us far too soon. This hall of famer has an athletic leadership award at Reuther named in her honor.

CLASS OF 1994

MIKE BENNION—CLASS OF 1994

This honoree played football and basketball at Reuther. He earned a basketball team championship at Reuther. This hall of famer ranks 5th in points (125) and scoring average (11.4) in a season in basketball. He was named to the first team all 1990's decade basketball team and is on the first team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present). At Rochester High School he played football, basketball, and baseball. He was a 3 year starter at quarterback earning all league honors his senior year. He excelled in baseball earning all league, all district, all county, and all region honors for three years and all state honors for two years. He capped off his career on the mound getting the final out leading RHS to the state baseball title in 1998. After graduation this hall of famer went to Oakland University to play baseball. He would later coach baseball and basketball at Adams High School. He is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

AARON BURTON—CLASS OF 1994

This honoree played football, basketball and track at Reuther. He earned a basketball team championship at Reuther. He was named to the first team all decade basketball team. In football he starred at fullback and linebacker. In track he earned his greatest accomplishments breaking the shot put record with a toss of 42 feet 2 inches. A record he would hold for two years. This hall of famer never lost a race or shot put event his 8th grade season at Reuther. He earned 3 individual city championships in the shot put, 100 meter dash and 400 meter relay. This hall of famer is on the 2nd Team All Decade basketball team for the 1990's. He is one of the 30 greatest basketball players in the middle school era (1987-present) being selected to the 3rd team. At Rochester High School he would star in football and track. He would continue his prowess on the gridiron becoming one of the Falcons greatest two way players at full back and linebacker. He would also become an all league and all state performer in track throwing the shot put. After graduation he would play football at Ferris State University. He is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

MICHAEL COLLINS—CLASS OF 1994

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He was one of the greatest running backs in Reuther history. He also starred in track in the sprints earning 2 individual city championships in the 70 meter dash and 400 meter relay. At Rochester

High School he would star in football. He would continue his prowess on the gridiron at Saginaw Valley State University at the running back position.

MAGAN RASCH–CLASS OF 1994

This honoree played basketball and volleyball at Reuther. She earned a basketball team championship at Reuther. This hall of famer is one of the greatest basketball players at Reuther. At Rochester High School she played basketball and softball. She earned all league honors in both sports. Our hall of famer also contributed to a number of championship teams.

CLASS OF 1995

TIFFANY HARWICK–CLASS OF 1995

This honoree played volleyball and track at Reuther. She excelled in track earning 3 individual city championships in the hurdles (2 in the 55 meter and 1 in the 200). This hall of famer also held the 55 Meter Hurdle record with a time of 9.37 seconds from 1995-2002. She also to this day holds the 200 Meter Hurdle record with a time of 31.45 seconds. An amazing 29 years (1995-Present). At Rochester High School this hall of famer ran track.

CHRIS BALLARD–CLASS OF 1995

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He excelled in the high jump holding the record with a jump of 5 feet 6 and $\frac{1}{4}$ inches. A record he would hold from 1995-2011; an amazing 16 years! This hall of famer was also the city champion in the high jump in 1995.

CLASS OF 1996

ALISON FIELDS–CLASS OF 1996

This honoree played basketball and volleyball at Reuther. She is considered one of the greatest setters to play the position at Reuther and Rochester High School history. This hall of famer earned all league and all region honors in volleyball. After graduation she played volleyball at Stony Point University where she continued her mastery at the

setters position. Our hall of famer would later become a fixture as a coach at Legacy volleyball and is the current varsity volleyball coach at Clarkston High School where her 2023 team won league, district and regional championships. Her team would ultimately get to the state semifinals.

EDDIE HILLERY—CLASS OF 1996

This honoree played football, basketball, and basketball at Reuther. He earned a team championship in football. The #29 football jersey is retired and he is one of Reuther's greatest athletes of the first 50 years. In football he set records for rushing yards at the running back position. This hall of famer ranks third in total points (171) and scoring average (14.3) in a season in basketball. He scored 24 points in a game which is the 5th highest of all time. He was named to the first team 1990's all decade basketball team and is on the first team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present). In track he has the record in the shot put with a throw of 45 feet 2 ½ inches. He earned this record in 1996 and it still stands 28 years later. This hall of famer won 3 individual city championships in the 70 meter dash, 100 meter dash and the shot put. He capped his middle school career by winning the county championship in the 70 meter dash and earning runner up in the 100 meter dash and shot put. At Rochester High School he played football, basketball, and track. In basketball he helped lead his team to a league championship. In track he still holds the long jump record of 22 feet 10 ½ inches. He was a state qualifier in the 100 meter dash, long jump and shot put. It was football where this hall of famer starred. He still holds the record for rushing and all purpose yards. He earned all league, all county and all state honors and was named one of the Top 25 players in the county and Top 50 players in the state. After graduation he played football at Central Michigan University where he played linebacker. He played professionally in Germany and Finland. Currently he is the defensive coordinator of the RHS varsity football team. He is in the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

CLASS OF 1997

MARCUS COLLINS—CLASS OF 1997

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned a team championship in football at Reuther. This hall of famer excelled in track running the toughest race...the 400 Meter. He was the city champion and county champion in the 400 Meter Dash. He ran a record time of 56.88 seconds. Our hall of famer held this

record from 1997-2001. At Rochester High School he played football, basketball, and track.

BECKY HOEFING–CLASS OF 1997

This honoree played basketball, cheerleading, volleyball and track at Reuther. She earned two team championships in cheerleading. This hall of famer is one of the greatest cheerleaders and long distance runners in the history of the school. She excelled in track where she ran the 3200 Meter Run and the 3200 Meter Relay. She helped set the 3200 Meter Relay record with a time of 12 minutes and 11 seconds in 1997. That record would stand for five years. At Rochester High School she would run cross country and track and be part of the competitive cheerleading team. As a cheerleader, she helped her team win 3 straight state championships from 1999-2001. In track she was part of the 3200 meter relay team that earned all state honors in 2001..

TIFFANY BACKS–CLASS OF 1997

This honoree played volleyball, cheerleading, and track at Reuther. She earned two team championships in cheerleading. This hall of famer is one of the greatest cheerleaders in the history of the school. At Rochester High School she would continue being part of a competitive cheerleading team. She helped her team win 3 straight state championships from 1999-2001.

JACLYN PODOR–CLASS OF 1997

This honoree was part of the cheerleading team at Reuther. She earned two team championships in cheerleading. This hall of famer is one of the greatest cheerleaders in the history of the school. At Rochester High School she would continue being part of a competitive cheerleading team. She helped her team win 3 straight state championships from 1999-2001.

CARRIE VOSS–CLASS OF 1997

This honoree was part of the cheerleading team at Reuther. She earned two team championships in cheerleading. This hall of famer is one of the greatest cheerleaders in the history of the school. At Rochester High School she would continue being part of a competitive cheerleading team. She helped her team win 3 straight state championships from 1999-2001.

CANDICE WU—CLASS OF 1997

This honoree was part of the cheerleading team at Reuther. She earned two team championships in cheerleading. This hall of famer is one of the greatest cheerleaders in the history of Reuther. At Rochester High school she would continue being part of a competitive cheerleading team. She helped her team win 3 straight state championships from 1999-2001.

ANTHONY MILESKI—CLASS OF 1997

This honoree was part of the football and wrestling teams at Reuther. He earned five team championships; one in football and four in wrestling. As a wrestler he won two individual city championships. He was a special athlete who left us far too soon. The Anthony M. Mileski Award is given annually to the top football and wrestling player at Reuther. His family continues to support the Reuther Wrestling program as they donated monies to our new competition mats in his memory and present the annual award every year at the school's Memorial Day Assembly.

CLASS OF 1998

PAUL DAVIS—CLASS OF 1998

This honoree played basketball at Reuther. The #54 basketball jersey is retired. He is the greatest basketball player to ever play at Reuther. This hall of famer ranks second all time for total points scored (186) and scoring average (15.5) in a season in basketball. He was named to the first team all 1990's decade basketball team and is on the first team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present). At Rochester High School he earned all league, all county, and all state honors. To cap off his career, he earned the state's highest award as Mr. Basketball in 2002 and was named to the McDonald's High School All American team. Upon graduation he decided to play basketball at Michigan State turning down offers from dozens of top Division 1 basketball programs throughout the country. At Michigan State he helped the Spartans to a Final Four appearance in 2005. He would earn All Big Ten Media and Coaches honors his final three years. He capped off his career by being the #34 (2nd round) pick in the 2006 NBA draft by the Los Angeles Clippers. He would play 3 seasons with the Clippers and Washington Wizards before playing overseas in multiple countries including helping his Russia team to a championship. He is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

CHRISTIAN HUTCHINSON–CLASS OF 1998

This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in track at Reuther. He earned two individual city championships in track by winning the 70 meter dash and was part of the 400 meter relay team. At the county meet, this hall of famer would earn a 6th place finish in the 70 meter dash and the 400 meter relay team would earn 4th place. He held the 400 meter relay record with a time of 49.25 seconds from 1998-2011; a remarkable 13 years! At Rochester High School he played football, basketball, and track. He would return to RHS to help coach the Falcon football program.

MARCO ROSADO–CLASS OF 1998

This honoree ran track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in track at Reuther. He earned a city championship in track by being a part of the 400 meter relay team. At the county meet, this hall of famer would earn a 4th place as part of the 400 meter relay team. He held the 400 meter relay record with a time of 49.25 seconds from 1998-2011; a remarkable 13 years! At Rochester High School he ran cross country and track.

SIDNEY HICKS–CLASS OF 1998

This honoree ran track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in track at Reuther. He earned two individual city championships in track by winning the 100 meter dash and was part of the 400 meter relay team. At the county meet, this hall of famer would earn a 4th place finish in the 100 meter dash and the 400 meter relay team would earn 4th place. He held the 400 meter relay record with a time of 49.25 seconds from 1998-2011; a remarkable 13 years! At Rochester High School he ran cross country and track.

CLASS OF 1999

ADAM DUDEK–CLASS OF 1999

This honoree played football, wrestling, and track at Reuther. He earned four team championships at Reuther; two in wrestling and two in track. He earned four individual city championships in track; two as part of the 400 meter relay team, one in the shot put, and one in the 200 meter dash. At the county meet, this hall of famer would earn a 4th

place finish as part of the 400 meter relay team. He held the 400 meter relay record with a time of 49.25 seconds from 1998-2011; a remarkable 13 years! At Rochester High School he played football and ran track.

JOE BANISH—CLASS OF 1999

This honoree played football, basketball, wrestling and track at Reuther. He earned four team championships at Reuther; two in wrestling and two in track. He earned two individual city championships; one in track as part of the 400 meter relay team and in wrestling. At Rochester High School he played football and wrestling.

JOE DELIA—CLASS OF 1999

This honoree played football and wrestling at Reuther. He earned three team championships at Reuther; two in wrestling and one in football. He earned one individual city championship in wrestling. At Rochester High School he played football and wrestling. In wrestling he was part of the Falcon 100 win club. He qualified for states once, was a two time regional qualifier and placed 3 times at the county meet winning the championship in his weight class.

BRAD PRZYMUSINSKI—CLASS OF 1999

This honoree played football, basketball and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships in track at Reuther. He has held the 3200 Meter Relay team record with a time of 9 minutes 30.50 seconds. That record was set in 1999 and is still on the board 25 years later! This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships in track at Reuther. He has held the 3200 Meter Relay team record with a time of 9 minutes 30.50 seconds. That record was set in 1999 and is still on the board 25 years later! At Rochester High School he played football and was also on the ski and track teams.

GONZALO NESPOLO—CLASS OF 1999

This honoree ran track at Reuther. He earned two team championships in track at Reuther. He has held the 3200 Meter Relay team record with a time of 9 minutes 30.50 seconds. That record was set in 1999 and is still on the board 25 years later! At Rochester High School he played soccer and ran track. He was part of the Falcon State Championship soccer team his senior year.

STEVEN KNOBLOCK–CLASS OF 1999

This honoree played football, basketball and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships in track at Reuther. He earned a city championship in the high jump. At the county meet he earned a runner up in the 800 meter run and earned a 5th place in the high jump. Originally helped set the 3200 meter relay record in 1998 with a time of 9 minutes 50 seconds; a record that he would break the next year. He has held the 3200 Meter Relay team record with a time of 9 minutes 30.50 seconds. That record was set in 1999 and is still on the board 25 years later! At Rochester High School he played football, basketball, and track. He earned all league honors in football and continued to excel in track.

JAMES CAMPBELL–CLASS OF 1999

This honoree played football, basketball, wrestling, and track at Reuther. He earned five team championships; one in football, two in wrestling, and two in track. He earned two city championships in wrestling and was undefeated in two years of competition. At Rochester High School he played football and he excelled in wrestling. He was a two-time state qualifier.

CLASS OF 2000

SARAH EDGAR–CLASS OF 2000

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She became Reuther's shot put queen in 2000 throwing a record 33 feet 10 inches. She would hold this record for an amazing 18 years!

GUILLERMO ARTURO JAIME LEÓN–CLASS OF 2000

This honoree wrestled and ran track at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in wrestling and one in track. He is one of the greatest distance runners in

Reuther history earning 3 individual city championships. He won the 1600 and 3200 meter runs and was part of the 3200 meter relay team. At the county meet he took 4th place in the 3200 run and 5th place in the 1600 meter run. At Rochester High School he played soccer and ran track.

CLASS OF 2001

GARY HEPBURN–CLASS OF 2001

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in football and one in track. He is 10th on the all time season scoring list (98 points) and is on the first team all decade team for the 2000's. He is one of the 30 greatest basketball players in the middle school era (1987-present) being named to the 3rd team. At Rochester High School he played football and basketball.

CHRIS SMARTT–CLASS OF 2001

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in football and one in track. He earned a city championship in the 3200 meter relay. This hall of famer earned a 4th place at the county meet in the mile relay. The 1600 meter relay record of 3 minutes and 55 seconds was set in 2001. This amazing record still stands 23 years later! At Rochester High School he played soccer and ran track.

TIM HEPBURN–CLASS OF 2001

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in football and one in track. This hall of famer is on the second team all decade team for the 2000's. He is one of the 30 greatest basketball players in the middle school era (1987-present) being named to the 4th team. He earned a 4th place at the county meet in the mile relay. The 1600 meter relay record of 3 minutes and 55 seconds was set in 2001. This amazing record still stands 23 years later! At Rochester High School he played football and basketball.

BRANDON ELLIOTT–CLASS OF 2001

This honoree played football and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in football and one in track. At the county meet he earned 5th place in

the always tough 400 meter dash. He earned a 4th place at the county meet also in the mile relay. The 1600 meter relay record of 3 minutes and 55 seconds was set in 2001. This amazing record still stands 23 years later! At Rochester High School he played football and track. Upon graduation from Rochester High School he would continue his running career at Oakland University as a key member of the middle distance team.

JEFF BUCHI–CLASS OF 2001

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in football and one in track. This hall of famer is a 3 time city champion where he earned two titles in the 400 meter dash and one title in the High Jump. At the county meet he earned three fourth place finishes in the high jump, 400 meter dash, and the 1600 meter relay. This hall of famer held the 400 Meter Dash record with a time of 56.81 seconds. This record was held from 2001-2004. He also was part of the 1600 meter relay record of 3 minutes and 55 seconds that was set in 2001. This amazing record still stands 23 years later! At Rochester High School he played football, basketball, and baseball.

JERRY DELIA–CLASS OF 2001

This honoree played football, wrestling, and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in wrestling and one in track. This hall of famer was a city champion in wrestling. In 2001 he was awarded the Anthony M. Mileski Award for being the school's top football player and wrestler. At Rochester High School he wrestled placing twice in the county meet earning runner up in his weight class.

CLASS OF 2002

LAUREN EGBERT–CLASS OF 2002

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She earned two team championships at Reuther; one in volleyball and one in track. At the county meet she was part of a team that earned 4th and 5th places in the 1600 meter relay. She is one of the greatest hurdlers in Reuther history. She had the 55 meter hurdle school record with a time of 9.21 from 2002-2012; a remarkable 10 years! At Rochester High School she played volleyball and track.

S. BRANDON LUCZAK–CLASS OF 2002

This honoree played football and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in football and one in track. He is a city champion in the shot put. At the county meet he earned 3rd place in the shot put and was part of the 400 meter relay team that took 6th place. He is one of the greatest football players to ever play at Reuther. At Rochester High School he played football, basketball, and baseball. After graduation, he would go to Division 3 power Kalamazoo College where he played football and baseball. He earned all league honors twice in baseball. It would be football where he excelled at the quarterback position. He earned all league honors at quarterback and was an academic all American his senior season. This hall of famer still holds many single game, single season, and school records at his position. He would later return to RHS where would help coach the Falcon Boys Football program. He is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

BRETT JONES—CLASS OF 2002

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in track at Reuther. He is one of the greatest distance runners the school has ever produced. He is the “king” of the mile run where he broke the old record of 5 minutes 4.10 seconds. The new mark is 3 minutes 59.15 seconds. He would hold the record until it was broken in 2024; an amazing 22 years! He won the city championship in the 3200 meter run. At the county meet he earned 3rd place in the 3200 meter run and was the county champion in the 1600 meter run. At Rochester High School he played soccer and track. He would later return to RHS where he would help coach the Falcon Boys Soccer program.

JOHN DELIA—CLASS OF 2002

This honoree played football and wrestling at Reuther. He earned one team championship in wrestling at Reuther. He is a former city champion in the sport. At Rochester High School he would excel at wrestling where he placed multiple times at the county meet winning at all in his weight class.

JULIANNA PUTMAN—CLASS OF 2002

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in track at Reuther. She held the 3200 meter relay record with a time of 11 minutes and 11.95 seconds. This amazing record was held from 2002-2013; 11 remarkable years! At Rochester High School she was on the cross country, ski, and track teams.

MARY FINN–CLASS OF 2002

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in track at Reuther. She held the 3200 meter relay record with a time of 11 minutes and 11.95 seconds. This amazing record was held from 2002-2013; 11 remarkable years! At Rochester High School she was on the track team.

KATELYN SASS–CLASS OF 2002

This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in track at Reuther. She held the 3200 meter relay record with a time of 11 minutes and 11.95 seconds. This amazing record was held from 2002-2013; 11 remarkable years! She earned 5th place as part of the 1600 meter relay team at the county meet. This hall of famer took 4th place in the 1600 meter run at the county meet. At Rochester High School she ran cross country and track.

CLASS OF 2003

PEGGY FINN–CLASS OF 2003

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She earned two team championships in track at Reuther. She held the 3200 meter relay record with a time of 11 minutes and 11.95 seconds. This amazing record was held from 2002-2013; 11 remarkable years! At Rochester High School she was on the track team.

AMANDA BOWERY–CLASS OF 2003

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. The #18 volleyball jersey is retired and she is one of the greatest athletes of the first 50 years at Reuther. She earned two team championships at Reuther in track. She earned a city championship in the always tough 400 meter dash. At the county meet she was the runner up in the 400 meter dash. She also took 3rd place in both the 200 and 400 meter dashes. She helped her 1600 meter relay team take 5th place. Her 400 meter record time of 1 minute 2.59 seconds was held from 2002-2011. At Rochester High School she played basketball, volleyball, and soccer. She earned district titles and regional championships in basketball and district championships in volleyball. It was soccer where she became the greatest female player the school has ever seen. She

earned 3 league championships and helped lead her team to district, regional, and berth in the state finals her senior year. She earned all league team 4 times, all district and all regional teams 3 times and was twice named first team all state. She culminated her career being named to the All State Dream team. At Rochester High School she was named Female Athlete of the year as a senior. As a highly acclaimed club soccer player she led her team to 2 state championships and 2 national championships. This hall of famer continued her soccer career at the University of Michigan. For her hard work she was awarded with a spot on the Olympic Development program from 2003-2007. This hall of famer would go on to play soccer at the University of Michigan where she played in 73 games, earned honors on the all freshman team and earned all academic Big 10 two of her four years. She is one of the top 15 players in nearly every offensive category. She is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

STEFAN HENNING—CLASS OF 2003

This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. He earned three team championships at Reuther; one in basketball and two in track. He is one of the greatest basketball players to ever play at Reuther. He ranks #1 in points per game (21.9) and total points in a season (241). He has the record for most points scored in a game (30) along with more 20 or more points in a game than anyone in history. He was named to the first team all 2000's decade basketball team and is on the first team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present). In track he helped the 400 meter relay team to a 6th place finish at the county meet. At Rochester High School he played football and basketball. He starred in basketball being on the varsity all four years earning all league honors. After graduation he went to Northwood University and Rochester Christian University to play basketball.

TOMMY NAMWICHAI—CLASS OF 2003

This honoree played football and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships in track at Reuther. He is one of the greatest hurdlers in Reuther history. He earned city championships in the 55 and 200 meter hurdles. At the county meet he earned runner up in both the 55 and 200 Meter hurdle races and helped the 400 meter relay team earn 6th place. This hall of famer held the 55 meter hurdles record from 2003-2012 in a time of 8.48 seconds. In the 200 meter hurdles he currently holds the record with a time of 27.28 seconds. He has held the record since 2003; a remarkable 21 years! At Rochester High School he played soccer. He was a special athlete who left us far too soon.

HOLLY MIHELIC–CLASS OF 2003

This honoree was in cheerleading and track at Reuther. She earned two team championships at Reuther; one in cheerleading and one in track. She is one of Reuther's greatest cheerleaders. At Rochester High School she was a key member of the cheer team that won three consecutive state cheerleading championships.

DAVE SEXTON–CLASS OF 2003

This honoree played football, wrestling, and track at Reuther. He earned four team championships at Reuther; one in wrestling and three in track. In wrestling, he earned a city championship. In track he earned a city championship in the shot put. This hall of famer was a city champion in wrestling. In 2003 he was awarded the Anthony M. Mileski Award for being the school's top football player and wrestler. At Rochester High School he played football and wrestled. He earned all state honors in his weight division as he capped off his career. Later he returned to Rochester High School and helped coach the wrestling program.

ERIK WEST–CLASS OF 2003

This honoree played football, wrestling and track at Reuther. He earned four team championships at Reuther; one in wrestling and three in track. In track he won a city championship in the always tough 400 meter dash. He also helped lead the 1600 Meter Relay team to a city championship. At the county meet he won the 400 meter dash and helped the 1600 meter relay team to a 6th place finish. At Rochester High School he played football, wrestling, cross country and soccer.

CLASS OF 2004

TIARA DEAN–CLASS OF 2004

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in track at Reuther. This hall of famer earned 5th place in the 200 meter dash at the county meet. She held the 200 meter dash record with a time of 27.69 seconds from 2004-2019; a remarkable 15 years! At Rochester High School she was on the cheerleading and track teams, winning a state championship in cheerleading her junior year.

JOSH RENEL–CLASS OF 2004

This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships in track at Reuther. He won two individual city championships in track; one in the 800 meter run and one as part of the 1600 meter relay team. At the county meet he earned a 3rd place finish in the 400 meter dash; and a runner up finish in the 800 meter run. He also took part in the 6th place finish in the 1600 Meter Relay team. This hall of famer currently holds the 400 meter dash record with a time of 55.97 seconds. He has held the record since 2004; a remarkable 20 years! At Rochester Adams High School he played football and ran track. He earned all league honors in football. After graduation he would play football at Wayne State University where he played in the Division II national championship game his senior year.

MATT CAMPBELL–CLASS OF 2004

This honoree played football and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships in track at Reuther. At Rochester High School he played football, basketball, and track. This hall of famer won the league championship in the 400 meter dash and won two 400 meter dash championships at regionals. As a junior he won a county championship as part of the 800 meter relay team. He qualified for the state finals in the 400 meter dash in his senior year. He capped off his career at RHS by holding the 400 meter relay record with a time of 42.81 seconds and the 800 meter relay with a time of 1 minute 29.80 seconds. Both records have been on the board since 2008. After graduation he ran indoor and outdoor track at the University of Michigan. He was a 2 time winner of the Big 10 Sportsmanship Award in track. In his final year, he earned all American honors as part of the 1600 meter relay team at the NCAA championships.

TIFFANY ABRAHAMIAN–CLASS OF 2004

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in track at Reuther. This hall of famer earned an individual city championship in the 3200 meter run. She also took 6th place in the 3200 meter run at the county meet. At Rochester High School she ran cross country and track. She helped the Falcons win a state championship in cross country along with two regional championships. She holds the 3rd best 5000 meter run time in school history from 2007 when she ran the race in 17 minutes and 49 seconds. Individually she was all league and all county 4 times. This hall of famer she placed fourth and fifth earning all state honors twice. In those two years at the state meet she won as a junior and earned third place as a senior. In track she won the state championship in the 3200 Meter Run. She earned all American honors in the 5K race and the 4 X 1 Mile Relay. After graduation she ran cross country

and track at Michigan State University. She earned All Academic Big 10 honors multiple times in her collegiate career. She is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

CLASS OF 2005

MATT EGBERT– CLASS OF 2005

This honoree played football and track at Reuther. At the county meet he helped the 1600 meter relay team earn a 6th place finish. At the same meet he earned a 4th place finish in the 200 meter dash. He capped off his Reuther career by helping the 800 meter relay team win the county championship. This hall of famer still holds the 800 meter relay record with a time of 1 minute 41.69 seconds. The record has been held from 2005 to the present; a total of 19 remarkable years! At Rochester Adams High School and Rochester High School he played football, hockey, and track.

JOSH SPICKO–CLASS OF 2005

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in basketball at Reuther. At the county meet he helped the 1600 meter relay team earn a 6th place finish. He capped off his Reuther career by helping the 800 meter relay team win the county championship. This hall of famer still holds the 800 meter relay record with a time of 1 minute 41.69 seconds. The record has been held from 2005 to the present; a total of 19 remarkable years! At Rochester High School he played football and track.

ROBERT SMITH–CLASS OF 2005

This honoree wrestled and ran track at Reuther. He capped off his Reuther career by helping the 800 meter relay team win the county championship. This hall of famer still holds the 800 meter relay record with a time of 1 minute 41.69 seconds. The record has been held from 2005 to the present; a total of 19 remarkable years! At Rochester High School he was on the wrestling and track teams.

JOE LIDDELL–CLASS OF 2005

This honoree played basketball, wrestling, and track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in basketball at Reuther. In basketball he ranks 9th all time in scoring

average (10.7) points per game and 8th all time in points scored in a season (107). This hall of famer is one of the 30 greatest basketball players in the history of Reuther. He was named to the first team all 2000's decade basketball team and is on the second team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present). He capped off his Reuther career by helping the 800 meter relay team win the county championship. This hall of famer still holds the 800 meter relay record with a time of 1 minute 41.69 seconds. The record has been held from 2005 to the present; a total of 19 remarkable years! At Rochester High School he played basketball.

NICK KACZANOWSKI—CLASS OF 2005

This honoree played football, basketball, wrestling, and track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in basketball at Reuther. He is one of Reuther's greatest wrestlers of all time winning multiple city championships. At Rochester High School he played football and wrestling. He excelled in wrestling winning 3 individual league championships. He also earned multiple league and all regional honors. He earned all state honors his sophomore and junior seasons. This hall of famer took 6th place in his weight division as a sophomore and 2nd place in his weight division as a junior. As a senior he went undefeated in his weight class at 44-0. before falling ill the eve of districts. He finished his career as one of the greatest wrestlers at Rochester High School winning 182 matches against only 23 defeats. After graduation he went to Michigan State University to wrestle for the Spartans. He ended his career with a 54-43 record and two selections to the Big Ten's All Academic team. He is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

AMANDA SWANN—CLASS OF 2005

This honoree played basketball and volleyball at Reuther. She is one of the greatest volleyball players to ever play at Reuther. At Rochester High School she was a 4 year starter in volleyball earning all-league honors 4 times; all-district honors 3 times and all-regional honors twice. In the off season she played club volleyball at Michigan Elite, earning a reputation as one of the state's best overall players. After graduation she played volleyball at the University of Minnesota-Crookston in Division 2. She was a starter all 4 years in Minnesota earning NSIC honors during her years there. Amanda was consistently one of the team leaders in kills and blocks each season. She has returned to help coach the Rochester High School volleyball program for the past 5 seasons as well as coach travel volleyball at Unified Volleyball.

BRIANNA BOWERY—CLASS OF 2005

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She won the city championship in high jump in track. At the county meet she took 5th place in the high jump. She capped off her Reuther career by breaking the high jump record with a jump of 4 feet 10 inches. This record would stand from 2005-2007. At Rochester High School she played volleyball, basketball, and soccer. She would excel in soccer at both Rochester High School and at the club level for Bloomfield Force. She would lead RHS to the state championship game in 2007 and in 2008 lead Bloomfield Force to a championship. This hall of famer capped off her career by earning all league and all district honors. After graduation she played soccer at Division 1 Oakland University. Earning all Horizon League academic honors two years and playing in 61 career matches.

MOLLIE POZOLO—CLASS OF 2005

This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. She earned two team championships in basketball at Reuther. This hall of famer capped off her Reuther career by becoming the record holder in the 1600 meter run with a time of 5 minutes and 37.84 seconds. She would hold this record from 2004-2015; an amazing 11 years! At Rochester High School she played basketball, cross country, and track. She was part of the Falcon cross country team that won 2 regional championships, had 1 top 5 team finish and won a state championship. She earned all regional honors twice and all state honors twice. She has the 9th best time in school history in the 5000 meter run. In 2007 she ran the race in 18 minutes 22 seconds. In track she would cap off her career with an 8th place in the 3200 meter relay earning her all state honors.

ALLISON PAVLOFF—CLASS OF 2005

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She earned two team championships in basketball at Reuther. She won an individual city championship in track in the 800 meter run. At the county meet she took 4th place in the 800 meter run. This hall of famer capped off her Reuther career by becoming the record holder in the 800 meter run with a time of 2 minutes 31.25 seconds. The record was held from 2005-2013; an impressive 8 years. At Rochester High School she played basketball, volleyball, cross country and track. She was part of the Falcon cross country team that won two regional championships, had one top 5 team finish and won a state championship.

NICK SHAFKALIS—CLASS OF 2005

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in basketball at Reuther. This hall of famer is one of the 30 greatest basketball players in the history of Reuther. He was named to the first team all 2000's decade basketball team and is on the second team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present). He capped off his Reuther career by helping the 1600 meter relay team earn a 6th place finish at the county meet. At Rochester High School he played football, basketball, and track. After graduation he went to Penn State-Allegheny to play basketball.

CLASS OF 2006

MEAGAN HEIDEN—CLASS OF 2006

This honoree played basketball at Reuther. She earned two team championships in basketball at Reuther. This hall of famer is one of the greatest basketball players to ever play in the school. She led her team to an undefeated 12-0 season in 8th grade. At Rochester High School she continued to play and excel in basketball helping her team to multiple championships. After graduation she earned a scholarship and played basketball at Rochester Christian University.

MOLLY IRVINE—CLASS OF 2006

This honoree played basketball and volleyball at Reuther. She earned three team championships; one in volleyball and two in basketball. She was part of the 8th grade basketball team that went undefeated at 12-0. This hall of famer is one of the greatest volleyball players to ever play in the school. At Rochester High School she played basketball and volleyball. She earned all league honors in volleyball and was one of the greatest outside hitters in school history. After graduation she went to Oakland Community College where she led the team in attacks and kills at her outside hitter position.

ASHLEY KEYES—CLASS OF 2006

This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in basketball. She was part of the 8th grade basketball team that went undefeated at 12-0. At Rochester High School she played basketball and track. In basketball she was part of championship teams. It was in the sport of track where she excelled. At Rochester High School she was the queen of speed as she dominated the 100 meter dash. She earned all league, all area, all county honors three times and was

named all state 3 times. She finished in 8th place, 2nd place and was the state champion in the 100 meter dash her final three years of high school. This hall of famer also was on the state champion 400 meter relay team and took 5th and 6th place in the long jump in consecutive years. She has the school record in the 100 meter dash (12.0 seconds) since 2009 and held the long jump record (18 feet $\frac{3}{4}$ inches) from 2009-2023. After graduation she went to Syracuse University where she ran track. At Syracuse she ran both indoor and outdoor track playing a key role in the 60 meter, 100 meter, 200 meter, 300 meter dashes and the long jump. She is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

CLASS OF 2007

CADY POZOLO–CLASS OF 2007

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, cheerleading, and track. She earned one team championship in track. At Rochester High School she played volleyball, basketball, cross country and track. She helped her team win championships in basketball and track. In 2009 she was a key member of the state championship track team. This hall of famer was on the 3200 meter relay team that took 8th place and the following year was the state champion 3200 meter relay team earning all state honors both years. She capped off her career by earning a record in the 3200 meter relay (9 minutes 5.45 seconds). The record was set in 2010 and still stands today!

ERIN LEPPEK–CLASS OF 2007

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in track. She is one of the greatest volleyball players in Reuther history. The #7 volleyball jersey is retired. She was city champion in the 1600 meter run and High Jump. At the county meet she earned a 3rd place in the high jump, a 5th place in the 200 meter hurdles, and 5th in the high jump. This hall of famer is the queen of the high jump. She tied the high jump record of 4 feet 10 inches in 2006. In 2007 she set the record again with a jump of 5 feet 0 inches. This record still stands today; a remarkable 17 years later! At Rochester High School she played volleyball, basketball, and track. As an outside hitter she earned all league honors three times, all region honors three times, all state honors once, and was named Under Armour honorable mention all America team. She led her club volleyball team to a national championship and a top 5 national finish at the AAU finals. In track she earned all state honors in four different events. She was a part of the 8th place 3200 meter relay team and then the next year became part of the state champion 3200 meter relay team. She also placed in

the 800 meter relay team (7th place), 1600 meter relay team (8th place) and the long jump (8th place). This hall of famer helped the Falcons win the track state championship in 2010. She capped off her career by earning three records in the 800 meter relay (1 minute 43.61 seconds), the 1600 meter relay (3 minutes 58.91 seconds), and the 3200 meter relay (9 minutes 5.45 seconds). All three records were set in 2010 and still stand today! After graduating from Rochester High School she went to the University of Iowa to play volleyball. With the Hawkeyes she played outside hitter for 91 matches. At Iowa she earned all academic Big 10 honors her final three years. She is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

CLASS OF 2008

EMILY LEPPEK—CLASS OF 2008

This honoree played basketball, cheerleading, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She earned three team championships at Reuther; one in basketball and two in track. She earned a city championship in the long jump and as part of the 800 meter relay team. At the county meet she earned 5th place in the long jump and was part of the 5th place 400 meter relay team. She capped off her track career by setting a record in the 800 meter relay with a time of 1 minute 56.94 seconds. This record was on the board from 2008-2011. At Rochester High School she was a cheerleader and ran track. She was on the state championship 400 meter relay team in 2010 and took 7th place in the 800 meter relay, earning all state honors in both. She capped off her career by earning two records in the 800 meter relay (1 minute 43.61 seconds) and the 1600 meter relay (3 minutes 58.91 seconds). Both records were set in 2010 and still stand today! She is a member of the Rochester High School Hall of Fame.

DEANDRE BRIDGES—CLASS OF 2008

This honoree played football and basketball at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in football and one in basketball. He is one of the greatest point guards to ever play the position at Reuther. In football he was an integral part of a high potent offense by leading the team in rushing yards. This hall of famer is one of the 30 greatest basketball players in the history of Reuther. He was named to the second team all 2000's decade basketball team and is on the third team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present). At Rochester High School he played basketball before moving to Lake Orion. At Lake Orion High School he

played football and basketball. In his junior year he played a key role in the school winning the Division 1 Football State Championship.

ANTHONY KYLES–CLASS OF 2008

This honoree played football and basketball at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in football and one in basketball. He is one of the greatest overall offensive and defensive basketball players in school history. In football he played an important role in the offense by leading the team in receiving yards. In basketball he ranks 8th all time in scoring average (10.9) points per game and 10th all time in points scored in a season (109). This hall of famer is one of the 30 greatest basketball players in the history of Reuther. He was named to the first team all 2000's decade basketball team and is on the second team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present).

ANDREW SHAFKALIS–CLASS OF 2008

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned one team championship at Reuther in basketball. When you define “glue guy” in basketball this hall of famer is the definition. He did all of the little things to help the team win a championship. At Rochester High School he played football and basketball before moving to Lake Orion. At Lake Orion High School he played football and basketball earning all league honors in football. In his junior year he recovered a fumble inside the 10 yard line keeping the opposition from scoring the winning points in the state semi-finals. If he doesn't make this play, Lake Orion is not in a position to win the Division 1 Football State Championship, which his team ultimately won!

CLASS OF 2009

JOEY GUNTHER–CLASS OF 2009

This honoree played football and wrestling at Reuther. He earned a city championship at Reuther. He capped off his career at Reuther by winning the County Championship in 2009. At Rochester High School he played soccer and wrestling. After graduating from Rochester High School he would return to Reuther to help coach the program.

JOSH WOOD–CLASS OF 2009

This honoree played football and wrestling at Reuther. He earned a city championship at Reuther. He capped off his career at Reuther by winning the County Championship in 2009. At Rochester High School he excelled in wrestling. In his junior and senior seasons, he won a district championship and as a senior qualified for the state meet where he finished in 8th place in his weight division earning him all state honors. He would later return to Rochester High School and help coach the wrestling program.

MONJOA LIKINE—CLASS OF 2009

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She earned a team championship in track at Reuther. She won two individual city championships in track for the 70 meter dash and was part of the 400 meter relay team. At the county meet, she helped the 400 meter relay team to a 5th place finish. The next year she helped lead the 400 meter relay team to a county championship. To cap off her career she earned a school record in the 400 meter relay team with a time of 53.86 seconds. This record was held from 2009-2019; an amazing 10 years. At Rochester High School this hall of famer ran track and was on the cheer team.

STEPHANIE SIKORSKI—CLASS OF 2009

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She earned two team championships; one in basketball and one in track at Reuther. She won two individual city championships in track as part of the 800 and 400 meter relay teams. At the county meet she took 4th and 5th place in the long jump and helped lead the 400 meter relay team to a county championship. To cap off her career she earned a school record in the 400 meter relay team with a time of 53.86 seconds. This record was held from 2009-2019; an amazing 10 years. This hall of famer was also one of the greatest setters for the volleyball team in school history. At Rochester High School she played basketball and volleyball. It was volleyball though that she excelled at. She earned all league honors and all region honors twice and was nominated for all state honors in her senior year. She was recognized as one of Rochester High School's greatest setters. After graduation from Rochester High School she played volleyball at Ferris State University. It was here where this hall of famer took her game to a new level. She immediately started as a setter for the Bulldogs and led the team to the Elite 8. As a sophomore she led her team to the GLIAC (league) championship, another NCAA tournament bid, and earned all league honors. In her junior campaign she led the team again to a league championship and a trip to the NCAA regional finals. She also earned all league honors and All American honors. In her final campaign she led her team to a league championship, earned all league and All American honors to cap off her career as one of Ferris State's greatest volleyball players.

JESSICA SMITH—CLASS OF 2009

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She earned a team championship in track at Reuther. She won two individual city championships in track as part of the 800 meter relay and 400 meter relay teams. At the county meet she helped lead the 1600 meter relay team to an 8th place finish and the 400 meter relay team to a county championship. To cap off her career she earned a school record in the 400 meter relay team with a time of 53.86 seconds. This record was held from 2009-2019; an amazing 10 years. At Rochester High School she ran cross country and track.

SARAH EGBERT—CLASS OF 2009

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track. She earned two team championships; one in basketball and one in track at Reuther. She won two individual championships in track as part of the 800 meter relay and 400 meter relay teams. At the county meet she earned 7th place in the 100 meter dash. She also helped the 400 meter relay team to a 5th place finish in 2008. The following year she helped lead the 400 meter relay team to a county championship. To cap off her career she earned a school record in the 400 meter relay team with a time of 53.86 seconds. This record was held from 2009-2019; an amazing 10 years. At Rochester High School she played volleyball and ran track.

BLAKE POZOLO—CLASS OF 2009

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. At the county meet he earned the county championship in the 1600 meter run. He capped off his career at Reuther by running only the second sub 5 minute 1600 meter run time with a 4 minutes 59.18 seconds. In 2009 he won the Coach Bob Babiarz award given to the team's top distance runner. At Rochester High School he played soccer, basketball, cross country and track. He owns the 8th best 5000 meter time in Rochester High School Cross Country history with a time of 15 minutes and 43 seconds set in 2011. He set this time at the state finals in 2012 as he finished in 25th place; good enough for All State honors. In track, he earned 8th place in the 3200 meter run in 2012; good enough for All State honors.

CLASS OF 2010

AARON MORGAN–CLASS OF 2010

This honoree played football, basketball, and wrestling at Reuther. He won a city championship in wrestling. At the 2010 county meet he won the county championship in his weight division. This hall of famer was a city champion in wrestling. In 2010 he was awarded the Anthony M. Mileski Award for being the school's top football player and wrestler. At Rochester High School he played football and wrestling. As a sophomore he earned a district championship and qualified for the state finals where he took 8th place earning all state honors. This hall of famer would return to Reuther to help coach the wrestling program.

CLASS OF 2011

DAYNA PIENTA–CLASS OF 2011

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in track at Reuther. This hall of famer is one of the sprinters in school history. She won two individual city championships; one in the 200 meter dash and one in the 400 meter dash. At the county meet she earned 3rd place in the 400 meter dash and helped lead the 1600 meter relay team to an 8th place finish. She capped off her Reuther career by setting the 800 meter relay records with a time of 1 minute 56.13 seconds. The record was set in 2011 and lasted until 2019; 8 impressive years. The other record she broke was the 400 meter dash with a time of 1 minute 2.23 seconds. The record was set in 2011 and is still on the board an amazing 13 years later! At Rochester High School she played basketball and ran track.

ERIC GILGENBACH–CLASS OF 2011

This honoree played football and basketball at Reuther. He earned one team championship in basketball at Reuther. In basketball he ranks 6th all time in scoring average (11.3) points per game and 6th all time in points scored in a season (124). He scored a season high 16 points during his championship season. This hall of famer is one of the 30 greatest basketball players in the history of Reuther. He was named to the first team all 2010's decade basketball team and is on the first team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present). At Stoney Creek High School he played football, basketball, and baseball. He was on the varsity basketball and baseball teams all four years. He earned all league honors in basketball and multiple times in baseball. He capped off his career at Stoney Creek by winning district championships in basketball and three consecutive district titles in baseball. In baseball he earned all

district and all regional honors for three years along with earning all state honors in baseball once. As a senior he was ranked the top third baseman in Michigan and the state's overall number seven ranked player. After graduation he went to play baseball at the University of Notre Dame. At Notre Dame he helped lead his team to the ACC championship game along with earning all league honors. He capped his career by hitting .370 and driving in key runs in a shortened COVID season and earned a fourth all ACC academic team award.

MICAH BRADFORD—CLASS OF 2011

This honoree played basketball, and track. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in basketball and one in track. He earned two individual city championships in track. One in the 400 meter dash and one in the 400 meter relay team. At the county meet, this hall of famer earned 8th place in the 400 meter run and the 400 meter relay team. He capped off his career at Reuther by helping the 400 meter relay team claim the record with a time of 48.62 seconds. The record was set in 2011 and still stands 13 amazing years later. At Rochester High School he played basketball and ran track.

MIKE HALSEY—CLASS OF 2011

This honoree played football, basketball, and track. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in basketball and one in track. He earned one individual city championship in track helping the 400 meter relay team. At the county meet he helped his team earn 8th place in the 400 meter relay team. He capped off his career by claiming two records in track. He earned recognition in the high jump with a record 5 feet 6.5 inches. He has had this record since 2011. An amazing 13 years! His other record was in helping the 400 meter relay team set a record in the 400 meter relay team with a time of 48.62 seconds. This record has been on the board since 2011; an amazing 13 years! At Rochester High School he played football, basketball, and baseball.

MARQUIS FOGLE—CLASS OF 2011

This honoree played football, wrestling, and track at Reuther. He earned two team championships at Reuther; one in wrestling and one in track. He earned a city championship in wrestling in his weight division and was crowned county champion in 2011. He earned one individual city championship helping the 400 meter relay team. At the county meet he helped his team earn 8th place in the 400 meter relay team. He helped the 400 meter relay team set a record with a time of 48.62 seconds. This record

has been on the board since 2011; an amazing 13 years! At Rochester High School he played basketball. This hall of famer then moved to Virginia where he played football and also became a standout wrestler. He earned all state honors by taking 7th place in the 170 lb. division. He won 117 matches in his high school career.

NEBOJSA POPOVIC–CLASS OF 2011

This honoree ran track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in track at Reuther. He earned two individual city championships in track; one in long jump and one in helping the 400 meter relay team. At the county meet he helped his team earn 8th place in the 400 meter relay team. He also took 2nd place in the 200 meter dash and 3rd place in the long jump. He capped off his career by claiming two records in track. He earned recognition in the long jump with a record 19 feet 5 inches. He broke a 31 year record by 1 foot! He also helped the 400 meter relay team set a record with a time of 48.62 seconds. This record has been on the board since; 2011; an amazing 13 years! At Rochester High School he played soccer and track. He was one of the leading scorers in soccer. At the same time he played club soccer for Vardar winning 3 state championships. In 2015 he was called up to play on the U-20 national team. In track at Rochester High School he ran the 100 and 200 meter dashes and was part of the 400 and 800 meter relay teams. He earned all regional honors in 2014 in the 100 meter dash; earning 7th place in the finals along with the 400 meter relay team earning 7th place in the finals. After graduation he would go play soccer, first at Oakland University and then his final year at the University of Michigan. In 2018 he earned all league and all regional honors while being recognized as an academic All American. At Michigan he earned first team all Big 10 honors as a graduate student as was the conference Offensive Player of the Year in 2019.

CLASS OF 2012

DAVID HOFFMAN–CLASS OF 2012

This honoree played football and track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in track at Reuther. At the county meet he earned 4th place in the 200 Meter Hurdles and 8th place in the 55 Meter Hurdles. He is one of Reuther's greatest hurdlers. He holds the 55 meter hurdles record with a time of 8.37 seconds. This record has stood since 2012; a remarkable 12 years! At Rochester High School he played football, wrestling and track.

RYAN MORGAN—CLASS OF 2012

This honoree played football, basketball and wrestling at Reuther. He excelled in wrestling at Reuther being only one of two wrestlers in school history to win multiple county championships; earning that feat in 2011 and 2012. He would lead the Crusaders wrestling team to second place runner up at the county championships. At Rochester High School he played football and wrestling. In his senior year he won district and regional championships and was state runner up in his weight class. He earned all state honors as a member of the Falcon wrestling team. He would later return to Rochester High School and Reuther to help coach the wrestling program.

GABRIELLA LEO—CLASS OF 2012

This honoree played volleyball, cheerleading, and ran track at Reuther. She earned two team championships at Reuther; one in competitive cheerleading and one in track. She is one of the great hurdlers and cheerleaders in Reuther history. She earned a city championship in the 55 meter hurdles in 2012 and followed it up with a 5th place finish in the same event at the county meet. This hall of famer capped off her career by earning the school record in the 55 meter hurdles with a time of 9.18 seconds. She has held this record since 2012; a remarkable 12 years! At Rochester High School she ran track and was a key member of the cheerleading teams. She capped off her career helping the Falcons win the state championship in 2016.

BREONNA WEAVER—CLASS OF 2012

This honoree played volleyball, cheerleading, and ran track at Reuther. She earned two team championships at Reuther; one in competitive cheerleading and one in track. She is one of the greatest hurdlers and cheerleaders in Reuther history. She earned a city championship in the 70 meter dash in 2012 and at the county meet she earned 4th place in the 55 Meter Hurdles. At Rochester High School she ran track and was a key member of the cheerleading teams. She capped off her career helping the Falcons win the state championship in 2016.

BAILEY THOMAS—CLASS OF 2012

This honoree played basketball and volleyball at Reuther. She was one of the greatest point guards to play the position at Reuther. She went on to play at Birmingham Marian High School where she led her school to two league, three district and three regional championships. In her sophomore and junior years she was the catalyst in leading the team to consecutive state championships. In 2014 she was invited to participate in the

U17 USA Basketball Team Trials. She earned all league honors for three years and was an all state selection her junior year. Then she moved to Las Vegas starring for Centennial High School. The result: another state championship! After graduation this hall of famer would play basketball at West Virginia University for one season before making the decision to come back home and play for the University of Nevada at Las Vegas Running Rebels. She would lead the team in assists and steals during her stellar career. She would be named the Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Year her junior and senior seasons.

CLASS OF 2013

JASNEET AULAKH—CLASS OF 2013

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She was a solid distance runner for the Crusaders and capped off her career owning the school record in the 3200 Meter Relay Team. Her time of 11 minutes 9.76 seconds was on the board from 2013-2024; a remarkable 11 years! At Rochester High School she ran cross country, track and was on the swim team.

ANNA DEAN—CLASS OF 2013

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She was a solid distance runner for the Crusaders and capped off her career owning the school record in the 3200 Meter Relay Team. Her time of 11 minutes 9.76 seconds was on the board from 2013-2024; a remarkable 11 years! At Rochester High School she was on the volleyball and golf teams.

LAUREN KALISZEWSKI—CLASS OF 2013

This honoree ran track at Reuther. She was a key member of the distance team for the Crusaders. In the county meet she took 8th place in the 3200 Meter Run. This hall of famer capped off her career owning the school record in the 3200 Meter Relay Team. Her time of 11 minutes 9.76 seconds was on the board from 2013-2024; a remarkable 11 years! In 2012 and 2013 she won the Coach Bob Babiarz award given to the team's top distance runner. She is the school's only 2 time winner of this award! At Rochester High School she became a key member of the cross country and track teams. She earned all regional honors in Cross Country all four years. Was a multiple MVP of both the cross country and track teams. After graduation she went to Michigan State University where she was on both the cross country and track teams for the Spartans.

MADISON PAYNE–CLASS OF 2013

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in basketball at Reuther. She was one of the greatest distance runners ever at Reuther. In the county meet she took 5th place in the 800 meter run. This hall of famer capped off her career owning two school records. The first in the 3200 Meter Relay Team. Her time of 11 minutes 9.76 seconds was on the board from 2013-2024; a remarkable 11 years! Just as remarkable, this hall of famer owns the 800 Meter Run record with a time of 2 minutes 28.50 seconds. The record is still on the board! At Rochester High School she was a key member of the cross country and track teams.

SAMANTHA THOMAS–CLASS OF 2013

This honoree played basketball and volleyball at Reuther. She earned one team championship in basketball at Reuther. She is one of the greatest basketball players to ever play at Reuther. She earned one team championship in basketball at Reuther. She went on to play at Birmingham Marian High School where she led her school to two league, three district and three regional championships. In her freshman and sophomore years she was a key ingredient in leading the team to consecutive state championships. She earned all league honors for two years and was a two time all state selection. Then she moved to Las Vegas starring for Centennial High School. The result: another state championship in her junior year. In her senior campaign she would be rated as the #1 player in the state. After graduation this hall of famer would play basketball at the University of Arizona earning PAC 10 Freshman of the Year out of the gates. She would become one of the greatest all around players in school history as she was on the all PAC 10 defensive team three years and was all PAC 10 for two seasons. She was an academic all American in her final two seasons and led the Wildcats to a national runner up finish at the NCAA finals. After graduation she would play for the Phoenix Mercury of the WNBA.

CLASS OF 2014

LOGAN TUCK–CLASS OF 2014

This honoree played football and wrestling at Reuther. He excelled in wrestling at Reuther helping the team to a runner up finish in 2012 at the county championships. The next year in 2013 he capped off his career with a county championship.

KY'REN CUNNINGHAM—CLASS OF 2014

This honoree played basketball, wrestling, and track at Reuther. In basketball he was named to the second team all decade team for the 2010's. In track, at the county meet he earned second place in the 200 meter dash and third place in the 100 meter dash. He went to Orchard Lake St. Mary's High School where he excelled in football and track. In football he was the leading running back for the Eagles helping them win three consecutive district, regional and state championships. This hall of famer caught the game winning touchdown in the 2016 Division 2 championship game defeating Muskegon 29-28. In his senior season he would go on to claim all state honors in football. In track and field he ran the 100, 200, and participated in the 400 and 800 meter relay teams. His teams won back to back team championships in 2015 and 2016 while he earned individual championships twice in the 800 meter relay in 2015 and 2016. He capped off his career by helping break the school record in the 800 meter relay with a time of 1 minute 27.47 seconds. After graduation this hall of famer went to Duquesne University to play football. After three seasons at Duquesne he would transfer back home to Davenport University where he would finish out his career at the running back position.

CLASS OF 2016

JADE THOMAS—CLASS OF 2016

This honoree played basketball at Reuther. She earned one team championship in basketball at Reuther. In her 8th grade year she moved to Las Vegas where she continued to play basketball at Centennial High School. She continued her winning ways helping her basketball team to four consecutive state championships between 2015 and 2018. In the 2018 final, she helped her team overcome a 15 point fourth quarter deficit by hitting a 3 pointer as time expired in regulation, sending the game to overtime where Centennial won the game convincingly in the extra session. She would earn academic all state honors four times and be named all state her senior season. After graduation she stayed close to home and would play basketball at the University of Nevada Las Vegas. She would earn all Mountain West conference freshman team honors and play a second year until an injury would sideline her.

RIELEE FETTY—CLASS OF 2016

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in basketball at Reuther. She excelled in track where she helped the

1600 mile relay team to an 8th place finish at the county meet. At the same county meet in 2015, she had a second place finish in the 1600 meter run. She capped off her career at Reuther by breaking the 1600 meter run record with a time of 5 minutes 31.73 seconds. A record that still stands today! In 2015 she won the Coach Bob Babiarz award given to the team's top distance runner. She moved to Clarkston in her 8th grade year where she continued to shine in track, winning the county meet in the 800 meter run, and helped her 3200 meter relay team to a fourth place finish. At Clarkston High School she played volleyball, basketball, and soccer. She excelled in soccer not only for her high school team but also for the club team where she won multiple championships. For Clarkston, she earned all league and all district honors. After graduation she went on to play soccer at the University of Iowa. She would be a steady force for the Hawkeyes playing in all of her team's games and earning academic All Big 10 honors twice.

CLASS OF 2017

JADEN JACKSON–CLASS OF 2017

This honoree ran track at Reuther. He is the greatest sprinter of all time at the school. This hall of famer would win five individual city championships; two in the 70 meter dash; two in the 100 meter dash; and one in the 200 meter dash. At the county meet over a two year period he would continue his dominance over the rest of the field. In 2017 he would earn fourth place in the 70 meter dash and fifth place in the 100 meter dash. He put it all together in 2018 as he won the county championship in the 70 meter and 200 meter dashes. He narrowly missed a third championship in the 100 meter dash finishing in second place only one one-hundredths of a second behind. He capped off his brilliant Reuther track career by holding two records. The 70 meter dash with a time of 8.13 seconds and the 200 meter dash with a time of 23.03 seconds. He has held both records since 2017. These records are impressive as the 70 meter dash record was held from 1978-2017; a remarkable 39 years and the 200 meter dash record was held from 1985-2018; an amazing 33 years! He ran AAU track during high school and capped off his career earning runner up twice in the 55 meter and 60 meter dashes in the National Indoor U16 championships in New York and Kentucky. He is the king and the greatest sprinter in the history of Reuther track!

CLASS OF 2018

TYLER SWENSON–CLASS OF 2018

This honoree played football and wrestling at Reuther. He won the county wrestling championship in his weight division in 2018. At Rochester High School he played football and wrestling. After graduation he has come back to help coach the Reuther wrestling program.

CLASS OF 2019

SARA ROBINSON–CLASS OF 2019

This honoree played volleyball and track at Reuther. She is one of the best overall volleyball players Reuther has ever had. While she played at Reuther and in high school she continued to excel for her teams in club volleyball. At Rochester High School she played volleyball and lacrosse where she was named captain of both teams her senior season. She helped her team win a league championship in 2022. She earned all league honors for her play at the end of the 2022 season. After graduation she was recruited by Michigan State University to be a part of their crew team.

NATALIE RAYCE–CLASS OF 2019

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She earned three individual city championships in track. One for the 200 meter dash and two as a member of the 800 meter relay team. At the county meet she took 8th place in the 800 meter relay. This hall of famer capped off her career by breaking two records. The first record was in the 800 meter relay team with a time of 1 minute 56.00 seconds in 2018 and then broke it again in 2019 with a time of 1 minute 55.38 seconds. In 2019 she was part of the 400 meter relay that broke the record with a time of 53.64 seconds. Both records recently came off of the board in 2023. In 2019 she earned the Coach Mark Lane Award as the team's outstanding sprinter. At Rochester High School she played volleyball, basketball, and soccer. She was a starter for all three sports. This hall of famer, however, excelled in soccer. In addition to playing for her high school team, she also played club volleyball for the Liverpool team. She earned all league honors all four years and earned all state honors her final three years with the Falcons. This hall of famer capped off her career at RHS by being named to the All State Dream Team as selected by the Michigan High School Coaches Association. This hall of famer led her team to consecutive league titles her final two years and to a state semi final run her junior year. After graduation she went to Carnegie Mellon University to play soccer. She finished freshman campaign as the team's second leading scorer.

MARION BRUMER–CLASS OF 2019

This honoree was a cheerleader, played volleyball and ran track at Reuther. She earned two individual city championships in track. One in the 70 meter dash and one as part of the 800 meter relay team. At the county meet she took fourth place in the 70 meter dash and helped the 800 meter relay team earn an 8th place finish. This hall of famer capped off her career by breaking two records. The first record was in the 800 meter relay team with a time of 1 minute 56.00 seconds in 2018 and then broke it again in 2019 with a time of 1 minute 55.38 seconds. In 2019 she was part of the 400 meter relay that broke the record with a time of 53.64 seconds. Both records recently came off of the board in 2023. In 2019 she earned the Coach Mark Lane Award as the team's outstanding sprinter. At Rochester High School she played volleyball and ran track.

JACK YANACHIK–CLASS OF 2019

This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. He excelled in basketball where he was named first team all decade for the 2010's. In basketball he ranks 4th all time in scoring average (12.9) points per game and 4th all time in points scored in a season (158). He scored a season high 18 points during 8th grade season. This hall of famer is one of the 30 greatest basketball players in the history of Reuther. He was named to the first team all 2010's decade basketball team and is on the second team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present). He went on to Warren De La Salle Collegiate Prep where he played football and basketball. In football he played wide receiver and caught many touchdown passes his final two seasons where the team won state championships in 2021 and 2022. He earned all region honors his senior year in football and holds the school record for career receptions (90) and yards receiving (1,384). In basketball he played on the wing and helped his team win a state championship in 2022. After graduation this hall of famer would go to Michigan State University and play wide receiver on the football team. He is beginning his second season with the Spartans.

CLASS OF 2020

FRANCESCA MINOUS–CLASS OF 2020

This honoree played basketball and track at Reuther. She earned two individual city championships in track. One in the 200 meter dash and one as part of the 800 meter

relay team. At the county meet she helped her team to an 8th grade finish in the 800 meter relay and an 8th place finish in the 200 meter dash. She capped off her career by breaking two school records. Our hall of famer is one of a few people in Reuther history to have 2 or more track records at the same time. The first record was in the 200 meter dash where she broke the record with a time of 27.52 seconds. The second record was the 800 meter relay that was broken in 2019 with a time of 1 minute 55.38 seconds. The relay record and the 200 meter dash records would hold for 4 years. She went on to Rochester Adams and Rochester High School where she would participate in track and swimming. This hall of famer is graduating from Rochester High School this spring with the RHS class of 2024.

BILLY ROBERSON II—CLASS OF 2020

This honoree played football and basketball at Reuther. He was described by his football coach as a dominant player on the field and a leader that made his teammates better. He led the team at the quarterback position in rushing and passing—a dual threat. He would move to Lake Orion High School where he would excel in football. As a senior, he led the Dragons to an undefeated season and earned all league, all region, and all state honors. Included in these honors is he is one of the top 10 football players in the state of Michigan according to MLive. His varsity football coach (Chris Bell) at Lake Orion calls him the best running back in school history. He helped lead the team to its first OAA Red Division title in more than 10 years. In his final two seasons he rushed for over 2,700 yards and scored 36 touchdowns. After graduation this spring he will play football at Howard University.

CLASS OF 2021

KIELY ROBINSON—CLASS OF 2021

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and track at Reuther. She was one of the school's greatest basketball players. She earned one city championship in the sport of basketball in 2020. Against West, she scored 20 of the team's 24 points as Reuther went on to capture the city championship in the team's final game. In 2021 she earned the Coach Mark Lane Award as the team's outstanding sprinter. At Rochester High School she plays basketball and soccer. She was an all league performer in basketball but soccer is where she excels. This hall of famer has been a starter her first three years in varsity soccer where she helped get her team to the state semis her freshman year and the district final her sophomore year. This year's Lady Falcons are ranked in the top 20 in the state of Michigan. In her club soccer season she has earned all

Midwest conference honors the past two seasons. She is currently being recruited by Division 1, 2, and 3 colleges to play soccer after graduation. Our hall of famer is preparing for senior year at Rochester High School.

CLASS OF 2023

BRADY LINDSTROM–CLASS OF 2023

This honoree played football, basketball, and track at Reuther. He earned one team championship in football at Reuther in 2022. In football he led his team in rushing and passing as they won the school's first city championship since 2016. In basketball he ranks 7th all time in scoring average (11.1) points per game and 7th all time in points scored in a season (122). He scored a season high 23 points during his 8th grade season. This hall of famer is one of the 30 greatest basketball players in the history of Reuther. He was named to the first team all 2010's decade basketball team and is on the second team All Time team in basketball in the middle school era (1987-present). In track he consistently jumped in the 16-17 foot range making him one of Reuther's greatest long jumpers in history. The sport that our hall of famer excels most in is baseball. He plays travel baseball with the Las Vegas Warriors and is a pitcher and shortstop. At Adams High School he plays football, basketball, and baseball. He is getting ready for his sophomore year and will play travel baseball this summer.

KASSIE NICHOLAS–CLASS OF 2023

This honoree was in cheerleading and track at Reuther. She earned one championship in competitive cheerleading in 2023 at Reuther. At the county meet she earned an individual championship as part of the record setting 800 meter relay team. She capped off her career by setting two records. One in the 800 meter relay with a time of 1 minute 53.56 seconds and the second one in the 400 meter relay with a time of 53.40 seconds. Both records came in 2023. In 2023 she earned the Coach Mark Lane Award as the team's outstanding sprinter. At Rochester High School she is on the varsity sideline and competitive cheer team and on the varsity track team. She is getting reading for her sophomore year.

IMANI MORGAN–CLASS OF 2023

This honoree ran track at Reuther. At the county meet she earned an individual championship as part of the record setting 800 meter relay team. She capped off her career by setting three records. One in the 800 meter relay with a time of 1 minute

53.56 seconds and the second one in the 400 meter relay with a time of 53.40 seconds. Both records came in 2023. In 2022, she set her third record in the 200 meter dash with a time of 26.66 seconds. This hall of famer is only 1 of 2 people in school history with 3 records on the track board at the same time. In 2023 she earned the Coach Mark Lane Award as the team's outstanding sprinter. At Rochester High School she plays basketball and runs track. She is getting ready for her sophomore year.

AUBREY WILSON—CLASS OF 2023

This honoree played basketball and ran track at Reuther. At the city meet she earned two individual championships in the 70 and 200 meter dashes. At the county meet she earned a third place finish in the 100 meter dash, a county championship in the 70 meter dash, and a championship as part of the record setting 800 meter relay team. She capped off her career by setting three records. One in the 800 meter relay with a time of 1 minute 53.56 seconds and the second one in the 400 meter relay with a time of 53.40 seconds. The third record came in the 70 meter dash as she ran a time of 8.84. This broke the old record of 9.10 seconds that had been held since 1982 by hall of famer, Lisa Rotondo. This hall of famer is the queen of speed and she is the greatest female sprinter in Reuther history! In 2023 she earned the Coach Mark Lane Award as the team's outstanding sprinter. At Dearborn Divine Child High School she plays basketball and is playing a key role on the varsity track team. Currently she holds the 60 meter, 100 meter, and 200 meter dash records at Dearborn Divine Child High School as a freshman! At regionals she captured 3 individual championships in the 100 and 200 meter dashes along with the 400 meter relay. As a freshman led her team to the state championship where she earned All State honors in 4 events (State Champion in the 100 meter dash, 2nd in the 800 relay, 5th in the 400 relay, and 2nd in the 200 meter dash). Our hall of famer is now preparing for her sophomore year at Dearborn Divine Child High School.

CLASS OF 2024

ALLYSON PARSONS—CLASS OF 2024

This honoree played basketball, volleyball, and ran track at Reuther. At the county meet she earned an individual championship as part of the record setting 800 meter relay team. She capped off her career by setting two records. One in the 800 meter relay with a time of 1 minute 53.56 seconds and the second one in the 400 meter relay with a time of 53.40 seconds. Both records came in 2023. She is currently one of the captains of the Lady Crusader track team and is running the 400 meter dash and is part

of the sprint relay teams. She was awarded at the school's Memorial Day assembly the first ever Amanda K. Crowell Athletic Leadership Award. This hall of famer is preparing for her freshman year at Rochester High School.

JONATAN SZAWIELA—CLASS OF 2024

This honoree played football, basketball, wrestling, and track at Reuther. He was a “glue” guy for both the football and basketball teams as he used his quickness and strength to help the team in any role that he was needed. He excelled in wrestling though. In addition to being one of the greatest wrestlers in Reuther history he also is one of the state's top club wrestlers. In March of 2024 he participated in the MYWAY Wrestling State Championships. He earned state runner up in his weight class. At Reuther these past two seasons he has gone undefeated in his weight class and has won back to back county championships. Only Hall of Famer Ryan Morgan (2011-2012) has performed such a feat. Currently on the track team, he is helping lead the team as one of the strongest hurdlers. At the city meet he earned an individual championship in the 200 meter hurdles. At the Memorial Day Assembly he won the 25th Annual Anthony M. Mileski award given to the school's top football and wrestling athlete. This hall of famer is preparing for his freshman year at Rochester High School.

OWEN TROMBLEY—CLASS OF 2024

This honoree ran cross country, played basketball and ran track at Reuther. He was the team's point guard in basketball and scored a season high 16 points in a victory against Troy Smith. In cross country he holds the 8th grade record and the overall boys records with a 2 mile time of 11 minutes 24.30 seconds. In track he won two individual city championships in the 800 meter and 1600 meter runs. At the city meet he beat Brett Jones 22 year 1600 Meter Run record by running in a time of 4 minutes 56.99 seconds! He won the 2024 Coach Bob Babiarz Distance Award for the school's best distance runner. At the county meet he took 5th place in the 1600 meter run breaking his own record. This hall of famer is preparing for his freshman year at Rochester High School.

CLASS OF 2025

AIDEN FEARNLEY—CLASS OF 2025

This honoree played football and wrestled at Reuther. He turned in a very impressive performance as a 7th grader by winning the 2024 county championship in wrestling at

his weight division. This hall of famer wrestles year round in trying to achieve his best in the sport. This level of commitment is appreciated by his coaches and teammates. He is preparing to repeat his success and leading the football and wrestling teams as an 8th grader next year.

ARYANA GIVANS–CLASS OF 2025

This honoree ran cross country, played volleyball, and ran track at Reuther. She earned one team championship in volleyball in 2024. In cross country she holds the 7th grade and overall girls records with a 2 mile time of 12 minutes 45.10 seconds. In track she earned 2nd place in the 1600 meter run and a 2nd place finish as part of the 3200 meter relay team at the city meet. As part of the 3200 meter relay team, she currently holds the record that was held for 11 years with a new time of 11 minutes 9.08 seconds. She won the 2024 Coach Bob Babiarz Distance Award for the school's best distance runner. She is preparing to repeat her success and leading the cross country, volleyball, and track teams as an 8th grader next year.

LEADERS

BETTY BROSIER–1983-1987

This honoree began working in athletics for Rochester Community Schools in the 1973-1974 school year. In this year the board of education instituted a directive to involve girls in participating in interscholastic athletics at the senior and junior high school levels. Basketball, volleyball, club gymnastics, softball, track and cheerleading. 300 junior high girls participated! This hall of famer persevered through tough times when in the spring of 1978 all junior varsity and 7th/8th grade sports were eliminated when the spring millage was defeated. Fortunately the millage passed the next year and the sports programs were back! This hall of famer would also help lead the transition of athletic leadership at Rochester High School where she would serve as athletic director for one year. She would continue in her role as the lead in Women's Physical Education and Athletics for the district until she arrived at Reuther in the Fall of 1983. She would teach English for four years and would take on the role of athletic director for the 1986-1987 school year. We are indebted to her passion for girls athletics and physical education.

LAURELLE BENNETT JONES–1977-1981, 1982-1984

This honoree joined Reuther's staff in the 1978-1979 school year as a physical education teacher. Our hall of famer coached the volleyball and track teams at Reuther. She would coach 5 team championships in boys track and 4 team championships in girls track for a total of nine. She coached many city champions and all county performers in track. The highlight of her coaching career was helping lead the 9th grade boys track team to a runner up finish at the Oakland County Meet. This hall of famer has coached 32 hall of famers at Reuther and 5 of them would go on to become hall of famers at Rochester High School. After coaching at Reuther she would also coach volleyball at the high school level. After earning her masters degree in counseling she would become one of the school's counselors. She would stay at Reuther through the 1989-1990 school year and transfer to the newly built Hart Middle School in the Fall of 1990 where she would finish her career as a counselor and coach.

MEL BLOHM–1976-1985

This honoree joined Reuther's staff in the 1976-1977 school year as a social studies teacher although he began his coaching career at Reuther a few years earlier. Our hall of famer coaches the basketball and track teams at Reuther. He coached Reuther to a

total of 18 team championships. 3 in boys basketball; 1 in girls basketball; 6 in girls track and 8 in boys track. He is second all-time in coaching championships. He coached many city champions and all county performers in track. This hall of famer has coached approximately 50 hall of famers at Reuther and 5 of them would go on to become hall of famers at Rochester High School. He would stay at Reuther through the 1984-1985 school year. After earning his master's degree he would become a principal at many schools in Rochester .

LAURA SOPHIEA ROSSETTI–1977-1986

This honoree joined Reuther's staff in the 1977-1978 as the librarian. Our hall of famer coached the cheerleading and track teams at Reuther. She would coach 5 team championships in boys track and 4 team championships in girls track for a total of nine. She coached many city champions and all county performers in track. The highlight of her coaching career was helping lead the 9th grade boys track team to a runner up finish at the Oakland County Meet. This hall of famer has coached approximately 50 hall of famers at Reuther and 5 of them would go on to become hall of famers at Rochester High School. She would stay at Reuther through the 1986-1987 school year and finish her career at Hart Middle School.

JAN DAVERT OVCJAK–1978-1987

This honoree joined Reuther's staff in the 1978-1979 school year as a physical education and math teacher. Our hall of famer coached the volleyball and basketball teams at Reuther. She would coach 3 team championships in girls basketball at Reuther. Her 1984 championship team went 16 and 2 which is still a school record for wins in a season. This hall of famer has coached approximately 20 hall of famers at Reuther and 4 of them would go on to become hall of famers at Rochester High School. After Reuther she would coach at the high school level and teach at Van Hoosen. She would return to Reuther to teach physical education and math in the 1997-1998 school year until her retirement in 2010.

BARB GEMELLARO–1992-2001

This honoree joined Reuther's staff in the 1992-1993 school year as an English teacher. Our hall of famer coached the cheerleading and track teams at Reuther. She would coach 5 team championships in cheerleading at Reuther; 1 in competitive and 4 in sideline. This hall of famer helped set the tone for Reuther cheerleaders to go onto Rochester High School to help their program win the most state championships in state history. This hall of famer has coached 12 hall of famers at Reuther. After Reuther she

would go on to Adams High School where she teaches English and is a middle and high school cheerleading judge for the MHSAA competitive cheerleading finals.

MARGE CASS–1973-1978, 1987-1991

This honoree is an original member of Reuther’s teaching staff. Joining the Crusaders for the 1973-1974 school year, this physical education teacher would guide all three grade levels of cheerleading and eventually become a volleyball coach. After taking ten years to raise her three children, this hall of famer would come back to Reuther and teach physical education and American History and coach volleyball. We also owe a great deal of gratitude when she took over the role of athletic director from Betty Brosier. She took on the role from 1987-1990 when Reuther was transitioning from a junior high (Grades 7-9) to a middle school (Grades 6-8). She capped off her career by transitioning the Reuther Track Record board from the English to the Metrics system. This hall of famer would retire from teaching at Reuther in 2012.

PHIL SNELL–2006-2016

This honoree started his career as a student and was the manager of football, basketball, wrestling and track teams In his 8th grade year he threw the shot put for the Crusaders. After college he would come back and serve as an assistant coach for the Reuther 8th grade boys basketball teams from 2006-2016. He would help in player development at practices and would chart the opposing teams offensive and defensive sets. He would coach two team championships in basketball at Reuther; 2008 and 2011. This hall of famer has coached 10 hall of famers at Reuther. Reuther appreciates his 13 years of dedicated service to the athletic program.

SEAN PETERSON–2010-Present

This honoree has been a basketball coach at Reuther since the 2009-2010 school year. He coached the girls 7th grade team from the 2013-2014 through the 2016-2017 school years earning a city championship in 2014. Two of our Hall of Famers, Rielee Fetty and Jade Thomas were on that team and played NCAA Division 1 soccer and basketball respectively. He has been the associate head coach for the 8th grade boys basketball team since the 2009-2010 school year. He has helped in setting up offensive and defensive sets for the team and continues to work with former players individually to help them achieve their basketball goals. He was an integral part of the Boys 8th grade basketball team winning a team championship in the 2010-2011 season. Three of our hall of famers, Eric Gilgenbach, Mike Halsey and Micah Bradford were on that team.

This hall of famer has coached 11 hall of famers at Reuther. Crusader Nation appreciates his continued loyalty and dedication to the boys basketball program.

VICKI PHILLIPS–1983-1999

This honoree joined Reuther in the 1983-1984 school year as a math, science English, and health education teacher. She began her coaching career at a time when cheerleading was not considered yet to be a competitive sport. In the 1992-1993 school year she shocked the cheerleading establishment by bringing two boys onto the team. They would go on to win an 8th grade competitive championship that season. Although boys would not be able to compete on the team after that a point was made. This hall of famer would take on challenges that most women would not dare to try. Earlier in the fall she would become the school's first female football coach. She would work tirelessly learning the game and become the lightweight football team's defensive coordinator. She would pick two football players off that team to become part of the school's 8th grade competitive cheer championship team just a few months later. Our hall of famer would earn three football team championships in 1992, 1995 and 1998. An amazing run...a championship in her first year and final year. This hall of famer has coached approximately 20 hall of famers at Reuther and 5 of them went on to become hall of famers at Rochester High School. She would stop coaching at the end of the 1998-1999 school year and retire from teaching in 2010.

BOB BABIARZ–1988-2005

This honoree joined Reuther as a track coach in the 1987-1988 school year and would stay through 2005. He wanted an opportunity to share his love for running with the Reuther community. He was an integral part of bringing Reuther track back to relevance after a dominant run of success from 1979-1985. He coached 12 track team championships; 5 for the boys and 7 for the girls. He helped coach the boys teams to two top 5 finishes in 1996 and 2003 at the Oakland County Meet. In his 17 years he was instrumental in producing 71 individual city champions; 8 county champions; 7 county runner ups; and 81 all county performers. During his tenure 61 athletes broke track records. This hall of famer has coached approximately 55 hall of famers at Reuther and 6 of them went on to become hall of famers at Rochester High School. The Coach Bob Babiarez Award is given annually to the top distance runner at Reuther. He was a special coach who left us far too soon.

TOM ZBRACKI–1978-1987, 1999-2006

This honoree joined Reuther as a social studies teacher during the 1978-1979 school year. He would coach football, basketball, and baseball at Reuther. He would coach from 1978 through 1987 during the junior high era. He would take a break from coaching for 12 years and then return to the sideline where he continued to teach and coach players to get the most out of their abilities. He coached over 160 career games at Reuther. He coached 5 team championships; two in football, one in basketball and two in baseball. His football and baseball teams from 1980-1986 produced some of the best athletes that Reuther has ever produced. Two of his quarterbacks, Mike Moscato and Bruce Crosthwaite are in the Hall of Fame and went on to play at a high level in college in the sports of basketball and football respectively. Two of his baseball players, Ron Fox and Steve Sarkon went on to play college baseball. This hall of famer has coached over 200 games in her career at Reuther. This hall of famer has coached approximately 45 hall of famers at Reuther and 4 of them went on to become hall of famers at Rochester High School. He would stop coaching football and retire from teaching in 2006.

NICK ONTIVEROS–2006-Present

This honoree joined Reuther as a social studies and math teacher during the 2005-2006 school year. He started coaching wrestling in 2006-2007 and football in 2007-2008. This hall of famer has earned two team championships; one in football and one in wrestling. He helped guide the 2012 Reuther Wrestling team to a runner up finish at the Oakland County meet which is the best finish in school history. This hall of famer has coached approximately 15 hall of famers at Reuther. This hall of famer has coached 11 county champions in wrestling. He has coached over 50 games in football and over 150 meets in wrestling.

EMILY VICTORY–2000-2001, 2003-Present

This honoree began her Reuther career as a volleyball player in the 1996-1997 school year and then returned as an assistant coach in the 2000-2001 school year. After culinary school she returned in the 2003-2004 school year and remains coaching to this day. She has coached two team championships in volleyball; one in 2005 and her second came in spectacular fashion as she led the 2024 7th grade volleyball team to an undefeated season. This hall of famer has coached over 200 games in her career at Reuther. This hall of famer has coached 24 hall of famers at Reuther and 3 of them went on to become hall of famers at Rochester High School. She has also served as the freshman, junior varsity, and varsity assistant coach at Rochester High School where she has helped the Falcons to success recently.

MARK LANE–1988-1992, 1993-2013

This honoree began his career in the 1987-1988 school year as the art teacher. That year Reuther was transitioning from a junior high to a middle school. The #27 jersey is retired in his honor as gave 27 years to Reuther's community. He was given the keys to the Reuther track program in 1988. Two years later he would add football to his coaching duties. He coached both the lightweight and heavyweight teams and coached the heavyweight team to team championships in 1995 and 2001. He coached more than 100 games on the gridiron for the Crusaders. He is best known for his role as the architect that brought Reuther track back to relevance after a dominant run of success from 1979-1985. He coined the famous phrase "Did You Have a Personal Best Today?" To this day every person that is part of Reuther track answers this question the day after every home or away meet. He coached 12 track team championships; 5 for the boys and 7 for the girls. Including his two championships in football, he is fourth all time in Reuther Coaching Championships with 14. He helped coach the boys teams to two top 5 finishes in 1996 and 2003 at the Oakland County Meet. In his 25 years he was instrumental in producing 102 individual city champions; 13 county champions; 9 county runner ups; and 132 all county performers. During his tenure of over 350 meets, 89 athletes broke track records. He capped off his career by being one of the school's athletic directors while still coaching. Reuther has a 6 lane track because of his persistence and passion for giving our runners the best facility possible. This hall of famer has coached 88 hall of famers at Reuther and 10 of them went on to become hall of famers at Rochester High School. The Coach Mark Lane Award is given annually to the top sprinter at Reuther. He was a special coach who left us far too soon.

BOB CHENEY–1973-1978, 1979-1986, 1987-1999

This honoree began his Reuther career as one its original teachers in the 1973-1974 school year as he, Marge Cass and Laurelle Bennett would get the Reuther physical education department started. He would coach football, wrestling, baseball, track and the marine fitness team. While coaching the Reuther wrestling program he also served as the junior varsity, varsity assistant, and varsity head coach of Rochester High School. At various times during the school year he would also help serve Crusader Nation by working as the school's athletic director. He is bar none the greatest coach in the first 50 years of Reuther athletics. He has won more contests and more team championships than any coach in Reuther history. While at both schools he and Max Haase of RHS would form the Marine Fitness team. A collection of the school's best athletes who were willing to push themselves to the limit. Ultimately a large group of former Reuther students would continue their efforts at RHS and take the Marine Fitness team to a national championship in 1985. At Reuther he coached 21 team

championships; most all -time. In football he earned 5 of those championships and the other 16 were in wrestling. This hall of famer would coach more than 100 individual city championships at Reuther in wrestling. His overall record for wrestling at Reuther was 73-16, a winning percentage of .820. This is the highest career winning percentage in any sport based on a minimum of 10 seasons. This hall of famer has coached 70 hall of farmers at Reuther and 6 of them went on to become hall of famers at Rochester High School.

KIRK GIBBS–1990-Present

This honoree began his Reuther career in the 1987-1988 school year as the head custodian of the new Reuther Middle School. Three years later he would begin an impressive career where he has coached football, volleyball, softball and was the longest serving athletic director (20 years) in school history. In football he coached both the lightweight and heavyweight squads. He earned two team championships in heavyweight football; 1995 and 2001. He went on to coach 17 seasons and over 100 games. He would coach the Reuther girls softball team from 1991 through 1993 when budget cuts got rid of gymnastics, softball, and baseball. This hall of famers claim to fame is his work with the Reuther Volleyball program. He has been a fixture for the sport as he has been the coach of the 8th grade team for all but one season since 1991. In the 2007-2008 school year he would stop coaching football in the fall and go over to Rochester High School. Since the 2007-2008 school year he has served as the freshman, junior varsity, varsity assistant and varsity head coach of the Falcons. He has coached countless all league, all region, and all state performers. He has had more than a dozen former players go on to play college volleyball at all divisions and has had dozens more who played in college in all divisions and in all sports. This hall of famer has coached at the state and national level in club volleyball as well. He earned a volleyball team championship at Reuther in 2001 and has coached a number of league championships at the high school level. He has coached over 350 volleyball games at the middle school level; more than anyone in school history. As the school's athletic director, he oversaw the district renovation project from 2006-2008. The school was able to secure new bleachers, an auxiliary gym, a new logo for the main gym floor, a new track and a sound system for the gym. Of the school's 75 boys team championships and the girls 66 team championships, he was the athletic director at the helm for 28 boys team championships and 21 girls team championships. He has coached the second most contests in school history with more than 500 contests. This hall of famer has coached 51 hall of farmers at Reuther and 11 of them would become hall of famers at Rochester High School.

NICK KLAK–1990-Present

This honoree began his Reuther career in the 1988-1989 school year as the school's keyboarding, typing and career education teacher. Two years later he would become the school's heavyweight football coach (2 seasons), boys 8th grade basketball coach and the boys and girls 7th and 8th grade assistant head track coach; later becoming the co-head coach in 2012 and eventually the head coach in 2014. He earned four team championships in 8th grade boys basketball; 2003, 2005, 2008 and 2011. To date he has coached almost 400 games. This hall of famer has also coached track since 1991. He coached 12 track team championships; 5 for the boys and 7 for the girls. Including his four championships in basketball, he is third all time in Reuther Coaching Championships with 16. He helped coach the boys teams to two top 5 finishes in 1996 and 2003 and the girls teams to a top five finish in 2023 at the Oakland County Meet. In his 34 years to date he was instrumental in producing 135 individual city champions; 21 county champions; 13 county runner ups; and 178 all county performers. During his tenure of over 550 meets, 125 athletes broke records. He has coached dozens of athletes who went on to become college athletes in all divisions and in all sports. He has been athletic director since 2009. Of the school's 75 boys team championships and the girls 66 team championships, he was the athletic director at the helm for 6 boys team championships and 11 girls team championships. He has coached more contests than any coach in school history approaching 1,000 contests. This hall of famer has coached 101 hall of famers at Reuther and 11 of them would become hall of famers at Rochester High School.

- *All athletes MUST have participated in a sport that Reuther Athletics offered. Cannot be put into the Hall of Fame for a sport including the following...
Lacrosse, Hockey, Soccer, Swim and Dive, Dance, Golf, Tennis. (1973-Present)
Baseball, Softball, Gymnastics were sports at Reuther until the end of the 1990-1991 school year.

- *Athletes that earn an individual county championship in wrestling or track are automatically inducted.

- *Athletes that hold one record in track or cross country for a minimum of 10 years are automatically inducted.

- *Athletes that hold multiple records in track and/or cross country (2 or more) at the same time are automatically inducted. No length of time is required to hold one or both records.

- *Athletes that have shown excellence in one or more sports at Reuther and are nominated are inducted.

- *Examples of excellence include the following...
 - *Individual City Champion–Wrestling, Cross Country, and Track
 - *Individual County Champion–Wrestling, Cross Country, and Track
 - *Individual County Placer–Cross Country and Track (2nd-8th Place–All County honors)
 - *Team Championship(s) in a team sport (Basketball, Cheerleading, Cross Country, Football, Track, Volleyball, Wrestling).
 - *Team leader and/or an athlete that has shown the ability to dominate competition in their sport.

*Nominations are open for athletes for up to 10 years AFTER their graduating class has left Reuther. (8th Grade Year). This would keep the nomination process open through a 4 year high school career and 6 year college career.

*Nominations are now **closed** for the Reuther graduating classes of **1974** through **2014**.

*Nominations are still **open** for the classes of **2015** through the **present**.
