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## **LEA Plan for Use Of Funds**

The school continues to monitor the latest CDC guidelines and to meet to review our policies and procedures to make sure we can stay open safely. As in the previous year, extra responsibilities will be taken on by school personnel to ensure that students who have entered the building have filled out their COVID forms. Students who have not filled out their forms need to have it completed before they are permitted entry. Contact tracing is also conducted as soon as we know of a possible case. This includes taking place after school and on weekends.

The school has set aside 20% of this grant to provide for a Paraprofessional for the next few years who will be able to work with students who are identified as needing extra help. The school is also setting aside funds to provide for an extra counselor so students can get more individualized attention both academically and emotionally.

The school is bringing in another counselor over the duration of this grant to help work with the students. Part of this will allow for better identification and remediation of students who need academic help as part of question #2 above. This will also allow for us to better help students socially and emotionally and to stay in constant contact with parents whose students need our help the most.

All students who receive services at SCVTHS have equitable access to educational services including but not limited to students who may be LEP, homeless, low income, at risk, or may have an IEP. All federally funded programs are available to all eligible students. Programs are coordinated by administration who oversees the integration of providing services to all eligible students. The school stays engaged with the community in several ways. The school conducts surveys that are specific to staff, parents and students. The Principal meets monthly with union leadership and there is a monthly meeting held between the teacher liaisons (not leadership) and administrators. The Principal also conducts monthly parent meetings and weekly parent communication. The school leadership team meets once or twice a month and the teacher leaders are invited to attend these meetings.

The school sends out surveys to all stakeholders of the school including parents, teachers and students. We conduct monthly board meeting that are open to the public for comment as is required. The Pupil Services Department conducts meaningful consultation with appropriate stakeholders as necessary for individual students.
