ABOUT CPS

Cincinnati Public Schools (CPS) is Greater Cincinnati's largest, and Ohio's second largest, school district, serving about 36,000 students in preschool through grade 12 in 65 schools across southwest Ohio.

CPS offers families high-quality educational choices and a variety of academic programs. CPS is committed to developing the whole child, ensuring students thrive and graduate prepared to enroll in college, enlist in the military or become gainfully employed.

COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTERS

Our community and schools are strongly linked - one seldom succeeds if the other fails. To support both schools and communities, CPS launched the Community Learning Center (CLC) model in 2002 to strengthen the link between schools and communities. CLCs offer health services, counseling, after-school programs, nutrition classes, parent and family engagement programs, career and college access services, youth development activities, mentoring, arts programming and more. CLCs are supported by in-school Resource Coordinators.

SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTERS

CPS offers full-service health centers at sites around the District to serve the medical needs of students, families and the community. Currently, CPS has 10 School-Based Health Centers (SBHC) to serve student needs and 14 SBHCs that serve student, family and community needs.



DISTRICT OF CHOICE

Choosing the right school for your child is an important decision. Cincinnati Public Schools is a district of choice, meaning there are many educational choices to help parents enroll their child in a program that will best suit their child's needs. CPS prepares students to graduate ready to enroll in a university, by providing dual-enrollment in College Credit Plus courses, and become gainfully employed through Career Technical Education programs.

When choosing a school, consider your child's individual needs, their progress and a school or program supporting your child's interests.



ENROLLMENT

CPS is proud to feature many educational choices, offering families options from neighborhood schools, magnet, Montessori and high schools of choice, meaning students and their families have the opportunity to attend any high school in the district regardless of the student's home address. While some schools have eligibility requirements, the district-of-choice model helps provide equitable access to all students.

To enroll at a magnet elementary school or a high school, students must apply through the CPS Lottery and, in some cases, meet additional eligibility requirements. Students will be notified of their placement at the conclusion of the Lottery process, at which time they will need to register for that school and provide required registration documents.

Once the student is registered, CPS will finalize the registration and enroll the student. Neighborhood schools have year-round enrollment based on the student's home address, and do not require participation in the lottery. CPS has one elementary neighborhood school for each address in our district.

LOTTERY & APPLICATION PERIODS

The CPS Lottery opens each year in the fall for the following school year, and is open to in-district families applying for an elementary magnet school or grades 7-9 at a high school. Sibling applications for magnet programs are also submitted in the online CPS Lottery.

If a student's home address is in the West area of Cincinnati and they would like to apply for an East area elementary Magnet school, or vice versa, the parent/guardian must apply during the Out-of-Area (East & West) Magnet Application period in the spring. Students with a home address that is not in the CPS District may apply to attend a CPS school during the online Out-of-District Open Enrollment Lottery held in May.

HOW TO REGISTER

CPS uses an online system to register students but also provides support to families needing assistance through its Customer Care Center. The online system simplifies and streamlines the process of registering children in CPS. Parents or legal guardians first must register a child using the online system at either their neighborhood school or the school assigned to them via the Lottery.

Once the parent/guardian uploads all required documents, CPS staff finalizes the registration and enrolls the child as quickly as possible. Parents will receive confirmation from CPS' Online Registration system when enrollment is complete.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

PRESCHOOL

Children ages 3 to 4 years old that live within CPS district boundaries are eligible to sign up for a high-quality preschool classroom. A family can register their child for preschool online at www.cps-k12.org/preschool.

NEIGHBORHOOD SCHOOLS

Students in grades K-6 are automatically eligible to register and enroll in their assigned neighborhood elementary school based on the school's attendance boundaries and the student's home address.

Schools that are both Neighborhood and Magnet schools enroll students into the Magnet program based on Lottery applications. Neighborhood students can attend Neighborhood-Magnet schools without being enrolled in the Magnet program. MAGNET SCHOOLS

Students in grades K-6, and some in grades 7-8, are eligible to participate in the Lottery for their chance to register and enroll in a Magnet School. Schools that are both Neighborhood and Magnet schools enroll students into the Magnet program based on Lottery applications.

Neighborhood students can attend Neighborhood Magnet schools without being enrolled in the Magnet program. Students with siblings that are currently enrolled in a Magnet program are given priority to enroll in the same Magnet school, but they must apply through the Lottery.

MONTESSORI SCHOOLS

Students in grades K-6 are eligible to participate in the Magnet School Lottery for their chance to register and enroll in an elementary Montessori school. Students completing grade 6 that are currently attending a CPS Montessori elementary school will receive priority to enroll in a Montessori high school for grades 7-12.

A grade 6 student who does not currently attend a CPS Montessori elementary school, but would like to attend a CPS Montessori high school, must have at least two years of Montessori experience and enter the Lottery. All students exiting a CPS elementary school must apply in the Lottery (except for Walnut Hills, SCPA and Spencer Center which have a separate process).



HIGH SCHOOLS

Students across the CPS District can attend any high school in the district, regardless of their home address by meeting eligibility criteria for some schools and entering the CPS Lottery. If a student completing grade 6 is currently attending a neighborhood K-12, specialized 3-12 or online school, they do not need to enter the High School Lottery to continue attending that school. However, if those students would like to change their high school, they will need to enter the Lottery.

Please note, some schools have additional eligibility requirements to enter the Lottery, such as completing an audition for SCPA or earning above baseline scores on entrance exams for Walnut Hills or Spencer. For more information on high school eligibility requirements, contact the school of interest.





GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students in Ohio are required to meet the Ohio Department of Education graduation requirements which include earning a minimum of 20 credits in specific classes, show competency by passing state-required tests or choosing an alternative pathway and earn at least two Graduation Seals.

CPS students are required to:

THE 3Es

To support high school students on their path to graduate prepared for college, career and beyond, students are connected to numerous college and career opportunities and encouraged to declare a graduation plan to enroll in a college, enlist in the Military or become employed in a career. Making a 3E declaration helps schools identify opportunities to benefit students' future plans.



3ENROLL

Enroll is a higher education pathway. Students making this selection intend to enroll and attend a college, university or trade school after high school graduation. High schools support students interested in higher education by providing college pathways, College Credit Plus courses and Advanced Placement courses.

3EMPLOY

Employ is a career education pathway. Students making this selection intend to become employed in a career pathway after high school graduation. 3ENLIST

Enlist is a military education pathway. Students making this selection intend to enlist in the military and/or attend a military academy after high school graduation. High schools support students interested in enlisting in the military by providing exposure to military recruiters and providing students with highly rigorous and structured course work.

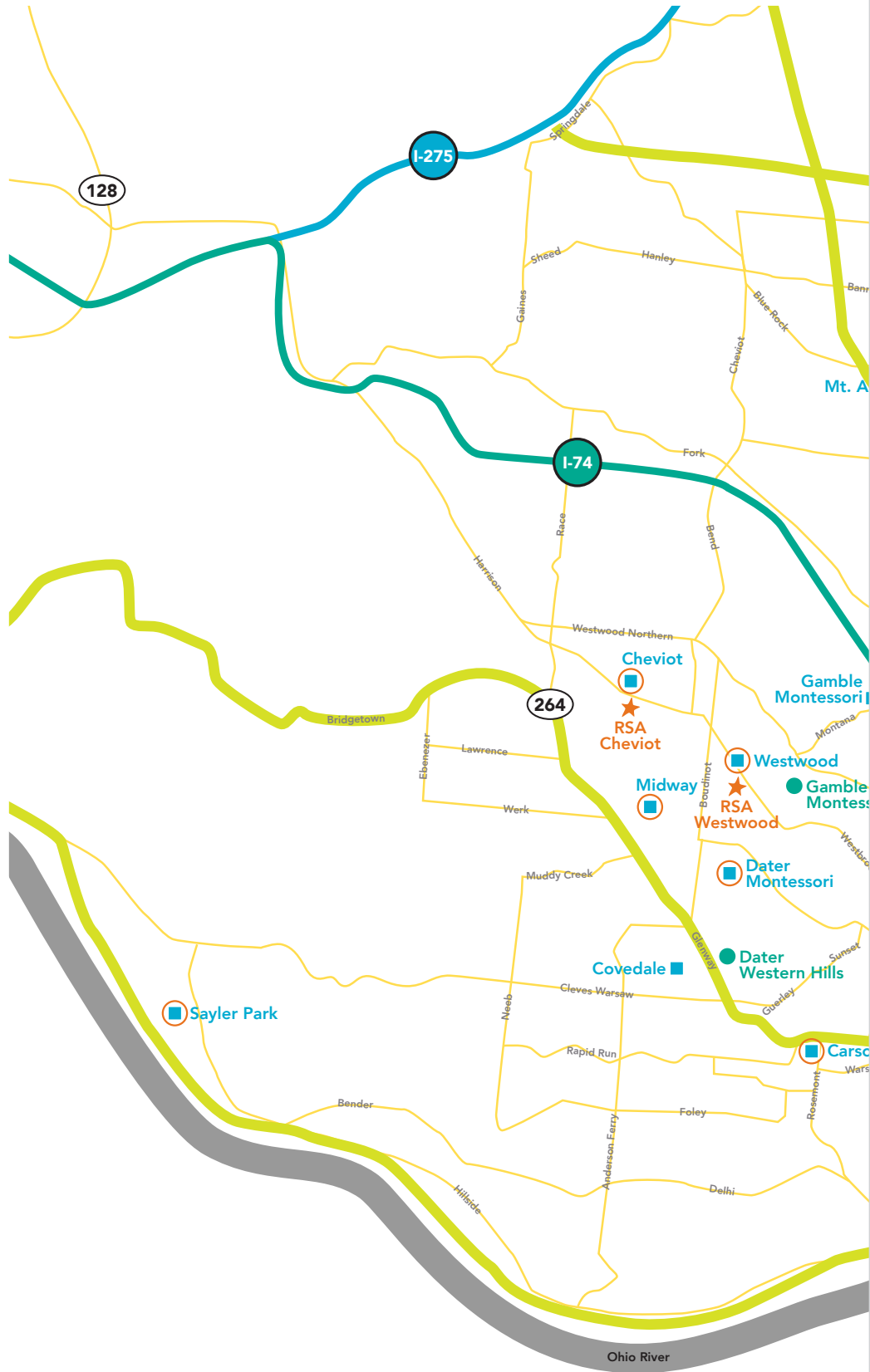
CPS DISTRICT MAP

PRESCHOOL

Cincinnati Public Schools provides quality, comprehensive preschool programs and collaborative services to support young children and families for lifelong learning at 45 conveniently located schools. All CPS preschools are evaluated by the Ohio Department of Education and receive the state's highest rating. Children who participate in a quality preschool acquire skills needed to be prepared and successful in kindergarten. A variety of enriching learning experiences occur daily, inside and outside the classroom to support academic, health and nutrition and social-emotional skills. CPS' Early Childhood Education (ECE) program recognizes that all children can learn, mainly through playful interactions with people and materials. The learning environment encourages creative exploration with a balance of child and adult-initiated, age-appropriate activities. Students who attend a CPS preschool consistently outperform their peers in kindergarten readiness. Preschool programs are available throughout the school district.

GDA also offers AP courses and the opportunity to take the ACT college-entrance exam at no cost. All students are required to take any Ohio-mandated tests in-person at the Digital Academy.

ELIGIBILITY

Any student in grades K-12 living in Ohio may enroll in GDA. Students living outside the boundaries of CPS may enroll tuition-free under CPS' open-enrollment policy. Applications are accepted May 1-31. GDA is ideal for home-schooled students, traveling students or those with scheduling conflicts, students with children or full-time jobs, students who thrive outside traditional classrooms or high school students looking for an accelerated learning process.

Aspire is designed to provide out-of-school youth and adult students services in basic reading, math and writing; adult secondary education, High School Equivalency (HSE) preparation, English for speakers of other languages, transition services to post-secondary and employment and workplace education. Aspire also offers integrated education and training to earn a credential in culinary arts, construction, medical assistance (MA), Patient Care Assistance (PCA), phlebotomy and Hospital Work Readiness. The Aspire program serves approximately 1200 students each year at no charge to the adults who participate. Aspire is available to students ages 19 and above at eight sites across Cincinnati. Students ages 16, 17 and 18 can participate with documentation showing they officially withdrew from, or completed, high school.

Adult Education also offers the 22+ Adult High School Diploma Program offering credit recovery for adults 22 years old or older who wish to earn their high school diploma.

GLOSSARY



ADULT EDUCATION

Adult Education Solutions (AES) is part of the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) and the Ohio Department of Higher Education (ODHE), offering free day and evening classes and wrap-around Adult Services. Classes are also available online. AES offers two programs, Aspire and 22+ Credit Recovery- Adult Diploma Program, designed specifically for individuals whose goal is to attain the credentials they need to build a successful future.

AP

Advanced Placement courses provide students the opportunity to earn college credit after successfully completing the course and passing a subject-specific AP test.

AUDITION

The school has entrance requirements based on an audition.

CCP

Ohio's College Credit Plus program provides students the opportunity to earn college credits while still in high school.

CLC

The school also serves as a Community Learning Center.

COLLEGE PIPELINE

The school has a college pipeline program, providing students the opportunity to be accepted to a partner college or university as a college sophomore upon high school graduation.

CREW

A structure and culture at EL schools that provide students with the opportunity to work as a community and reach ambitious goals together.

CTE

The school offers Career Technical Education which provides students the opportunity to earn industry-recognized credentials for technical careers while still in high school.

DUAL IMMERSION

Some classes are taught in two or more languages for students learning a non-native language.

EXPEDITIONARY LEARNING (EL)

Education model designed to provide educational equity and redefine student achievement.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB)

The IB program enables students to make sense of the complexities of the world around them, while equipping them with the skills and dispositions needed for taking responsible action for the future.

LEADER IN ME

Education model that builds leadership and life skills in students and creates a high-trust school culture.

HSE

High School Equivalency Exam

MAGNET

An elementary school that offers a specialized program, such as STEM or Arts. Students are admitted based on the Lottery process and/or additional eligibility criteria.

MONTESSORI

The school follows a Montessori education model. Students are admitted based on the Lottery process.

NEIGHBORHOOD

Students admitted based on the school's neighborhood boundaries.

ONLINE

The school is primarily online, supported by a traditional school building.

PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

The school leans into a teaching method allowing students to engage in real-world, personally meaningful projects.

ENTRANCE EXAM

The school has entrance requirements based on qualifying test scores.

SBHC

The school hosts a School Based Health Center.

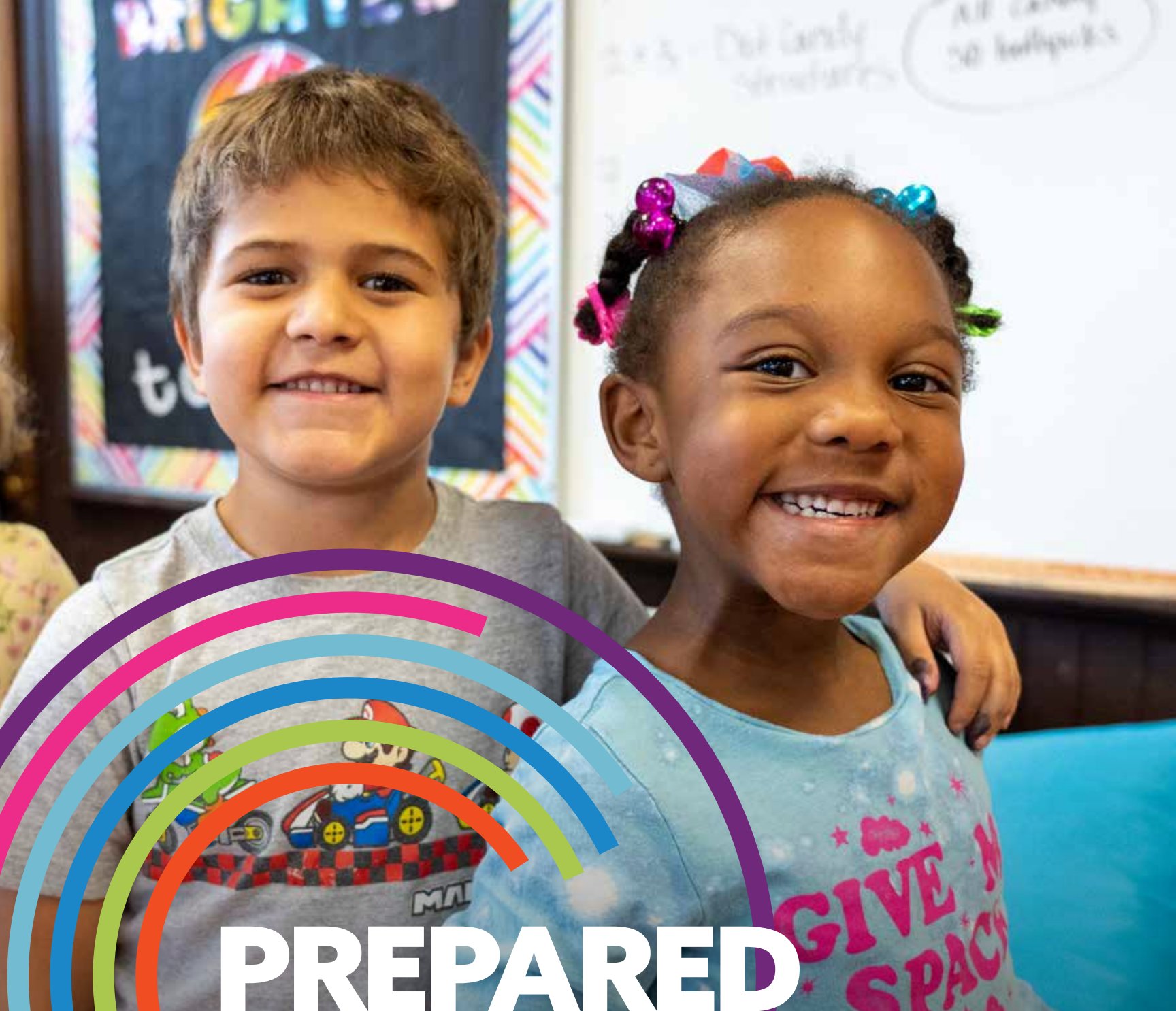
