

IF A NON-HOMESTEAD OPERATING MILLAGE DOES NOT APPLY TO TAXPAYERS WHO LIVE IN THEIR PRIMARY RESIDENCE, WHY CAN ALL REGISTERED VOTERS LIVING IN THE TROY SCHOOL DISTRICT VOTE ON THIS PROPOSAL?

All registered voters living in the Troy School District can vote on the non-homestead operating millage proposal because it is a school district millage. School district millages are funded by property taxes, but they are not limited to property owners. It is also the way the law was written when it was established in 1994.



HOW MUCH REVENUE WILL THE OPERATING MILLAGE GENERATE?

The non-homestead operating millage generates approximately \$32.7 million annually, and the hold-harmless generates approximately \$9.8 million annually. Together they generate approximately \$42.5 million annually. This is 22% of the school district's operating budget. Taxes **WILL NOT** increase for residents.
