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

School Health Services/School Nursing/School Social Work

Medication/Treatment Administration at School

Policy 6125

Craven County Schools encourages administration of medicine before and after school whenever possible; However, if it is necessary to administer medications during school hours parents should:

- Notify the school nurse.
- Ensure medication administration documentation is provided to the school nurse.

- Make sure your child has any emergency medications (rescue inhalers, epinephrine, etc.) available in the health office
- Must complete an Action Plan with your child's doctor for students at risk for medical
 emergencies, such as those with diabetes, asthma, severe allergies, etc. and bring a copy to the
 school nurse so that he/she can administer medication to your child at school
- Contact your child's school nurse if there are any changes in your child's medical conditions or health concerns or if you have any questions.

PRE-KINDERGARTEN (PRE-K) AND FAMILY LITERACY

Pre-Kindergarten

Craven County Schools offers an inclusive Pre-Kindergarten Program. It is funded through the state NC Pre-Kindergarten Program, federal Title 1, the Exceptional Children's (EC) Preschool Program, and our local Craven Smart Start. Pre-K is offered at no cost to eligible families. All children must be determined eligible according to the pre-kindergarten program guidelines. Children must be 4 years old on or before August 31st of the current year and children may have an Individual Education Plan (IEP). The program is located in several of our elementary schools, local Head Start sites, and several private childcare centers. See the **Exceptional Children's section** for information about qualifications for EC services for preschoolers ages 3 – 5.

Family Literacy

Craven County Family Literacy is a comprehensive program which integrates children's education, adult education, parent education and interactive parent-child literacy and learning activities. This high-quality program promotes adult literacy and empowers families to support the educational needs of their children. Additionally, the program offers preparation for adults to complete a North Carolina High School Diploma Equivalency and offers English as a Second Language classes. There are three locations in Craven County: James W. Smith Elementary School, J. T. Barber Elementary School, and Vanceboro Farm Life Elementary School.

PARENT INFORMATION AND NOTICES

Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) Parental Involvement

Policy 4700
Policy 1310/4002

Each year we share school related information to individuals and organizations that have a legitimate educational interest relative to our students. The *Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)*, a Federal Law, requires that Craven County Schools must have your written consent for us to share certain types of information about your child. However, Craven County Schools may share certain directory information unless you opt out when you complete the required annual student update in Campus Parent through Infinite Campus. If you do not have access to the online Campus Parent Portal, you may sign and return the Parent/Guardian Required Signature Form on the last page of this handbook and submit it to your child's school by September 1.

Media Release

From time to time, Craven County Schools will release student work to the media. The type of information we will release may be your child's written work, artwork, spoken message or photograph in whole or in part. The types of media most often used are web sites, newspapers, school publications, school displays, videotaping, television taping, social media. No personal information such as home address or phone numbers will be published. All students will be included in the media release unless you opt out when you complete the required annual student update in the Infinite Campus enrollment portal. If you do not have access to the online Campus Parent portal, you may sign and return the Parent/Guardian Required Signature Form on the last page of this handbook and submit it to your child's school by September 3.

Military Recruiter Information Requests and Refusal Forms (High School Students Only)

Unless you request otherwise, our school is required by federal law to give your child's name, address, and phone number to any military recruiter who asks. North Carolina schools usually receive several requests like this each school year. As a parent, you can ask that your child's information NOT be released to military recruiters by completing a <u>Parent Refusal Form</u> which is available at your child's school. If you do not make this request, release of your information is automatic when recruiters ask.

Code of Student Conduct

Policy: 4309

Please refer to <u>Policy 4309</u> to review the Code of Student Conduct in its entirety including information regarding integrity and civility; disruptive behavior; student dress; use of wireless communication devices; tobacco products; drugs and alcohol; gang-related activity; theft, trespass, and damage to property; assaults and threats; weapons, bomb threats, terrorist threats, and clear threats to safety; criminal behavior, and consequences.

Use of Wireless Communication Devices (updated July 18, 2023)

Policy: 4309 Section D

The board recognizes that cellular phones and other wireless communication devices have become an important tool through which parents communicate with their children. Therefore, students are permitted to possess such devices on school property so long as the devices are not activated, used, displayed, or visible during the instructional day or as otherwise directed by school rules or school personnel. Wireless communication devices include, but are not limited to, cellular phones, electronic devices with internet capability, paging devices, two-way radios, smart watches, wireless earbuds, and similar devices

Regardless of grade level, the consequences of violating this policy will be the same. At the first offense, the device will be confiscated and may be picked up at the end of the day by the student. At each subsequent offense, the device will be confiscated and may only be returned to the student's parent/guardian. A student's refusal to surrender the device will result in 3 days of out of school suspension.

More details regarding authorized use, consequences for unauthorized use, search of wireless communication devices, and liability are available in the online policy manual.

Student and Parent Grievance Procedures

Policy: 1740/4010 and 1742/5060

Student and parent concerns should be received and addressed at the level closest to which the concern originated. For example, a concern regarding a classroom issue should be heard first by the teacher. A concern regarding the school in general should be addressed first by the principal. While the board encourages resolutions of complaints through informal means, it recognizes that, at times, a formal process may be necessary for certain types of complaints or if the informal process did not produce satisfactory results. Policies 1740/4010 and 1742/5060 list the procedures for resolving concerns and grievances.

Asbestos Management Plan Notification

The US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has determined that some building materials used in school construction may contain asbestos. The results of asbestos inspections are on file in the Asbestos Management Plan (AHERA) notebook at each site in the school receptionist's area. The plan identifies locations (if any) at your school where asbestos or assumed asbestos containing building materials may be found. Should you not be provided with this information upon request or have questions about the plan's contents, please contact the Craven County Schools Facilities Support Services at 252-514-6380.

Pests are significant problems for people and property. The pesticides that are commonly used in pest control may pose a potential risk to human health and the environment. The Craven County Board of Education is committed to maintaining a safe educational environment while also protecting the physical conditions of school facilities. North Carolina state law gives you the right to be notified annually of our school system's pesticide application schedule and (if possible) 72 hours in advance of pesticide applications made outside of that schedule. If you are a parent/guardian and want notification of any nonscheduled use of non-exempt pesticides in school buildings or on school grounds, you must notify the principal of the student's school in writing within fifteen school days of the start of the school year (or by the fifteenth school day after enrollment if a student enters after the start of the academic year). All notification will be posted in the main office and/or sent out by the ALERT NOW message system.
