



What is a monoprint?

A monoprint is a print that can only be made once, unlike most printmaking which allows for multiple prints.

For this lesson you will create a monoprint. Supplies needed are:

plastic baggies, plastic bag(any size), or aluminum foil.

Markers(any size)

spray bottle with water(can sprinkle with water in you do not have one) white paper (any size)










1. Set up supplies.

Directions

- 2. Color bag/foil with markers(choose colors that go well together ex. warm or cool colors)
- 3. Spray bag/foil with water.
- 4. Turn over white paper and press into colors on bag/foil. Turn over and wala! You have a print.
- 5. Color again and repeat.
