Dear SBISD Community,

The 2024-25 school year is almost here! I hope your family is as excited to get back to school as we are!

Our educators are busy learning, planning and preparing our schools and classrooms for a fabulous year ahead! From continued professional development focused on the Science of Reading, to the introduction of the new state science curriculum and new report cards for our earliest learners, great things are on the horizon in SBISD!

I'm #SBISDProud to announce something very exciting that has been on the wish lists for our secondary fine arts students for years! Thanks to the successful management of our 2017 Bond Program, interest earnings have enabled us to purchase four custom trailers and trucks for safely hauling instruments and equipment to football games and competitions! Be on the lookout for these trailers on the road! They are fabulous and will save us tens of thousands of general fund dollars annually for truck rentals and repair of damaged instruments!

Speaking of the 2017 Bond Program, the beautiful new Memorial Drive Elementary will open in August, and Woodview Elementary, also a spectacular new facility, will open in January! The Terrace Elementary Project Advisory Team will kick off this fall, and we will break ground in January for the new Sherwood Elementary.

Our 2022 Bond Program is also well underway, with groundbreakings last May for the new Guthrie Center and additions and renovations to our Agricultural Science Center. This August, Valley Oaks Elementary will welcome students back with a new two-story classroom addition that will ease overcrowding at the school.

We also are excited for the official launch of RISE, our new early college program at Northbrook High School, in partnership with Houston Community College.

For over a decade, our vision has remained T-2-4 success for Every Child. To this end, we continue to focus on our district priorities-Literacy, Numeracy, English Learners, Student Supports and the expansion of Career and Technical Education (CTE), while we ensure our students are developing the Core Characteristics of a T-2-4 Ready Graduate.

This year our theme, #SBISDProud, embodies our shared pride in the incredible accomplishments of our students, staff and the district at large. Our spring 2024 STAAR scores affirm how much we have to celebrate. Overall, district results exceeded those for the state and region in all four subjects tested at the Meets Grade Level or Above and the Masters Level by as many as 11 points. Look for more STAAR information in the weeks ahead!

Just recently we learned that SBISD, for the fourth consecutive year, has been named a Texas Art Education Association District of Distinction. Our communications team earned a bevy of national awards this summer, and our Lion Lane and Tiger Trail employee childcare centers earned NAEYC accreditation. So much to celebrate and school hasn't even started!

Last year, we made difficult decisions to address our district's budget gap. With those decisions behind us, we will do our best to provide the excellent service and experiences you expect and our students deserve despite reduced staff and resources. The cuts we made, though difficult, enable us to move forward at this time without further reductions for this school year.

That said, we are gearing up to engage our entire community when the 89th Legislative Session kicks off next January. Full and fair funding for public education will remain our focus.

I eagerly anticipate welcoming everyone back on the first day of class, August 15, —whether on the bus, in the classroom, or across our campuses—as we embark on another successful year in SBISD.

Have an amazing school year!





SAFETY & SECURITY

Dear SBISD Families,

As we begin a new school year, the safety of our students and staff is our top priority. We want to ensure that every individual in Spring Branch ISD is safe and secure. Please take this time to review the following safety and security information:

In the Event of an Emergency

Our Emergency Response Protocols are a critical part of our campus and district safety plans for the 2024-25 school year. Review the document in its entirety so that you are familiar with our safety terms and procedures and know your role as well as do's and don'ts in the event of an emergency. The nature of the situation dictates whether school officials, in coordination with the SBISD Police, will put in place a lockdown, secure, shelter, evacuation, hold, or any combination of these protocols, to ensure the safety and well-being of students and staff. Ensure your contact information, including home and cell phone numbers, email and the name of the individual(s) authorized to pick up your child remains accurate and current. Update phone and email information in Skyward Family Access or contact your school office.

Threats & Prohibited Items

Talk with your child and remind them that making a threat against a district, school or individual is a felony charge and will not be tolerated. Spring Branch ISD and the SBISD Police Department will prosecute any individual who threatens the safety of our students, staff or schools to the fullest extent of the law. A conviction for a third-degree felony in Texas could result in up to 10 years in prison and a fine of up to \$10,000. Also, as a reminder, no weapons of any kind are allowed on the premises of any SBISD campus or facility. Do not allow your child to bring anything to school that is a weapon or gives the appearance of being a weapon, even if it is a toy. Airsofts, pellet guns, BB guns and water guns are not allowed. The district will also always respond in accordance with our Student Code of Conduct for any individual who threatens the safety of our students, staff or schools.



School Bus Safety

- If your student is a bus rider, talk with them about bus safety tips including:
 - When a school bus approaches, stand at least three giant steps (6 feet) away from the curb and line up away from the street. Wait until the bus has come to a complete stop and watch for the driver to signal that it's safe to board.
 - If you must cross the street in front of the bus, walk on the sidewalk or along the side of the road to a point at least five giant steps (10 feet) ahead of the bus before you cross. Be sure that the bus driver can see you, and you can see the bus driver. After exiting the bus, cross only in front of the bus, never behind it.
- Yellow flashing lights on a school bus indicate that the bus is preparing to stop to load/unload children.
 Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicles.
- Red flashing lights on a school bus and extended stop arms indicate that the bus has stopped and that children are getting on or off. Motorists must stop their cars and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop sign is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.

Bike Riders & Walkers

- If your student is a bike rider or walker, talk with them about safety tips including:
 - Do not ride or walk in the roadway. Look both ways and listen to the traffic before crossing, and cross the street only at a crosswalk. If riding a bike, get off the bike and walk the bike across when crossing a street.
 - Do not assume that a car will stop or that the driver sees you. Be sure to stay alert and be seen.
 - Do not accept rides from anyone unless your parents or guardians have given you permission.
 - If you feel unsafe or see something that makes you feel unsafe, report it to your parents, a teacher or a police officer immediately.

Other Safety Reminders

- Bullying is something we take very seriously in SBISD.
 Reporting bullying can help us ensure our schools are safe, positive places where students can thrive and learn. Report any bullying to a campus staff member or administrator or use the Anonymous Reporting link prominent on every campus website.
- Please emphasize the importance of our "See Something - Say Something" protocol.

 Use Anonymous Reporting to share any concerns or call the SBISD Police Department at 713-984-9805.
- Finally, all parents and volunteers must register and gain approval before starting volunteer service each year. SBISD's 2024-2025 volunteer application is now open. Beat the back-to-school rush and apply today. All 2023-2024 volunteer applications expired on June 30, 2024. All volunteers, new and returning, must be registered and approved for the 2024-2025 school before beginning any volunteer activity. It may take up to 10 business days for your application to be processed.

We are committed to working together to have a safe and successful school year. Thank you for your cooperation and support.

The 2017 Bond Program continues the transformation of district facilities. The program:



- REPLACES the remaining nine oldest elementary schools and one middle school.
- PROVIDES classroom and facility renovations (multiple locations).
- UPGRADES safety and security, building systems and technology at all campuses, including classroom furniture for secondary schools.
- REPLACES Career and Technical Education (CTE) classroom equipment.
- REPLACES aged music instruments and uniforms.
- UPGRADES athletics, including four turf fields.
- REPLACES older buses.

\$381.6 million

Approved by 73 percent of the vote in May 2022, the 2022 Bond Program will:



- PROVIDE CTE classroom, lab, and facility improvements at four high schools, six middle schools and two specialty campuses and
- PROVIDE CTE-related technology equipment.
- ADDRESS identified district facility needs including additional classrooms at Valley Oaks Elementary to meet anticipated capacity challenges.
- ADDRESS new building stormwater detention and code requirements put into place after Hurricane Harvey. FUND technology infrastructure improvements that
- support CTE programming and lifecycle replacements of audio-visual instructional tools and student and teacher devices.
- REPLACE the Gutherie Center
- RENOVATE and add to the Agricultural Science Center

Spring Branch ISD School Nutrition Services (SNS) has announced revised meal prices for the upcoming academic year. Starting this fall, breakfast will cost \$1.25, elementary school lunches will be \$2.50, and secondary school lunches will be \$2.75.


