- You can expect to earn more money in your lifetime with a high school diploma or its equivalent. Research shows that people with a high school-level credential make an average of \$385,000 more in their lifetime than people who don't have a diploma.
- Having your HiSET credential opens up a lot of doors for advanced training. Most specialized training programs require either a high school diploma or equivalent. And with a diploma, you'll be eligible for most workplace or on-the-job training programs, along with higher educational opportunities.
- A high school equivalency diploma is respected as equal to graduating high school and is accepted as an equivalent to a high school diploma by about 97% of colleges and universities in the U.S.

Cultures Of Tea Around The World

A Walk Through Dunstan Cemetery


