


GRADE 4 STEAM CAROUSEL!

Applegarth students in the fourth grade were given the opportunity to participate in a 6-week STEM Club.!! The club consisted of exploring the VEX GO program. VEX GO is a construction system that teaches students the fundamentals of STEM through collaborative, hands-on activities.

Students built flagpoles, astronauts, a launch pad for the astronaut, and finished up by creating the Mars Rover, which was then coded using the VEX GO website!







Wizarding World of Fractions Day

in Ms. Farkas + Ms. Quinby's Class

We had a magical day in Room 23 during our "Wizarding World of Fractions" Harry Potter Day! As we finished up the three fraction topics in math, students were able to review a culmination of all topics covered: equivalent fractions, comparing fractions, unit fractions, decomposing fractions, adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers, and multiplying fractions and mixed numbers.

Students participated in three events:

- I. Professor Snape's Potion Class: Students had to work through the Advanced Potion Spellbook, answering different fractions questions about the most popular potions from Harry Potter! We ended Potions Class by applying our knowledge of fractions to following a slime recipe!
- Escape the Tri-Wizard Maze: Students had to follow through a maze, answering questions as they go, and the answers will tell them which direction to turn to escape the maze!
- Quidditch World Cup: Students had to fly to answer different fractions
 word problems, and when they had the answer, they would have to throw
 their ball through the correct goal post to score a point for their house!

Students were even sorted into the houses that we felt they belonged in, based on their best and strongest qualities! It was a truly "magical" day with LOTS of review on fraction content!


