## History of the Class of 1964

Grade School and Junior High

Amazingly enough, we made it to first grade where Barrie Barnes, Ted Seeley, and Anne Winterhalter joined us, and we met our new teachers, Mrs. Virginia Horner and Mrs. Helen Clark. It was in this grade that we had our first, and thank heavens our last, encounter

with the famous Dick and Jane books.

Oh! Oh! Oh! Look! Look! We made it to second grade. Here Bonnie Windus joined us and Mrs. Patricia Tompkins and Mrs. Helen Steenrod helped us to make our dramatic debut as actors and actresses.

In third grade we settled down, with the help of Mrs. Helen Kane and Mrs. Bernice Hall, to diligently study our multiplication tables and to learn how to write.

After a year of hard work we were ready for some fun, but our fourth grade teachers, Mrs. Gertrude Cline

and Mrs. Ruth Rossney, had different ideas.

We really thought we were important when we climbed up the stairs to enter fifth grade and meet our new teachers, Miss Grace Hammond and Mrs. Hilda Amberge. That year, when we weren't in the principal's office, we spent our time learning important things such as how to make spitballs so they would stick on the ceiling, how to drop fossils out of windows and how to arrange tacks on a chair so the teacher couldn't help but

Bruised and beaten, but a little wiser, we made it to sixth grade. We were already acquainted with our teachers, Mr. Bernard McClure and Mr. Jack Snell. It was in this year that we learned the project method. Our projects included an ant farm, an aquarium and a dozen eggs that never hatched. We also proved how artistic we were when we constructed a scale model of the proposed Wil-Mac Park. Our year was somewhat saddened by the untimely death of Mr. Snell, but Mrs. Geneva Creots took his place and we proceeded on our way. The climax of our grade school days was a class trip to Buffalo.

In Junior High Susan Perkins joined us as we started on the last lap of our educational journey. Our seventh grade teachers, Miss Alice Birkholz and Mr. Richard Rose, rapidly showed us that school became harder,

not easier, as we went along.

By the time we reached eighth grade, we were veteran Junior High School students and Mr. Roger Franeisco and Miss Alice Birkholz had a hard time convincing us that studying was more important than fun. However, even the State Education Department must have a

heart, for they took pity on our teachers and did away with the eighth grade Regents. So our class confidently marched forward to take on the high school, leaving in our wake a junior high faculty which breathed a marked sign of relief that we were no longer their problem.

High School

We very proudly and confidently entered high school as Freshmen and quickly got a much needed lesson in humility during initiation from the upperclassmen.

Most of our Sophomore year was spent in anticipation of our Junior year, but when we weren't studying or worrying about our first Regents we managed to have

some fun.

Our Junior year finally arrived and at last we were upperclassmen. Our first official act as juniors was to order our class rings which we declared were the most beautiful in the history of the school.

The "ham" instincts came out in many of our class members as we presented our play, "Lock, Stock and Lipstick." Despite stage fright and a few forgotten lines,

our play was a tremendous success.

Our creative and artistic abilities were again evident as we made decorations for our prom. Some of us became very apt at making Kleenex flowers and some of us became very clever at building things with Kleenex boxes. Although Mr. Howbridge had his doubts, we man-aged to have everything ready for the "night." Priscilla McNinch and James Allen were crowned queen and king and Barrie Barnes, Amelia Kenyon, Gary Watkins and Susan Perkins made up their court. The theme, "Drifting and Dreaming," seemed to reflect the mood of the juniors on that long-to-be-remembered night.

To the amazement of several teachers, parents and students, we finally became seniors. David Kemp joined us in time to plan for our Senior trip. Laura Clark, who had left in fourth grade, couldn't resist our charm and

she too returned in time to go to Washington.

After our return from Washington we settled down to fill out college applications, take college boards and worry about whether or not we would be accepted. Once again, however, our class couldn't remain inactive and to show we had the Christmas spirit we sponsored our Senior Ball, "White Christmas."

Now as graduation approaches, the class of '64 looks back on their high school days with mixed emotions. All of us who were so anxious to leave are a little reluctant to be the first ones to go. It was here in this school that we attended classes, went to dances, cheered at basketball games, made our friends, fought with them, made up with them, cried with them and laughed with

Now it is time for us to go our separate ways, but we will never forget what we have learned here. To our teachers we owe a debt which we will probably never be able to repay. Because of their devotion to their profession and their desire to teach and help others, they changed 24 children into adults. Part of our lives are here at Belmont Central School, and no matter what we aspire to be or what we become in the future, it will be pleasant for us to remember these things.

Early in October we began practice for our junior play, "Finders Creepers." It was very successful, and we all had a lot of fun.


Then just before Christmas, our class rings arrived. For two days after they came, there was complete chaos in the office, but finally Mrs. MacEwan got things under control.


