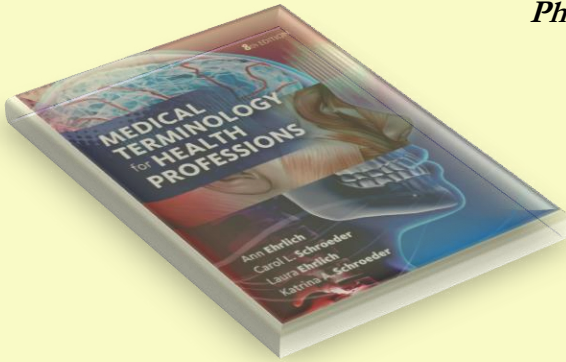


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## *Medical Terminology*

### **Course Description:**

The Medical Terminology course is designed to introduce students to a new language of medical terminology. Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to demonstrate the correct pronunciation and spelling of medical terms, define the guidelines for interchanging singular to plural terms, define and use medical terms appropriately and build and translate medical terms for Greek and Latin prefixes, suffixes, roots words and combining forms.

The course is also designed to fine tune soft skills, which are non-technical skills that impacts an individual's performance in the workplace. Students will be able to improve their networking skills, conflict resolution skills, and team building skills. As a part of the course, students will be asked to interact with their classmates during various group activities such as projects, and debates.
