### Program will Increase Access to Meals for Veterans

A new program is allowing Meals on

Wheels to increase service to those who have served their country. Funding approved by the Minnesota Legislature last year aims to provide up to five, free, healthy home-delivered meals a week to veterans who are not currently receiving them.

Meals on Wheels looks forward to serving anyone who could benefit from this program. To be eligible, veterans must be:

- age 60+, or
- · experiencing food insecurity, or
- unable to obtain food due to a medical or mental health condition.

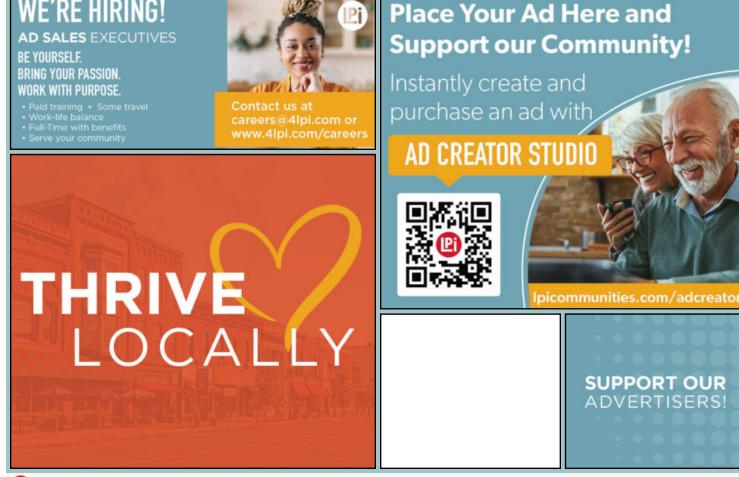
Stick around that night for our season opener football game, which will kick off at

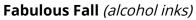

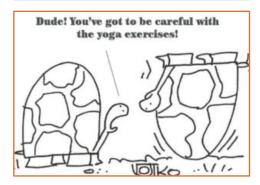
