He was an Expressway Conference All-Star for 3 years and an Allegany County All-Star for 2 years.

Caleb was a two time Section 5 Class B Champion, and also earning the MVP and Sportsmanship Award for Section V Class B his senior year. Caleb was a two time semi-finalist in the Section V super-sectionals, with Section V participants winning the State title both years.

After graduation, Caleb went to Universal Technical Institute and earned a technical degree in automotive and diesel technology.

Caleb is married to Cassandra, with 2 children, Isabel and Addison.

Meghan Miller



Meghan is a 2006 graduate of Genesee Valley Central School. Meghan was a tri-athlete for GVCS, and stood out in all three—soccer, cheerleading, and softball.

Meghan was probably best known for her soccer skills though. She played varsity soccer for 5 years. She was an 1st Allegany County All-Star and named Offensive MVP in 2006.

She was named to the Big 30 All-Star team and made 1st Team All-State her senior year. She was named to the Portville and Letchworth All-

Tournament teams her senior year, but the most noteworthy award was being named the 2005 Section V BirdsEye Player of the Year. Meghan was also selected to play in the Tourney Sport USA National Soccer Tournament

Meghan was named to the Bolivar-Richburg softball all tournament team and also named the MVP of that tournament. She was an Allegany County 1st Team All - Star selection her senior year.

Meghan was also an Allegany County All-Star for cheerleading. She earned the Most Dedicated award 2 years for cheerleading. She was named GVCS Female Athlete of the Year and the Most Outstanding Senior Athlete her senior year.

Meghan went to SUNY Oswego after graduation and competed 2 years on the Women's Soccer team. Her soccer team there had the highest team GPA for Oswego.

Meghan is currently teaching in the St. Mary's County Public School System in Maryland.

HANS ZLOMEK



Hans is a 2004 graduate of Genesee Valley Central School. Hans grew up in the era of some spectacular sports here at GVCS. Hans was a three sport athlete, competing in soccer, basketball, and baseball. Hans was notorious in the sport of baseball.

He was a 2 time Allegany County 1st team selection and in 2003 he named the Section V MVP, helping his team win the last leg of the Triple Crown feat with a Section V championship. Hans averaged over 10 strikeouts a game to help lead his team that year. At one point, he was ranked the #1 pitcher in New York State.

Hans graduated GVCS with more wins and strikeouts than any other baseball player in history. He batted close to .400 the 3 years he started.

Hans also had a stellar basketball career here too. He was named to the Allegany County All-Star team for 2 years and was on the Section V All-Tournament team his junior and senior year, helping his team win the Section V Championship in 2002-03—the same team being inducted into this year's Wall of Fame.

Following graduation, Hans went to Alfred State to play baseball. He was a pitcher there for 2 years and then transferred to University of Albany to play for a year.

Hans graduated from University of Buffalo with a degree in Early Childhood Development. He is now employed as a US Border Patrol Agent stationed in McAllen, Texas.

Rich is a 1976 graduate of Angelica Central School. He was a three sport athlete, competing in soccer, basketball, and baseball. Rich was an Allegany County All -Star in all three sports in 1974-75 and a repeat all star for soccer and basketball his senior seasons.

Rich earned MVP status for soccer and basketball his senior year for Angelica. He was named Angelica Central School Male Athlete of the Year in 1976.

After graduation, Rich attended Mount Union College and participated in basketball for one year and soccer for all 4 years of college. He graduated with a Bachelors' Degree in Sociology.
