MESSAGE FROM MRS. DONLON

The school year is off to an exciting start! Our students have shown exceptional adaptability and resilience in adhering to our new COVID-19 policies and procedures. Students are wearing masks and practicing social distancing in the school building. As we continue to use the hybrid schedule it is important to note the following expectations for all students:



- Students are required to bring their school issued device with them to school every day they attend classes in person. The device should be fully charged.
- On remote learning days, students are expected to follow their schedule and log in to Microsoft Teams to attend classes in real time. Students need to fully participate in order to be considered present for each class. If a student is absent due to an appointment or illness, they are responsible for communicating with their teacher and making up all missed work.
- If students would like to use the internet cafe on their remote learning days, they must arrive in the back parking lot loop between 7:50 and 8:00 a.m. They will have their temperature checked before entering the pool vestibule door and report directly to the cafeteria. Students may leave the building at their convenience but may not reenter the same day.

BELFAST AND GENESEE VALLEY DISCUSS MERGER OF ATHLETICS PROGRAMS

Genesee Valley Central School (GVCS) and Belfast Central School are exploring the prospect of merging athletics programs beginning in the 2021-22 school year.

Representatives from both districts have met multiple times over the past year to review current and projected team numbers and to evaluate the feasibility of merging programs.

"Belfast Central School is discussing merging athletic programs to increase opportunities for our students," said Dr. Wendy Butler, Superintendent at Belfast. "The merger of programs will allow our students to play sports at an appropriate skill and age level throughout their athletic career."

GVCS Board of Education President Timothy Hand commented: "We have witnessed the decline of athletic participation over the past several years and feel that it is time to look at all options to increase opportunities for student athletes."

Two meetings were scheduled in October to further the conversation and bring other voices to the discussion: a joint meeting with the Board of Education Athletics Committees and Varsity coaches; and a meeting with community youth sports leaders. Feedback from the communities of each district will be sought throughout the process.

"We are eager to meet with coaches, youth sports organizers, parents, students, and other stakeholders in both communities," said Butler. "The goal is to determine what steps make the most sense for the students in both districts."

"We understand there is long standing pride in both communities and that change is never easy," said Hand. "However, we believe joining forces may be the best way to secure a sustainable athletics program where competitive, age and skill appropriate teams can be built and maintained."

2020 ATHLETICS WALL OF FAME

Five alumni and one sports team were inducted into the Genesee Valley Central School Athletics Wall of Fame during halftime of the boys' soccer home opener on Saturday, October 3. GVCS Athletic Director/Trainer Bryan Brockway announced the honors for Cole Finnemore, Brian Edmister III, Chris Waite, Kirk Spangler, and Kari Baker, as well as the 1999-2000 GVCS Boys Volleyball Team.

Cole Finnemore, graduated from GVCS in 2005. He was a tri-sport athlete in soccer, basketball and tennis. A first team Allegany County All-Star (soccer) in 2003 and 2004, Cole was named the Section V boys soccer championship MVP in 2004. On the court, Cole was also a 1st Team Allegany County All-Star in 2004. He went on to play soccer at Alfred State where he was named All-Western New York Athletic Conference team and offensive MVP in 2006.

Brian Edmister III, a 2013 GVCS graduate, was a tri-sport athlete in swimming, soccer, and track and field. He was named Allegany-Steuben County Swimmer of the year in 2013 and is the Section V Class C record holder in the 100 backstroke. In 2012-13 Brian was a member of the winning Section V State Team. After high school, Brian attended Hartwick College where he was a Super 8 finalist all four years in the 500 freestyle, 100 backstroke and 200 backstroke. He was also named an Academic All-American twice.

Chris Waite, a GVCS graduate from 2006, was a five-year wrestler and team captain in 2005 and 2006. In 2005 he was

the Section V Class B sectional runner up; the following year (2006) he was the sectional champion and a 4th place finisher in the State Qualifier. Chris' accolades continued after graduation. He was the 1st place finisher in the Navy Powerlifting Competition (2009) and Eades American Bodybuilding Show (2012), and Super Heavyweight finisher in the Mr./Mrs. Buffalo competition (2014, 2015).

Kirk Spangler, a 1976 graduate of Angelica Central School, was a 4-year athlete in soccer, basketball and baseball; he also was on the golf team for 2 years. Kirk was a member of the 1974 Section V basketball championship team, the 1975 Section V soccer championship team, and was a county all-star in baseball in 1974 and 1975. Kirk has served as an official for soccer (42 years), softball (18 years), and basketball (17 years). He was also an official for the Southern Tier Amateur Soccer League for 20 years.

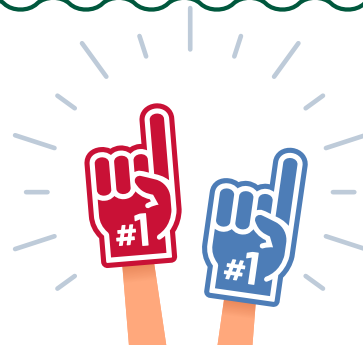
Kari Baker, a 1992 graduate of Belmont Central School, was a tri-sport athlete in soccer, softball and cheerleading. She was a four-time Allegany County all-star in soccer, was named the 1991 Allegany County soccer MVP, and achieved the all-time record for goals scored for Belmont Central School with 46.

The 1999-2000 GVCS Boys Volleyball Team was the final inductee into this year's Wall of Fame class. The team finished with a 14-0 record, won the county championship and county sportsmanship award, and was ranked #2 by the NYS Boys Volleyball Coaches Association. The team was coached by Paul Furlong; players included Ben Schell, Aaron Schell, Patrick Ford, Erok VanDyke, Brandon Houle, Richard Harding, Tom Kewley, Eric Case, Matt Gehl, Tim Clapp and Tim Lyon. During their undefeated season, Pat Ford was named 1st Team All-State and League MVP; Erok VanDyke was named 2nd Team All-State, County MVP and 1st Team All-County; Tom Kewley was named 1st Team All-County; and Ben Scxhell was named 1st Team All-League.

Each inductee will be presented with a plaque to commemorate their achievement; a permanent plaque will be on display in the trophy hallway outside the high school gymnasium.

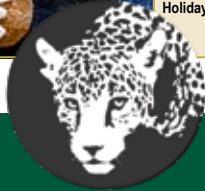
