The original class and grade remain on the transcript and are calculated in the GPA. The assessment equivalency with a grade of P is also added to the transcript. The P grade is not calculated in the GPA, but most colleges consider it a D grade when considering a student for entrance. The OSPI determined graduation cut-off score for ACT/SAT will be used to determine equivalency if applicable. Otherwise, the ACT college and career readiness standard score will be used. A student may earn **no more** than .5 credits in Math or Science through state or national assessment equivalency.
