Dr. Judith Witmer has devoted her life to the educational profession as a teacher, administrator, professor, consultant and researcher. The Lower Dauphin School District was fortunate to attract Dr. Witmer, as a young graduate from Pennsylvania State University, to its teaching staff. So many LD students can attribute their English writing, speaking and analysis skills to Dr. Witmer.
