- **Breakfast**

- \$2.50
- Grab-N-Go breakfast is available daily starting at 7:45.

- **Lunch**

- \$3.50
- A lunch includes fruits & vegetables, an entree, and milk. Students are encouraged to take milk, but it is not required.
- Students can return and take unlimited fruits and vegetables if they are still hungry, or they may purchase additional entrees or snacks.

Second Entree - \$2.50

Milk - \$1.00

Fruit and Veggie Bar - \$1.00

Student accounts must have a positive balance to purchase any a la carte items.

MEAL ACCOUNTS

- Family members are welcome and encouraged to join their student for a meal! You may purchase a lunch for \$5.00, or bring your own. You can use cash (please bring exact change), check, or student account.

DONATIONS

- During the COVID pandemic, the USDA used federal funds to provide free school lunches to all students. This federal subsidy ended in June 2022, and many families are now having difficulty covering the cost of student meals.
- Many generous individuals and community groups have asked about making donations to help under-resourced families pay for the cost of their student's lunches. **Donations can be made in person at 501 N 11th Avenue. You can also call 406-522-6380 for more information or to donate online.**
