We are very excited that your **FRESHMAN** will be attending Coronado High School and we look forward to meeting your student on **Orientation Day, August 12th, 2024.** Coronado participates in the nationwide **Link Crew Program**, an organization whose sole purpose is to help freshmen feel more comfortable and make the transition to high school as smooth as possible, as well as help them achieve success in their first year.

The Link Crew freshmen orientation and transition program is designed to both welcome and support freshmen by assigning them a junior or senior Link Leader as a mentor during their first year. This Link Leader is a responsible older student who was hand selected from a

large pool of applicants and has met the qualifications of being a good role model and a positive leader on our campus. **A day or two before orientation your child will receive a phone call from his or her Link Crew Leader personally inviting your student to Orientation Day.**

Because this day is active, please ensure your child wears comfortable clothing that does not restrict movement.

This is a student-only function so we encourage you to let your child attend on his or her own. We look forward to meeting your child on orientation day!

Obligations: All outstanding obligations from previous year(s) must be paid.

Student Schedule Information

The **ONLY** schedule changes that will be considered before school starts are those deemed necessary due to the following:

- Scheduled classes were taken at summer school.
- Prerequisites for the class were failed.
- A class needs to be repeated to meet graduation requirements.
- Errors on the schedule.
- Staff recommendations.
- **Remember: We do not change schedules, teacher preference!!**

Students should be enrolled in six classes. Eight classes are allowed in some instances. Students will not be allowed to take fewer than six (6) credits/classes.

STUDENT DROP-OFF & PICK-UP



Students who provide their own transportation must complete a parking permit before being allowed to park on school property. Please follow painted arrows for entrance and exit in the parking lot, drop-off and pick-up areas.

Adhering to the pattern will greatly help us maintain safety, efficiently move vehicles through campus, enable pedestrians to cross safely, and reduce congestion in the parking lot and the drop-off zone.

Follow safety signs, drive slowly and safely, and avoid reckless behaviors. Failure to do so may result in loss of parking privileges and/or a trespass warning.



SAFETY ISSUES AND DRILLS

As always, Coronado is required to complete each of the safety drills at least four times annually to ensure we are prepared to respond to emergency and crisis situations that may arise. In addition to monthly FIRE and EVACUATION drills, we conduct LOCKDOWN, LOCKOUT, and SHELTER drills throughout the year. These exercises prepare us for a variety of situations, ranging from an intruder in the building to severe weather events. We screen all visitors to the building. In addition to asking visitors to sign in and wear a visitor's badge, security personnel will direct them to the main office. We take these steps to ensure a safe learning and working environment for students and staff at Coronado. Thank you for your understanding and assistance in helping to maintain a safe campus. **Always bring a picture I.D. with you when coming on campus.**

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER SRO

Coronado High School and the Colorado Springs Police Department work closely together to ensure student safety.

CORONADO ATTENDANCE POLICY

Students are more likely to succeed in academics when they attend school consistently. It is difficult for the teacher and class to build their skills and progress if a large number of students are frequently absent.

- Parents and guardians must excuse their students within 48 hours of the absence.
- Students who come into class within the first 50% of class will be marked as tardy.
- Students arriving after the first 50% of class will be marked as an UNEXCUSED absence. Please Call the attendance office at 719-328-3613 to excuse your student.
- Chronic tardiness may result in detention or suspension and may become a serious discipline issue.

Parents should excuse their student's absence within 48 hours. Messages may be left (24/7) and should include:

- **WHERE YOU CAN BE REACHED**

If you need your student released early due to an appointment, please send a note with your student or call the attendance line. Notes should be brought to the attendance office before school or between classes. You can also call the attendance office a minimum of 1 hour in advance to request an early release. This allows us to page your student during passing periods and get a pass for the student to be released in time for their appointment, thereby reducing interruptions to classes.

CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS

Coronado students are expected to work in class. If a student should choose not to work or sleep in class, they could be sent to the administration office.

Coronado does not put up with verbal abuse of staff. If a student should verbally abuse a staff member, they will be sent home via school suspension.

CORONADO INFORMATION

LATE START MONDAY

Every Monday morning Coronado staff will attend Professional Development (PD) meetings from 7:20—8:20 am to focus on identifying and responding to the specific learning needs of all students. Professional Learning Community (PLC) training will immediately follow from 8:30—9:10 am. Therefore, Monday classes will begin at 9:15 am and end at 3:10 pm.

Busses will run 2 hours late on Mondays. Campus security will provide supervised study environments in the cafeteria and library for all students who must arrive at their regular time on Mondays. Students are not allowed to leave campus once they have been dropped off.

In the event of a Colorado Springs School District 11 2-hour late start on a Monday, Coronado will NOT hold PLCs or PD and school will begin at 9:35 am.

CELL PHONE AND ELECTRONICS POLICY

If the student does not adhere to the New Policy the student will be sent to the office for a cell phone violation, the office will take the phone for the day and contact parents. All subsequent violations will result in progressive discipline. Students should not have devices on/ in both ears inside the school buildings. This is a safety issue.

Students are not allowed to be on their phones in the hallways **during class time**.

We understand parental communication is important; however, parental contact will NOT be an excuse for using cell phones during class time. In case of a family emergency, please contact your student through the main office at 719-328-3610.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

CORONADO DRESS CODE

Clothing for boys and girls must meet the following criteria:

- No COOKIES apparel - clothing designed to conceal marijuana and vape products.
- Clothing must be worn as designed and cover all private parts of the body.
- Clothing must fit properly to not expose undergarments (no sagging, no tube tops, etc.). Undergarments are not considered proper attire.
- Clothing must be free of excessive holes, rips and tears that expose private areas of the body or undergarments.
- Footwear must protect a student's feet; slippers and bare feet are not allowed.
- Hats are allowed in the building and in the classrooms at the **teachers' discretion**. For safety, hoods may not be worn.
- Clothing, paraphernalia, and jewelry must NOT contain inappropriate messages, reference sexually suggestive activity, drugs, alcohol, gangs, be obscene, profane, hateful, or disruptive to the learning environment.
- Costumes, including face paint and masks, are not allowed. Variations of the dress code for extracurricular activities and school events must be approved by the principal.

CLOSED CAMPUS

In order to improve student achievement, student attendance, school safety and reduce the number of behavior and discipline issues, **students in grades 9—12 are NOT allowed to 'WALK' off campus during the school day.** This includes lunch and all scheduled classes.

Students in grades 10—12 may 'DRIVE' off campus during the scheduled lunch period.

Freshmen students may NOT leave campus at ANY point of the day, unless picked up and excused by a parent or guardian.

Food and Nutrition

GIFTED AND TALENTED

Coronado offers several opportunities for gifted learners. In order to accommodate all identified Gifted and Talented students next year, the new Gifted and Talented Resource Teacher will communicate with gifted students upon the start of the new school year.

Advanced Learning Plans (ALP)

Grade level ALP meetings may be held by the end of the first quarter with identified GT students creating their ALP goals in conjunction with their Individualized Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) as part of their graduation requirements. Prior to meeting with students, each identified student at each grade level should consider both an academic and an affective goal relevant to where they are with their four year high school plan and beyond. The goals that students set to meet their ALP requirement is about supporting a lifelong habit of setting realistic and attainable goals. The Gifted and Talented Resource teacher will reach out to student to students toward the end of the school year to have students self-assess their ALP and decide if they have, indeed, met their goals. The Gifted and Talented Resource teacher will be available all year to meet with students and parents to support academic and social emotional needs. Please do not hesitate to reach out if you have any questions.

GT Coursework, Options & Resources

At the high school level GT students are free to select their challenging courses as they work toward graduation and postsecondary goals. There are no pull-out programs for GT students at the high school level, but students are encouraged to reach out for some one-on-one time particular to their specific needs or concerns with the Gifted and Talented Resource Teacher.

Students should consider the many options available to them in high school, as well as utilize the GT teacher as a resource. Options range from the Pikes Peak Business Education and Alliance marketplace, engineering, computer science, extra-curricular activities, community service opportunities, to a variety of honors, Advanced Placement classes, including CU Succeed and CSUP concurrent college enrollment courses. Unfortunately, not all of our students take advantage of the challenging options available, so you and your student are encouraged to meet with the GT Resource teacher in room 228 (north end of the library) at your convenience.

POST SECONDARY OPTIONS

Many Coronado students are ready to complete challenging university course work and earn college credits while still in high school. At Coronado we recognize the need to provide programming options for those students who would benefit from early college education. Over 95 semester hours of Advanced Placement, concurrent, and CU Succeed courses are offered on the Coronado campus. Each of these options has merit and should be examined closely by any student interested in earning college credit prior to high school graduation.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAMS

Advanced Placement classes cover content material stipulated by the College Board, which offers exams at the end of the year over that content. Students who score well, typically a 3, 4 or 5 on those exams, may be awarded credit by colleges and may be excused from taking entry-level courses in the fields of study in which they took the exams. Advanced Placement classes are available to students as early as freshman year. Coronado offers AP classes in the following areas: Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Pre-Calculus, Computer Science, United States History, Human Geography, U.S. Government and Politics, Microeconomics, English Language, English Literature, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics, Spanish, French, Psychology and Art & Design, as well as AP Capstone—Seminar & Research.

Several of the Advanced Placement Courses are also aligned with our CU Succeed offerings, giving Coronado students the option of taking an AP exam or enrolling in the course through the University of

Payment for AP exams by the school district are expected to continue, however, school funding has yet to be finalized at this time. Please check AP funding by the district when we return in August. The AP exam registration window will take place in the fall with students registering through their AP classes beginning August through October.

CU SUCCEED & ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

CU SUCCEED PROGRAM

CU Succeed courses are select introductory courses from CU-Denver and UCCS. These courses cover the same content as on-campus courses, require consistent quantity and quality of work, and are evaluated by the same high standards. These courses are taught on the Coronado campus and students receive dual high school and college credit. Credits earned in CU Succeed courses are University of Colorado at Denver, or UCCS credits, that are recorded on an official University of Colorado transcript. Policies regarding the transfer of credits and the ways in which they apply to degree requirements vary from institution to institution. No institution can guarantee that all credits will be accepted by other institutions. Upon graduation from high school, students who have taken CU Succeed courses send their CU transcript to the college of their choice in order for their transfer credits to be evaluated. D11 AP Testing and Dual Credit Guidance for 2024-2025 School

AP – College Board Advanced Placement – registration timeline Fall 2024

District 11 is proud to be a leader in the state of Colorado, providing college credit access to our students. Our students have robust options for postsecondary college credit options: Career and Technical Education college credit, PPSC college access; Odyssey Early College, CU Succeed dual credit, CSUP concurrent credit, and Advanced Placement testing. Access to early college credit requires thoughtful and intentional planning. We strive to counsel our students to take advantage of opportunities that best meet their postsecondary plans and goals. In an effort to promote intentionality toward postsecondary planning, we are supporting a choice between AP testing and dual and concurrent credit. Students taking an AP course where dual credit or concurrent credit is also an option can opt to take both, and as it currently stands, AP exams will be funded by the school district, whereas dual enrollment credit will be funded at a significantly reduced per credit cost, by parents/ students and concurrent credit will be funded by the school district. As you begin your courses in the Fall 2024, we encourage you to research the AP test credit and transfer policies of your select postsecondary options to understand which credits will best meet your needs.

SPORTS SIGN-UP AND HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC FEES

In accordance with the Colorado Springs School District 11 Board of Education, an athletic fee will be charged for athletes in grades 6-12. This fee, in addition to a completed participation form and current physical, will be required prior to practice or contest participation. *Students qualifying under the "Federal Free or Reduced Price Meal Program" must provide documentation. Call 719-520-2924 to obtain information. Athletic fees for student athletes not enrolled in a District 11 school and deemed CHSAA eligible to participate at Coronado High School will be higher.

INELIGIBILITY RECOVERY & SUMMER SCHOOL

Summer school courses taken after the close of the second semester may be used to replace any core units failed. Equivalent courses taken must be accepted by the school toward graduation.

ALL equivalent credits must be completed by August 1, 2024. Credits made up through summer school must be in the same curricular area, be accepted to meet graduation requirements of classes previously failed, and be recorded on the student's transcript. CHSAA and Coronado High School limit Summer School credit recovery to 2 courses. Students not meeting Coronado High School Summer School recovery guidelines will regain eligibility at 6 weeks if 2 or more Fs are not present on an eligibility grade check at that time.

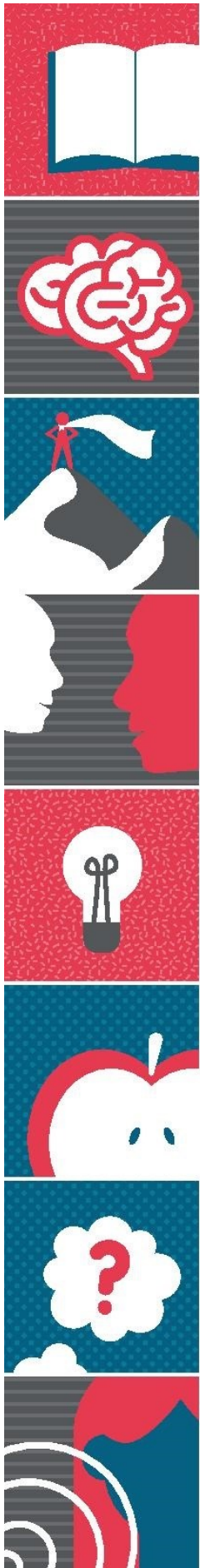
