Literacy/Math (Grades K-2)

- By May 2025, EJ will increase the percentage of students in grades K-2 performing on or above grade level in reading, by 6% as measured by the i-Ready diagnostic.

- Read for fluency and comprehension.
- Develop fluency with addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, and fractions using Standards Mastery Framework.
- Daily Vocabulary Development using Phonics and Vocabulary Surge Program.
- Hands-on Science/STEM directly aligned to GA Standards of Excellence.
