

PROCEDURE FOR THIRD BUS DRILL

Introduction: Driving a bus requires concentration and care. The safe and orderly conduct by pupils in boarding, exiting and riding the bus is essential to reduce risks. In the even of an emergency, cooperation and correct actions are essential for efficient and safe exiting. Today we will consider leaving the bus by both the front and rear doors.

Content: I. Importance of Good Conduct:

- A. In order for the driver to hear emergency vehicles and other traffic signals, the sounds inside the bus must be at a low level.
- B. Passengers must remain seated to prevent injuries from falls and in some vehicles, to give the driver a clear view to rear.
- C. A clean bus adds to safety, debris can cause slipping and stumbling.
- D. Correct behavior is essential for safety. Rules and regulations should be understood and must be consistently enforced.

II. Emergency evacuation using front and rear exits:

- A. Double evacuation is necessary for fast action in some emergencies:
 1. A piece of tape or painted line on the bus walls or ceiling can help students identify whether they are seated in the front or rear section.
- B. Double evacuation procedure:
 1. Front half out front door, rear half out rear door
 2. First seat, right side followed by first seat left side and so on to the center mark.
 3. The last seat right side followed by the last seat left side and so on forward to the center mark.
- C. Evacuation conduct:
 1. An orderly evacuation is essential to:
 - a. Avoid injuries
 - b. Reduce time
 - c. Prevent panic
 2. In evacuating the bus:
 - a. Remain calm
 - b. Be quiet
 - c. Follow directions
