PROCEDURES FOR CHALLENGED MATERIALS

FILE CODE: 6161.2

The following procedures will be followed when a citizen challenges the appropriateness of instructional materials or equipment:

A. Level I

Complainant should present the concern to the library media specialist for library materials, the director of curriculum for classroom texts or materials, and the building principal for all other issues.

B. Level II

If complainant is not satisfied at Level I, the request for consideration of instructional material will be forwarded to the superintendent. If the complainant is unsatisfied at this level, the superintendent will then inform the board of education.

C. Level III

After the board of education is informed, the superintendent will appoint a review committee comprised of appropriate members to investigate the complainant's issue.

- D. A meeting of the review committee will be scheduled promptly.
- E. The issue will be investigated by the committee. Library material will be judged as to its conformance with the criteria for selection as described in board policy 6161.1 Guidelines for the Evaluation and Selection of Instructional Materials.
- F. The written decision of the committee will be forwarded to the superintendent, who will inform the board of education and complainant of the review committee's decision.
- G. If the complainant is dissatisfied with the decision, a request may be submitted to the superintendent for a review of all proceedings by the board of education in regard to the matter, who will render the final decision.
- H. Challenged materials or equipment will not be restricted until the process is completed.
