Applegarth Elementary School

Colonial Day in Farkas and Quinby's Fourth Grade

Students in Ms. Farkas and Ms. Quinby's class were transported back in time to the 1600-1700's during Colonial America! Students got to learn about and experience first hand different activities that those in Colonial America took part in. When learning about the history of quilt making, how it began in Colonial Times, and the role that women played in it, students decorated their own "quilt square" to represent themselves, then learned the art of sewing and sewed their square to another to make one, large Room 23 Family quilt! Students read about the history of quill pens, and practiced writing using a feather quill pen and ink using calligraphy letters. (It's a lot harder than it looks!) Students learned about the life of a child in Colonial times and about the games and toys that children played with. They played two games that originated

in Colonial times: Jacks and Jacksticks (pick up sticks). Students also got to experience first hand the strenuous task of making butter by making their own!









Random Acts of Kindness!

On National Random Acts of Kindness Week, Ms. Farkas and Ms. Quinby's Class came up with many different ways to show kindness around the school! From leaving positive messages around the school, writing virtual Valentine's to St. Jude's patients, and taking over for our hardworking paraprofessionals to clean the cafeteria after each lunch, to writing uplifting messages outside in chalk for students and staff to see when leaving and entering the building, writing thank you cards for Applegarth staff, and leaving hidden positive message bookmarks in books in the library, the acts of kindness kept coming with the hope that others "pay it forward" to do the same.

Black History Month Celebration

In addition to widespread classroom activities, the students at Applegarth celebrated Black History Month with the principal. With our paraprofessional staff assisting, students listened to a read aloud of *The ABCs of Black History*. Following the story, students rotated through five stations. At one station, they listened to the audio of *The Day You Begin* by Jacqueline Woodson. At another, they read about a famous scientist who built boats for the U.S. government. Students constructed their own vessels with the most efficient boat holding 168 pennies! Students listened to Follow the Drinking Gourd and analyzed how coded language was used to help escaped slaves make it to freedom. At another station, students listened to Martin Luther King Jr.'s speech and identified their own dreams for the world. Finally, students read about black American contributions to the arts. They designed a stamp for the US Post Office to honor the artist of their choice.





Read Across America

Applegarth is busily preparing for our Read Across America activities. Our PTA is arranging for guest readers to come into our school. Teachers each have a Dr. Seuss book that they are reading to their class and are in the process of decorating their doors for a contest. Our PTA donated a book for every child, which will be given away during this week. We are also holding a spirit week revolving around reading. When it was time for Book Shopping, each student was given a flashlight to more easily view the bookshelves and to find their library bags. They went in small groups to make the experience safe for all!

We read different nighttime themed stories and completed exciting "In the Dark" themed activities:

- We used shadow art to jumpstart our artwork
- We created Glow in the Dark artwork using dark colored construction paper and Glow in the Dark Glue and Gel
- We explored the night sky with the Skyview app and recreated a constellation on black construction paper using white construction paper crayons and silver glitter

The floodgates were built with Lego WeDo kits, and after building their floodgates, students wrote a code through the Lego WeDo app to make the floodgate motor operational.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH ACTIVITIES

Mrs. Francese's third grade class studied quotes from inspirational Black leaders. Each student picked a quote then analyzed the meaning behind it. After that, they reflected on what each quote means to them.



Ms. Hoppock's students had a biography sampling where they previewed different biographies of African American leaders who have made a difference in society. After "sampling" each biography, students chose the individual they would like to research. They created pennants and hung them in the hall to display all the facts they learned about their chosen individual.



Mrs. Manfredi/Mrs. Ratcliffe's class read about the life of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. They talked about how words have energy and power and can help and heal the world. Together, they generated a list of words that come to mind daily. They created a bulletin board to share our thinking of others.



Ms. Bakerman and Ms. Forrest's class did a research activity for the bulletin board of heroic Black figures.



Mrs. Tolnes' class read the story "I am Martin Luther King Jr." by Brad Meltzer. As a class they questioned how one man was able to make such a powerful change. We discussed the idea of civil disobedience and worked to define the phrase. Students used context clues to determine that it meant calmly or peacefully breaking an unfair rule or law. When asked, "Why did this approach work?" The class determined that it was many people working together toward one goal that made Dr. King's efforts successful. To symbolize this cooperative work, they completed a portrait of Dr. King. Each student had to color one piece of the portrait and only when they came together could they see the true picture. Students also wrote about their dreams of the future which they shared with the school on their class bulletin board.



Mrs. Bertini/Mrs. Dempsey's class learned about a famous Black History Leader and completed an activity which highlights their importance such as: why we celebrate them, major events, life and legacy and important quotes. They completed pendants and they are displayed in the classroom.

Mrs. Nagle/Ms. Hoppocks' Class:

It was a time of turmoil in the British Colonies and it showed in Brookside School. Students in Mrs. Nagle and Ms. Hoppock's fourth grade class were involved in a debate taking the role of loyalists or patriots. Students researched famous people from the time period and prepared questions and responses to topics involved in the unrest and ultimate decision to break free from Great Britain. Students acted as though they were Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Hutchinson, and many others and shared why the Quartering Act, Stamp Act, and the Proclamation of 1763 were unfair or fair based on their perspective. By the end of the debate, just like in real life, it was decided that the country could not continue the way it was and the Patriots had decided to meet and declare their independence! The project really gave students the perspective of life during the mid to late 1700s. It was a joy to see them eager to participate!






