HISTORY OF CLASS OF 1963

When we arrived at the doors of the second grade rooms, we were greeted at the door by our new teachers, Mrs. Helen Steenrod and Mrs. Patricia Tompkins. We felt very privileged when we were the first grade to occupy the new second grade rooms in the new section. In second grade we were all thrilled when we learned of an upcoming trip to the fire hall to see the fire engines. When the day finally arrived, we were all hustled off to the corridor where we got a firsthand look at the engines and heard a talk on fire-safety.

In third grade, we found an old friend had joined us, and we welcomed Mrs. Moshano, along with Mrs. Louise Patterson and Mrs. Helen Kane. It was in this grade that we learned the Palmer Method of Writing, and all of us can still remember making the little circles and the slanted lines.

In fourth grade a birthday was a very special event; and we all started looking forward to the day for weeks, sometimes months, ahead of time. It was on our birthdays that we were presented with a gift by our teachers, Miss Ruth Rossney and Mrs. Gertrude Cline. Shirley Chind joined us just in time to receive her present along with the rest of us.

The next year our school world increased as we walked up the stairs to the fifth grade homerooms of Miss Grace Hammond and Mrs. Freda Tower. It was in fifth grade that we were joined by Nancy Davis.

In the sixth grade we all (well, almost all) experienced the "pleasant" sting of Mr. Bernard Mc-Clure's paddle. We all spent many happy hours playing chess and other games with our new classmates, Jerry Decker, Jim Jones, and Woody Moody.

Finally, we had reached junior high school, our goal for more than six years. Now we were on our way; we had only one more level to go and that wouldn't be upon us for two years, so we all "sat back" and enjoyed ourselves. In the seventh and eighth grades several of us participated in basketball and cheerleading. It was in eighth grade that we took our first Regents and added Alice Perkins, Alice Brown, Bob Manning, Margaret Mullen, and Gary Stephens to our class.

Then we were suddenly caught up in the whirl of high school life. "Frosh" initiation made us feel like accepted members of high school society. (It ought to after walking around for a week wearing diapers and carrying little dolls!) It was our first year of inter-scholastic basketball and cheerleading. We welcomed Judy Cooper and Carolyn Calkins to join us in our assorted antics.

Our Sophomore year still seems hazy to many of us. It passed so fast that few of us remember what happened. We were joined in our mad rush of activities by Sally Hunt.

Before we realized it, we were upperclassmen and were ordering our class rings, choosing our Junior Play, and planning our Junior Prom. Our Junior Play was presented in the fall of the year and proved to be profitable for all concerned. "The Skeleton Walks" was a three-act mystery-comedy. For the first time we saw the "ham" instincts appear in many of our class members. Our cast consisted of: John Shuttleworth, Norma Biancuzzo, Ed Fleischman, Woody Moody, Jeanne Coombes, Kathryn Kenyon, Sally Hunt, John McCaffrey, Pati Shelley, and Marlee Hand. Our stage managers were Jerry Decker and Dennis Bunnell. Prompters were Carolyn Calkins and Edith Francisco.

Three members of the class were inducted into the National Honor Society: John Shuttleworth, Norma Biancuzzo, and Shirley Chind were tapped into the Society during a special assembly.

During our Senior year we were all excited when we entered the bus that would take us to Washington, D. C., along with our chaperones, Mr. and Mrs. Harold Crowther.

After viewing the sights we all rushed home to fill out college application forms and to take college entrance exams. The year went so fast that we had to grab at memories to fill out our scrapbooks of high school.


