#### HOW TO ACCESS YOUR STUDENT EMAIL

**Step 1:** In your internet browser, go to **students.fresnou.org** 

- Log into your student portal using your 4-character ATLAS username
- If you forgot your password, reset it by clicking the 'Forgot your password?' link

Step 2: Click on the Office 365 icon

**Step 3:** Sign into Office 365 using your Fresno Unified email and password.

- Your email address starts with your 4-character ATLAS username (\_\_\_\_@fresnou.org)
- Your password for Office 365 is the same as ATLAS



#### **FOOD DELIVERY POLICY**

Due to safety concerns, and strangers who deliver food claiming to be a parent or guardian, no outside food from any food delivery service (such as Uber Eats, Doordash etc.) or parents/guardians will be accepted.

#### Please note that:

- > All food will be turned away.
- ➤ Hoover High School will not be responsible for any refunds.
- If a student attempts to order food and have it delivered the food will be confiscated.

#### **END OF EACH ACADEMIC DAY**

At dismissal, ALL students are to do one of the following to ensure safety:

- Head immediately home via parent pick up, school bus, city bus, car, bike, or by walking.
- Head straight to their after-school activity: sport, club, after school program, tutorial, etc.
- > Students are not allowed to hang out on school property.
- > Once a student leaves campus after school, they may not return for 30 minutes to ensure safety.

#### **Senior Families**

Congratulations on making it to the most critical year of your student's high school experience! This will be an exciting and busy year for your senior. The year will be filled with building new relationships, strengthening existing ones, making important decisions, celebrating academic successes, and creating lifetime memories through a variety of events and activities.

To kick-off your student's senior year, we invite you to attend **SENIOR NIGHT** to learn everything you need to navigate through this crucial year and set your student up for success! Please join us on **Tuesday, August 13th** for our Kick-Off Senior Night Event at 5:30pm. Invitations will be sent in the mail at the beginning of August.

#### **Hoover Cellphone Policy**

At Hoover students are allowed to use their cellphones: before school, during passing periods, at lunch, and after school.

Phones are not allowed to be used in classrooms at ANY time. When needing to use technology in the classroom, teachers will ask students to take out their student computer.

If a student has their phone out, they will be given the choice to turn it into the teacher until the end of the period or to have it taken to the office for parent pick up.

This policy helps ensure that the focus while in class is on instruction and allows students to learn how and when to use cell phones at the appropriate times.

**NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION** begins on Monday, August 5<sup>th</sup>. Hours are 8:00—11:30 AM and 1:00—3:00 PM. We will also have one evening registration on Tuesday, August 13<sup>th</sup>, from 4:00 —7:00 PM.

Please bring the following documents:

- > Transcripts from the last school you received semester credits. Incoming 9th graders need report card.
- ➤ Birth Certificate
- Shot Records
- Proof of address (must be in parent's/guardian's name, i.e., water bill, PG&E bill or lease agreement). The address must be within the Hoover boundaries.

#### ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES



Parents are required to call the Attendance Office every day their child is absent. Please call the day of the absence. Students must check out through the attendance office before leaving campus. Students who leave without clearing through the Attendance Office will be marked as having cut. Retroactive parental clearance may not be allowed. The attendance office numbers are:

#### **TARDIES**

Any student late to school because of a medical appointment must report to the Attendance Office for an excused clearance slip. Verification from the parent/guardian or the medical office is required.

If students are tardy in between classes, they will get an electronic pass at a 5Star station in which they type their ID number. If students are tardy in between classes, they will be assigned lunch and/or after school detention.

#### PERMIT TO LEAVE SCHOOL DURING SCHOOL HOURS

Students will only be released to an adult who is 18 years of age or older that is listed on the emergency card. Parents who are picking up their student during the school day must check out the student through the main office. Students may not leave campus during the school day for any reason without first obtaining an off-campus pass from the attendance office.

#### **VISITOR CHECK-IN**

All parents/visitors must check into the main office. Parking is provided in the small parking lot on First Street. Overflow parking is provided in the first row of the main parking lot (near First Street). Visitors parking in the overflow lot must check in at the gate with the Campus Safety Assistant.

#### **EDUTEXT**

The EduText tool provides parents/guardians a daily grade and attendance update via their cell phones. These updates will provide a live snapshot of a student's cumulative grades and attendance that day, so parents/guardians have an accurate account of their child's academic progress. The portal can be found under the parent tab at www.fresnounified.org.

Registration for EduText can be done from your cell phone. Locate your EduText Parent PIN on your child's progress report. Text that Parent PIN to 28527 (ATLAS). Activation is immediate; updates will begin the following school day. Additional subscribers can be added using the same process.

#### ParentSquare APP

Please download the ParentSquare APP to get regular school updates and to directly message teachers, counselors, and administrators.



#### Medication at School

If any medication is to be taken at school for any reason, Hoover must have a doctor's written order on file each year. Medicine will not be administered without the doctor's orders. Doctor's orders may be faxed to Hoover at 451-4072.

#### **Financial Obligations**

#### HOOVER HIGH SCHOOL Dress Code 2024 – 2025

#### Educationally appropriate dress and appearance:

The Hoover High School Dress Code is aligned to Fresno Unified Administrative Regulation 5132, in the interest of maintaining an appropriate learning environment. The responsibility for the dress and appearance of a student rests primarily with the student and their parents or guardians. The Dress and Appearance Code is gender neutral and applies to all students equally regardless of gender on campus and at school-sponsored functions and will be enforced consistently and fairly by all members of the school staff. General guidelines for dress and appearance include:

- All students are encouraged to dress in a manner that is appropriate, comfortable and conducive to an active academic school day.
- Clothing and hair styles are a matter of personal choice. However, clothing and hair styles that impact the <u>health</u> and/or <u>safety</u> of students and staff are not allowed. Clothing shall not materially interfere with schoolwork, materially disrupt the school environment, or create a risk of safety.
- Clothing determined to be gang-related is not allowed. The school collaborates with Law Enforcement agencies to update changes in gang-related and inappropriate apparel. Items below that are prohibited due to this collaboration with law enforcement are marked with an asterisk\*. This is subject to change based on updated information.
- "Clothing" in this dress code includes all accessories, including shoes and backpacks.

#### **Examples of inappropriate clothing include:**

- Clothing where the buttocks or torso is exposed, i.e., tube tops, half shirts, halters, spaghetti straps, etc.
- Clothing that is see-through (clothing must be opaque)
- Clothing or accessories which show profanity, obscene words or pictures, sexually suggestive statements, or incites to violence
- Clothing representing gang-related activities
- Clothing where the entire thigh is exposed, such as micro minis, short shorts, or ripped/frayed jeans
- Bathing suits or cut-offs
- The wearing and carrying of tobacco promotional items, or items promoting controlled substances (drugs) and/or alcohol, i.e. "Cookies brand"
- Clothing where undergarments are exposed
- Clothing that has text this is libelous, bullying, constitutes harassment or discrimination

#### Additionally:

- Any article of clothing that is 50% or more Red or Royal Blue is not allowed.
- Bandanas are not permitted.
- Articles of clothing depicting Bulldogs or professional sport logos, mascots, and/or professional team names are not permitted
  to be visible on campus. This also includes all hats, caps, and other headwear. This does not include Hoover High School apparel or hats, caps or headwear of Hoover colors.
- Footwear must be worn at school and at all functions.
- Some courses (such as lab sciences, CTE, PE) may have specific footwear or clothing requirements to ensure the safety of students in the class. Please refer to the course syllabus.
- Some extracurricular or other school specific activities may have other requirements, as the standard dress and appearance policy would not be appropriate for the activity.
- Student Senate to seek approval from admin for exemptions / modification of dress code for spirit dress up days.
