	SJB Embroidered Uniform Pants & Shorts (khaki or navy) are worn daily. For formal dress days, only pants are permitted, no shorts.	†
	Optional SJB Embroidered Sweater or Sweater Vest can be worn. Any SJB branded sweatshirts can be worn daily, but not on formal dress days. Sweaters and sweater vests can be worn for formal dress.	†
	SJB Daily Polo Shirts (available in white, navy & gray) or any official SJB branded polo shirt can be worn daily.	
	Accessories: SJB tie required for formal dress days. Hats/beanies may only be worn outdoors and must be SJB branded. One stud earring per ear is allowed.	†

INCOMING FAMILY FAQ

When is the first day of school?

The first day of the 2024-2025 school year at St. John Bosco High School is August 5th, which is when New Student Orientation will begin.

August 5-6: New Student Orientation

August 7: All Student Orientation

August 8: First Day of Classes

What do you bring on the first day of orientation?

Bring your device!

When do I receive my class schedule?

Class schedules will be available through PowerSchool before school begins. You will receive your syllabus, which includes any required supplies and textbooks, on the first day of class.

Where can I find textbook information?

We utilize both digital and traditional textbooks, depending on the course. Information and instructions on how to access textbooks will be provided on the first day of class.

What is my student ID number?

All students received their student ID number during course selection. If you do not know what your student ID number is, please reach out to our Registrar, Gina Logsdon, at glogsdon@bosco.org.

Does the school provide transportation for students commuting from different cities?

What electronic device should I purchase for class?

We have a "Bring Your Own Device" approach to technology. Not only is this consistent with the tech approach in higher education, but it also allows students to select devices that they are comfortable with at a price point that each family has discretion over. At a minimum, students will need the following:

- A web browser
- Word processing (compatible with Microsoft Word)
- Presentation (analogous to Microsoft PowerPoint)
- Spreadsheet (compatible with Microsoft Excel)

Additionally, please note that there are computer specifications that must be adhered to for Engineering Pathway students. Download the specifications at www.bosco.org/engineering. There are also specific calculator requirements for certain math and science classes. Please refer to the class syllabus for those details.

What is the service hour program?

Our service hour program for parents was designed to provide parents the opportunity to become involved in various school activities. Volunteer hours are tracked using the Track It Forward app. All hours must be logged using this platform in order to count toward your service hour requirement. You will receive an invitation from Track It Forward with instructions to setup your profile.



INCOMING FAMILY FAQ

How many service hours do I need to complete?

Each freshman family is required to volunteer 30 hours of service. Each year thereafter, the requirement is also 30 hours. Learn more about our service hour program at bosco.org/service.

What is the dress code for students?

All students are required to wear a uniform, which can be purchased in our Campus Store online or in-person. Visit bosco.org/shop for our Uniform & Grooming Guide and a link to our online shop.

How can I contact my son during the school day?

Are there activities before and after school?

Yes! There is always a place where students can be before and after school whether they're hanging out, doing homework or participating in a club or sport. Here are some of the typical places students hang out and some of the activities typically going on:

- Learning Commons Hours: M-TH, 7:30am-8am and 3pm-4pm
- Oratory Hours: M-F, 6:30am-7:45am and 2:40pm-5pm
- Athletics Hours: Practices typically take place from 3pm-6pm
- Music Program Hours: Mondays and Wednesdays from 3pm-5pm
- Theater Program Hours: 3pm-5:30pm
- Robotics Hours: January-April, M-F 3pm-6pm and Saturdays from 9am-4pm

What is the cell phone policy for students?

Cell phones are not an acceptable learning device and will not be permitted to be audible or visible during class.

What are the requirements for participation in Athletics?

Student-athletes must maintain a 2.0 GPA or higher, their behavior must be in good standing and their family's tuition commitment must be in good standing. If you are planning on playing a sport anytime during the 2024-2025 school year, you must complete the online medical clearance process beginning on June 1. GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To receive a diploma from St. John Bosco High School, a student must have:

1. A history of good character and citizenship
2. Participation in a grade level retreat during each year
3. Successful completion of the Senior Exit Interview
4. Satisfaction of all subject matter requirements

Subject Matter Graduation Requirements (260 Credits):

40 Credits Theology
40 Credit English
30 Credit Mathematics
30 Credits Science (Biology, Chemistry, 1 additional)
30 Credits Social Science (World History, US History, Civics/Econ
OR Civics/Financial Lit OR AP Government)
20 Credits World Language (2 years of the same language)
10 Credits Visual and Performing Arts
10 Credits Physical Education
5 Credits Health
5 Credits Financial Literacy
40 Credits Electives



NOTE: All F's must be remediated by the end of the summer for a student to matriculate in their subject matter graduation requirement sequence. C's or higher are required in the second semester of all Mathematics and World Languages courses to move on to the next level the following year.

A-G College Admission Entrance Requirements:

These are the minimum high school courses required to be eligible to apply to the University of California (UC) or California State University (CSU) systems. UC campuses require that you complete 11 of these requirements prior to the beginning of senior year. Each course must be passed with a grade of C or higher.

- A. History/Social Studies (2 years): 1 year of World History and 1 year of US History or 1 semester of US History and 1 semester of US Government/Civics
B. English (4 years)
C. Mathematics (3 years, 4 recommended): Algebra 1, Geometry (required) and Algebra 2 at minimum
D. Science (2 years, 3 recommended): At least 2 from Biology, Chemistry, Physics, other Science
E. World Language (2 years, 3 recommended)
F. Visual and Performing Arts (1 year)
G. College Preparatory Elective (1 year): This can be a separate approved elective, or extra courses from the above categories



SJB GLOBAL ONLINE LEARNING

Learning Options to Fit the Needs of Every Student

SJB Global is our innovative online learning option. Whether you're online full-time, on campus full-time or somewhere in between, there is a path for everyone at St. John Bosco. Online classes run asynchronously - there is no specific time when the student has to meet with the teacher and other students. There is a live teacher, however, who keeps an office hour every day there is a lesson, so if the student needs help, they can email or call their teacher during that time. Students will receive personalized feedback from the teacher on their assignments and receive a grade report once a week.

Health Course Requirement

Health is required to be taken freshman year and must be completed online during the summer (before or after freshman year) or during the school year. The class runs for 8 weeks and has 4 lessons per week. Tuition for Health during summer 2024 is \$500. If Health is taken during the school year as one of the 7 classes of a student’s full load, there is no fee. If it is taken in addition to 7 classes, then a fee exists.

ACADEMIC PATHWAYS

Through our Academic Pathways, students may choose a specific area of interest in which they will participate in advanced level coursework and project-based learning experiences over four years.

Biomedical

Designed for students who excel in mathematics and natural sciences and are interested in the fields of biology or medicine. In addition to intensive classroom instruction in advanced mathematics, health sciences, physical sciences and chemical and biological sciences, students gain clinical knowledge by working with professionals in hospitals. Students also conduct research and attend lectures provided by physicians, research scientists and medical professionals.

Computer Science

Based on the nationally recognized “Project STEM” curriculum from Amazon Future Engineers, this pathway allows students to become creators, not just consumers, of the technology that surrounds them. Computer Science students enjoy an advanced coding curriculum and collaborative projects, in turn gaining problem-solving, critical and creative thinking, and communication skills. Students learn a broad range of topics including coding, artificial intelligence, cyber security and app development.

Engineering

The Engineering Pathway offers an innovative STEM curriculum to its students. Students learn and apply the design process, develop collaboration and communication skills, and hone their critical-thinking and problem-solving abilities. Students who graduate from the Engineering Pathway are prepared to enter college to continue studying engineering and related fields, as well as pursue careers in science, technology, engineering or mathematics. Many students in the Engineering Pathway participate and compete on St. John Bosco High School’s award-winning Robotics Team.

Entrepreneurship

This Ivy League inspired pathway was designed in collaboration with the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania for students interested in creating and leading business ventures. The innovative four year interdisciplinary program prepares students for collegiate business degree programs. Students learn analytical thinking, decision making, and logical reasoning while researching current business trends and the skills and techniques necessary to launch and manage successful business ventures. Students also have the opportunity to participate in the Project ECHO business plan competition.

Film & Media Arts

The Film and Media Arts Pathway is a professional industry preparation program designed to prepare students for collegiate film school. The coursework’s emphasis is on creative storytelling while also infusing the importance of social responsibility in the Pathway’s curriculum, message and mission. Through a project-based approach, students will learn the art of storytelling, production, design, directing, cinematography, animation, editing and the business of the media industry.

Sports Medicine

The Sports Medicine Pathway is designed for students with an interest in athletic training, physical therapy, kinesiology, nutrition, orthopedics and other sports medicine-related fields. The pathway includes practical, hands-on application in addition to studying nutrition, injury prevention and evaluation, therapeutic rehabilitation, and on-field first aid and emergency situation management. Students are presented internship opportunities with practice and game coverages at St. John Bosco High School as well as their choice of physical therapy or chiropractic clinics, medical offices or hospitals.
