Springfield is committed to increasing student achievement for all students who enter our doors. Highly qualified teachers differentiate instruction to meet the needs and learning styles of each child. Teachers collaborate to improve instruction and implement inclusion, creating a constructive professional learning community.

Quarterly SPIRIT Rallies are held to recognize exemplary student performance in academics, attendance and citizenship.

Springfield is always welcoming parents to participate and to become an active part in our school PTA, Title I Planning Team, and School Improvement Council. High parental involvement ensures that the entire Springfield community is working together for the welfare of our students.

Springfield integrates cutting-edge technology with the South Carolina College and Career Readiness Standards. Each classroom is equipped with a Promethean Panel, document camera, teacher iPad, and laptop computer to use for instruction. Technology is further integrated in each K-5 classroom with iPads for each student in grades K-2 and Chromebooks for each student in grades 3-5. Students utilize Seesaw and Google Classroom regularly as well as adaptive digital content programs such as iReady Reading and Math. Students receive direct technology instruction weekly through related arts.
