Staff/Student Non-Fraternization

Adults who have contact with children and adolescents through school activities have the responsibility not to betray or misuse their privileged position. Students develop a special trust in school staff by virtue of the school system's authority and the important role the schools play in their lives. Adults must never take advantage of students' vulnerability or of their confidence that adults in school will behave appropriately in relationships with them.

It is the policy of the Board of Education that all school system personnel shall maintain a professional, ethical relationship with students and refrain from improper fraternization or undue familiarity with students. Any sexual relationship, contact or sexually nuanced behavior or communication (verbal or non-verbal) between a staff member and a student, while the student is enrolled in the school system is prohibited. The prohibition extends to students of the opposite sex or the same sex as the staff member, and applies regardless of whether the student orthe staff member is the initiator of the behavior and whether or not the student welcomes or reciprocates the attention.
