Citizenship Award which is awarded to a senior girl each year.

The team, the school, and the community are to be congratulated for the fine, all out effort shown in the season of 1959.


The Bears had a fair soccer season with their record at 2 wins, 1 tie, and 4 losses.

Don Drake, Jim Bliven, and Dick Hand.


