Descriptor for Honors

A student who is self-motivated, can think critically and is an independent learner should succeed at this academic level.

Students are expected to read extensively and then apply and synthesize the information.

Students are also expected to be able to write multi-paragraph pieces of narrative and expository writing.

Prerequisites are listed in the curriculum guide.

Descriptor for CCP

College and career preparatory courses are intended to develop in students the skill sets and content knowledge needed to pursue a variety of college and career options beyond high school.

Students are expected to engage in a rigorous sequence of learning at this level that will develop reasoning and communication skills while learning required content.
