Beloved

Each year, we have a Salesian theme to help us reflect and move forward with the year. This year, the theme is "Beloved." It is a simple theme, but a very important one.

Twice in Jesus's life, the heavens opened and he heard that word from his heavenly father. At his baptism, The message was meant for his disciples and others to hear: "This is my beloved son with whom I am well pleased. Listen to him." As his impending crucifixion approached, he heard the message a second time on Mount Tabor. This time, the message was clearly meant for him: "You are my beloved son with whom I am well pleased."

As we go through this year, I ask us each morning as we wake up and begin our day to remind ourselves



that we are beloved. It is the title that God gives us: beloved son or beloved daughter. In one of his letters to Saint Jane de Chantal, Saint Francis de Sales wrote: "Jane, if only you can see yourself as God sees you, simply through the eyes of love." You are beloved to God.

After that reminder, please remove the D from beloved and "be love" to all you meet that day. That is our calling and responsibility, fellow beloved ones.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a significant event in Christian theology, commemorating the moment when Mary, the mother of Jesus, was taken up body and soul into heaven. This doctrine, while rooted in ancient tradition, was formally defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950. St. Francis de Sales, a 16th- and 17th-century saint and Doctor of the Church, provides profound insights into the Assumption, enriching our understanding of this mystery.

St. Francis de Sales' Perspective on the Assumption

St. Francis de Sales, known for his gentle approach to spirituality and his deep devotion to Mary, offers a unique perspective on the Assumption. In his writings, particularly in his sermons and letters, he often reflected on Mary's role in salvation history and her exemplary virtues.

Mary's Purity and Holiness

For St. Francis de Sales, Mary's Assumption is a natural consequence of her immaculate purity and unparalleled holiness. He believed that because Mary was free from original sin, it was fitting that she should not undergo the corruption of the grave. Her sinless nature made her body a pure vessel,






September Book Study: Tattoos on the Heart

worthy of being assumed into heaven. St. Francis de Sales wrote:

"Since it is a privilege of the immaculate purity of the Blessed Virgin that her sacred body should be preserved from corruption, it is reasonable to believe that the soul of this most holy Mother did not wait for the common day of resurrection but immediately went to rejoin her most pure body and together they were carried to the highest heaven."

The Assumption as a Foretaste of Our Own Destiny

St. Francis de Sales emphasized that Mary's Assumption is a sign of hope for all Christians. It prefigures the resurrection of the body and the glorification that awaits the faithful. He saw in Mary's Assumption the fulfillment of God's promise to humanity and a testament to the

destiny that lies ahead for those who follow Christ.

"The Blessed Virgin's Assumption is a great and powerful sign for us. It shows us that heaven is our true homeland, and that we too are called to follow her there, body and soul. Let us, then, live in such a way that we may one day share in this glory."

Mary's Role as Our Advocate

In light of the Assumption, St. Francis de Sales also highlighted Mary's role as an intercessor and advocate for the faithful. From her exalted place in heaven, Mary continues to care for her children on earth, interceding on their behalf. St. Francis de Sales encouraged devotion to Mary, trusting in her maternal love and powerful intercession.

"Let us have recourse to our Blessed Mother in all our needs and tribulations. She who was assumed into heaven is ever ready to assist us with her prayers and obtain for us the graces we need. She is our mother and Advocate, and she will never abandon those who seek her help."



TAKING CHARGE OF YOUR LEGACY

A good estate plan speeds up inheritances. When you die, the state courts review your will and distribute your assets to the listed heirs through a process called probate. If you don't have an estate plan and your family members fight over the inheritance, they could waste everything on legal fees. Even if probate goes smoothly, the process can still take months.

Accounts with beneficiary designations sidestep probate and go straight to the named beneficiaries. You could also set up transferupon-death instructions on bank accounts, brokerage accounts, vehicle titles, and home titles for the same result. Another option is to set up a revocable trust. You put property into the trust fund but can take it back when needed. When you pass away, the trust passes along the property according to your instructions without going through probate. It's recommended you review your estate plan every few years. (Thanks to Kiplinger Retirement Letter).

Décimo Octavo Domingo en el Tiempo Ordinario 4 de Agosto

En el Evangelio de hoy escuchamos a Jesús que cuestiona a la multitud

sobre la pureza de sus intenciones al decidir seguirlo. Mientras que las personas se preocupan por buscar alimentos perecederos, Él los exhorta a enfocarse en la consecución del "Pan de la Vida": el "alimento que nos alcanzará para la vida eterna". San Francisco de Sales nos dice cómo podemos prepararnos para hacer que el "Pan de la Vida" se materialice en nuestras vidas:

El lazo de unión más maravilloso e íntimo que nuestro Salvador comparte con nosotros es Su divina existencia. En preparación para esta unión es importante que primero saquemos de nuestra todas las preocupaciones mundanas; que dejemos de pensar en todo aquello que sea pasajero. Una vez hayamos tomado la decisión de desechar nuestra mentalidad frívola. debemos adornar nuestra memoria con todos esos dones que Dios nos ha otorgado: la creación, la divina providencia y la redención.




