Personnel -- Certified

Substitute Teachers

The New London Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent of Schools to employ substitute professional staff consistent with the needs or the school district and regulations of the State Board of Education.

The New London Board of Education requires that substitute teachers hold a Bachelors Degree from an accredited institution of higher learning. The Commissioner of Education may waive requirements for a Bachelor's Degree for good cause upon the request of the Superintendent of Schools.

If a substitute works for more than 40 consecutive days in the same assignment, the substitute will be placed at step one of the NLEA contract and compensated based upon negotiations with the teachers' bargaining unit.

The Board of Education will review rates of pay annually and establish the rates of pay as deemed appropriate based on a market analysis.

Retired teachers may be employed as substitutes without jeopardizing their retirement salary within the limits as prescribed by law.

Fringe Benefits

Substitute teachers will receive fringe benefits based upon negotiations with the teachers' bargaining unit.

The Board reserves the right to contract out substitute services for professional staff.
