A Note from the Principal:



Heusner Marathon

The Heusner School Marathon begins on Monday, August 19 at 7:55 a.m.

Participating students experience improved physical condition, increased focus, and better concentration throughout the school day. Students completing 26.2 miles will get to go to Kansas Wesleyan University and run a lap on the track with their names being announced on the sound system.

Here is how it works: Students may come at 7:55 a.m.

First: Students will set their backpack down by their grade level door on designated paw prints. Students won't start running until we have marathon supervisors at their corners.

Second: They will then check in at the first-grade doors, where grade level / class wristbands will be spread out. Students will get their own wristband before starting the marathon.

Special Note: Breakfast Eaters can come at 7:50 a.m. and eat breakfast prior to the marathon starting. When they are done eating, they go out to the first-grade doors, find their own wristband, and join the marathon.

Third: Students will walk/run around the school, getting their card scanned by a teacher each time they run a lap. A student's goal is to get at least 2 laps a day in order to complete the 26.2 miles.

Last: When time is called, students will put their marathon wristbands in their grade level/teacher bucket and line up by their grade level door where they placed their backpacks.

*We would love for parents and grandparents to volunteer by helping students find their marathon wristbands, assisting with supervision, or coming to walk and run with your student.

Everyone is welcome (no pets allowed)!

Steps to Success: Communicating with Your Child's School

We strive to be the best place to learn. The only way we can improve is to know about concerns so we are able to address them. Here are some tips for communicating with your child's school when concerns arise.





The fastest way to a positive result is to start with the people closest to the situation in

the school. Talk with the teacher or coach about your questions and concerns before going to the principal.

Parents and guardians are encouraged to reach out to teachers and school staff by:

Calling the school's phone number. Because they are teaching, you often will need to leave a message for your child's teacher or coach.

Emailing the teacher or coach directly. All teacher emails are available on our school website.

We want to be responsive to parents' questions and requests for information. Our staff will respond to your call or email as soon as possible, in most cases within 2 school days.

If you have had a conversation with your child's teacher and the principal and are still needing assistance, the director of elementary or secondary programs will be able to provide additional support.

We are excited for this new school year and look forward to partnering with you to support a great school experience for your student.

- d)The student's participation in officially recognized activities or sports
- e)The weight and height of members of athletic teams
- f)Dates of attendance (period of time during which a student was enrolled in an educational agency or institution, i.e. academic year, spring semester)

Screen Your Student for Symptoms of Illness
