INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT

The board of education believes that personnel and materials appropriate to the needs of the school program must be available to each pupil and teacher.

To be in compliance with the requirements of federal and state law, the board of education directs the Superintendent to distribute curriculum materials and instructional materials to the schools in such a way that equivalence of such materials is ensured among the schools. Staff assignments shall comply with this directive.

It is the responsibility of the Superintendent, in consultation with the necessary representatives from the faculty, to make necessary purchases of materials and equipment to carry out the educational program. All such purchases will be properly approved by the board of education at the time of payment of bills and invoices at the regularly scheduled meeting of the board each month.

The board will endeavor to provide the supportive resources and personnel necessary for teachers to implement the approved curriculum in their classrooms and work effectively with the children.

It will be the administrator's responsibility to set up and maintain such central services for curriculum materials, including audio-visual materials, as are needed, and appropriate channels through which teachers and pupils will be supplied with these resources. In addition, there will be a media resource center and media specialist to offer children instruction and teachers assistance in selecting and using learning resources.

The school program should also incorporate current and emerging technologies in its offerings to students. In all of the curriculum areas, utilization of technology specified in the State's Core Curriculum Standards must be met.
